Mentioning that rural areas of Bangladesh remain underserved and face a wide array of challenges, the report called for rural revitalisation, highlighting policies, institutions, and investments that can transform rural areas into vibrant and healthy places to live, work, and raise families.

"Rural revitalisation is timely, achievable, and most importantly critical to ending hunger and malnutrition in just over a decade," said Shenggen Fan, while presenting the report. "Revitalising rural areas can stimulate economic growth and tackles challenges hold-

ing back achievement of the sustainable development goals (SDGs) and climate goals by 2030."

To overcome these challenges, IFPRI recommended a systematic approach to address rural employment, women's empowerment, environment, rural energy and rural governance.

Dr Hossain Zillur Rahman said the "youth exodus" from agriculture and rural areas is a big problem.

"We have to think how to incentivise the youth to stay in rural areas."

About this, agriculture minister Dr

Muhammad Abdur Razzaque said, "I would like to see the youth take agriculture as a prestigious occupation."

"We have surplus production of different agricultural products. But problem is we cannot export those due to some barriers," the minister added.

Mentioning increased labour and other production material cost, including fertiliser and pesticides, speakers urged the government to address the issue of farmers' profits.

"There must be a clear vision in rural urbanisation," said Khan Ahmed Sayeed Murshid.

launch the service on April 14, first day of the Bangla year.

The train, that has 12 new coaches imported from Indonesia, is waiting at Ishwardi junction and it would be taken to Rajshahi on April 23 for the inauguration, railway officials in Rajshahi said.

As per its regular schedule, the 928-seat train will start at 7am from Rajshahi station and reach Dhaka at 11:40am. It would start again from Dhaka at 1:30pm and reach Rajshahi at 6pm.

Three intercity trains -- Silk City, Padma and Dhumketu Express -- are currently operating daily on the Rajshahi-Dhaka route, having stoppages at 10 to 14 stations.

A nonstop train between the capital and Rajshahi has been a long-time demand of the region's people.

### ADVANCE EID TICKETS AT 6 SPOTS

Advance train tickets for upcoming Eid-ul-Fitr for travelling from Dhaka will be available at six

spots -- five in the capital and one in Gazipur, Railways Minister Md Nurul Islam Sujon said yesterday.

The six spots are Dhaka University, Fulbaria, Mirpur, Kamalapur Railway Station and Airport Railway Station in the capital, and Joydebpur in Gazipur, reports UNB.

### MOBILE APP LAUNCHING ON APRIL 28

A mobile app -- enabling passengers to avail a number of services -- will be launched on April 28, Pronab Kumar Ghosh, additional secretary of the railways ministry, said yesterday.

The railways minister is expected to inaugurate the service at Kamalapur Railway Station at 11am on that day.

At first, all intercity trains will come under the service, Pronab, also head of a member committee formed to implement the project, said.

Total number of trains in Bangladesh is 352, of which 90 are intercity, according to BR.

Officials said once the app is operational, a

passenger will be able to book and buy train tickets and pay using their phones, as well as locate nearby railway station, trains and transport service.

A passenger will also be able to buy food using the app. To avail the services, a passenger has to download the app and register -- providing name, address, mobile number and NID card number or birth registration certificate, they said.

Currently one can avail several services -- including booking of tickets -- online and via SMS. Once the app is launched, people can avail all services from one platform, they said.

Of the total tickets, 25 percent are sold online currently which may increase up to 50 percent after the app is launched, an official said.

Pronab, however, said the minister will take a decision in this regard later.

militancy being influenced by their family members, mostly their husbands.

Influence of family members, a sense of belonging and empowerment, ideological commitment, hope of reward in the afterlife, frustration and fear of uncertainty, and revenge for loss of family members are the major causes of females joining militant groups, CTTC officials found.

The Daily Star Associate Editor Brig Gen (retd) Shahedul Anam Khan said terrorism arose in the country because of external influence, and at times lack of good governance is also responsible.

Canadian High Commissioner Benoit Précourt stressed on raising awareness among people and coordination among law enforcement and security agencies.

In Feni, an assistant of an ambulance was killed as the vehicle and a covered truck collided on Feni-Noakhali highway in Rammagar of Daganbhuiyan.

The deceased -- Rubel, 25 -- was from Yakubpur area in the upazila.

An elderly person died after being hit by an unidentified vehicle on Dhaka-Chittagong highway in Khairara area of Sadar upazila, said police.

The identity of the deceased could not be known immediately.

In Cumilla, a motorbike rider was killed and another injured as a vehicle hit the bike on Dhaka-Chittagong highway in Jhagjhuli area of Sadar upazila.

Riad Hossain, 18, from Durgapur in Adarsha Sadar upazila, died instantly.

The injured was admitted to a hospital. Highway Police said they could not identify the vehicle.

After investigation, the ministry found proof regarding the allegations.

The ministry afterwards cancelled Ababil Travel's license and also forfeited its security deposit after hearing.

In some cases, the religious affairs ministry also advised victims to file criminal cases against the owners of respective tour agencies.

Contacted, Shahadat Hossain Taslim, secretary general of Hajj Agencies Association of Bangladesh (HAAB), said only realising fines or cancelling licenses of hajj agencies could not deter hajj operators from causing sufferings to pilgrims.

"The government should be careful so that middlemen are not involved in hajj operations," he added.

The secretary general of Hajj Agencies Association of Bangladesh said middlemen were mostly behind the irregularities.

Proprietor of Mouri Air International, Nozir Ahmed Azad, said he has appealed to the ministry for reviewing its decision, which was made on Wednesday.

"We are waiting for the final decision following the review," he added.

Phone numbers provided on web sites of Ababil Travel and Salwa Overseas were found to be incorrect.
