Budgetary allocation for edu inadequate

Speakers say at seminar

Speakers at a seminar yesterday said the budgetary allocation for the education sector remains inadequate every year, leaving little scope for investment on quality education for all. They demanded more allocation for education for 2019-20 fiscal, so that the nation can become well educated. The demand came at a seminar on "Upcoming Budget and Education Sector: Our expectations", organised by Movement for World Education Rights at Jatiya Press Club.

Speaking as chief guest, Education Minister Dr Dipu Moni said that the budgetary allocation for education, on its own, may sound impressive but when the increasing population is considered, it seems inadequate. "Allocation for education should be increased as we want to transform the population into human resources," she said. Dipu Moni said the sector needs to be given the highest importance as the country will have to move forward. She said dreams of bringing all children to classrooms have been

implemented, and now we have to reduce the dropout rate in primary education. Faruk Ahmed Arif, convener of the organisation, proposed that government allocate Tk 1.40 crore to bring all government and non-government educational institutions under the upcoming budget. Academic Rasheda K Chowdhury urged the government to ensure nutritious food for school children by allocating sufficient budget. Former VC of DU AAMS Arefin Siddique chaired the event.

necessary measures to ensure Hedayet's arrest. Prosecutor Mukhlesur Rahman Badal expressed satisfaction as they have been able to prove all six charges. State-appointed defence counsel Abdus Shukur Khan, however, said his clients did not get justice and will suggest them to file an appeal with the higher court. With the latest verdict, the war crimes tribunals have so far delivered 37 judgements against 87 people. Of them, 61 have been sentenced to death. According to the International Crimes (Tribunals) Act, 1973, a war crimes convict can file an appeal with the Supreme Court within 30 days from the date when the verdict is pronounced. **CHARGES AND CONVICTION**
Hedayet and Sohrab were found guilty of plundering and setting fire to 20-30 houses in Hindu-dominated Shahapara in Atpara and forcing many Hindus to leave the country. They were given 10 years' jail for the offences. Hedayet was given death penalty for confinement, arson, torture and killing of two people in Atpara's Mobarakpur Purbopara village. Hedayet and Sohrab got death penalty

for confinement, arson, torture and killing of Helim Talukder, brother of two freedom fighters, at Modon Dakkhin Para village under Madan upazila. They were given death penalty for their role in an act of genocide at Sukhari in Atpara that left seven Hindu men dead, and forcing many to leave the country. Sohrab was given 10 years' jail for abduction, confinement and torture of one Hamid Hossain of Madan Majhpara. Both the convicts were given 10 years' jail for burning down 150-200 houses at Modon Dakkhin Para. The jail term would naturally be merged into the death sentence, the tribunal said. **'NEVER AGAIN'**
The tribunal said the global community should recognise the genocide in Bangladesh during the war so that such crimes do not recur. Global community is now expected to stand up and recognise the genocide that took place in Bangladesh in 1971 and also to raise voice by saying "never again", the tribunal said. The parliament on March 11, 2017 unanimously adopted a resolution to observe March 25 as Genocide Day. The international community is yet to recognise the genocide.

Rape has become an epidemic: Dr Kamal

Expressing concerns over the growing incidents of rape in the country, Jatiya Oikyafront convener Dr Kamal Hossain yesterday urged people to forge a united movement to protect women's rights and establish the rule of law. "Untoward incidents are taking place in the country one after another. The rape of women has turned into an epidemic. The deterioration in law and order is evident here," he said while talking to reporters

after a meeting of the alliance at his Motijheel chamber. Dr Kamal, also Gonoforum president, further said, "We think the movement has to be strengthened and we have to take to the streets actively so that people's rights are protected and rule of law is established. It is now essential." Oikyafront leader ASM Abdur Rob said they will hold a mass gathering at Shabbagh intersection in Dhaka on April 30 in protest against rape and repression of women.

dalals in the recruitment procedure also creates barriers to the government fulfilling its obligations under the bilateral labour agreements, according to the report. The level of protection a female migrant should get is linked to the gender equality context in the country she is going to be employed. Regarding protection in the Gulf Cooperation Council -- a regional, political and economic union comprising all Arab states -- the report says legislations and policies they have advanced but "implementation is weak and enforcement often non-existent." Moreover, the bilateral agreements do not address the "lived experiences" of female migrant domestic workers. For

example, it does not oblige employers to ensure medical care. While presenting the report, Prof Nicola Piper, of international migration at the University of Sydney and Queen Mary University of London, put forth a question as to what practical steps the Bangladesh government might take to encourage destination countries to monitor recruiting agents and employers. Given the power balance between the nations sending domestic workers and those employing them, Bangladesh Association of International Recruiting Agencies Secretary General Shameem Ahmed Chowdhury Noman said, the nations -- Nepal, the Philippines and India -- could form a platform to ensure decent wage and fair treatment of female migrants.

accounts, gave statements before the court as approvers even though they were earlier made accused in the case. On September 22, 2011, ACC Deputy Director Mohammad Ibrahim filed the case with Cantonment Police Station against Mamun. According to the FIR, the accused opened two accounts with a London branch of NatWest Bank and laundered the money between 2003 and 2006. Of the total amount, 2,14,356 pounds were found in an account. The money was deposited between July, 2003 and January, 2005. Of the sum, M Shahzad Ali deposited 17,286 pounds in November, 2004 to that account while his wife M Tahmina Ali deposited 27,323 pounds. A sum of 2,04,496 pounds were also found in another account of Mamun. The money was deposited between March, 2003 and October, 2006. On April 29 in 2012, the ACC submitted the charge sheet to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court in Dhaka. The court framed charge against Mamun on October 31, 2012. Mamun -- who stands accused in 13 other cases -- has already been convicted and sentenced to 30 years in jail in four cases, three of which were for corruption.

demand, fell sick yesterday and were given primary treatment there. Mahmudul Hasan Hridoy, who worked on the eighth floor of Rana Plaza, started the strike alone. Later, at least 10 other survivors joined Hridoy, expressing their solidarity. They are observing the hunger strike in front of the now vacant site. While talking to The Daily Star on Tuesday evening, Hridoy said "I will continue this strike as long as the demands are not met." The 11-point demands are: Tk 48 lakh compensation for each victim, rehabilitation, covering medical expenditure for life, announcing national mourning day for Rana Plaza victims, bearing education costs of children of the victims, highest punishment of the accused, seizing the wealth of all accused, providing treatment to rescuers, permanent mausoleum in remembrance of victims, and free treatment and employment for family members of the deceased, injured or those missing. **JURAIN GRAVEYARD**
Led by its newly elected president Dr Rubana Huq, BGMEA representatives placed flower wreath at the graves of Rana Plaza victims in Jurain.
