Rakhine land grabbed in Barguna

Agricultural land taken from 20 for building power plant

SOHRAB HOSSAIN, back from Barguna

Around 70 acres of agricultural land of some 20 Rakhine people have allegedly been grabbed by a private company for setting up a coal-fired power plant in Barguna's Taltali upazila.

The landowners said their complaints with the district administration were in

The allegations came at a press conference at Barguna Press Club on February 1.

Speaking at the programme, Mryla Ang Mog of Pawapara village said, "I have around 7.5 acres of land near the Chhoto Nishanbaria Mouja. But they [people from the power plant] have grabbed it all and dug the ground without my permission.

His land's khatian (land record) number is 274 and dag (plot) numbers are 502 and 503.

He also said he submitted a written complaint to the Barguna deputy commissioner, but no action was taken yet.

Dreams incomplete


Rana Plaza hero Himu dies by suicide

From a young age, he believed in helping people in whatever way he could. Whether it was staging protests for the causes he believed in, saving lives of people trapped in building collapses, or rescuing stray animals in distress, he believed in acting upon his beliefs.

But such a life dedicated to the service of others came to a tragic end on Wednesday in a suspected suicide. He was 28.

behind and ran over her, witnesses said. **Fahmida Haque** The incident took place in front of National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar area around 11:15am while she was on the way to her university as the pillion

passenger of a motorbike hired from the ride-sharing platform Uber. Police identified the driver as one Suman, 23, who also got hurt in the incident and took primary treatment at the emergency section of nearby Shaheed Suhrawardy Medical College Hospital. But police could not find him there as he left the hospital before they arrived.

The tragic accident left the family in shock. Farhanul Haque Mridul, younger brother of Fahmida, said her sister left their Shyamoli residence around 10:30am.

"She had a dream. She was going to be a computer engineer soon," said the lamenting mother of Fahmida.

Sohel Rana, an eyewitness of the incident, said the bike was on the

middle of the street around 11:15am when a lorry hit the motorcycle. SEE PAGE 17 COL 2

DEATH OF ABRAR Suprobhat owner chargesheeted

Detectives yesterday submitted two charge sheets against Suprobhat Paribahan owner and three of its staffers in a case filed over the killing of university student Abrar Ahmed Chowdhury in a road accident last month.

They were chargesheeted in two charges -- one for murder of Abrar and the other for attempted murder of college girl Synthia Islam

Inspector of Detective Branch of police Kazi Shariful Islam, also investigation officer of the case, submitted the charge sheets to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court of Dhaka.

Brain implant translates

thought to speech

Several neurological conditions can ruin a patient's ability to articulate, and many currently rely on communication devices that use head or eye movements to spell out words one painstaking letter at a time.

RAQA OFFENSIVE **US-led** blitz

killed 1,600 civilians

Intensive US-led coalition bombardment on the Syrian city of Raqa killed more than 1,600 civilians over four months in 2017, according to a report released yesterday.

The findings were compiled after months of field research and extensive data analysis, including via a project that saw 3,000 digital activists scan satellite imagery online.

2 housewives, 10-year-old girl raped

STAR REPORT Two housewives and a

third grader were allegedly raped in Patuakhali, Mymensingh and Panchagarh on Wednesday. The same day, a college

teacher was arrested on charges of sexually harassing an HSC examinee in Sirajganj. In Patuakhali, a woman

and her husband went to visit a relative's house in a village under Kalapara upazila. Around 9:00pm, four youths came to that house and asked the couple to show their marriage documents.

At one stage, they forcibly took the woman to a nearby field and one of them raped her, said Monirul Islam, officerin-charge of Kalapara Police Station, quoting the victim's family. Hearing her screams,

locals rushed there, but the culprits managed to flee the scene. Following the incident,

the husband filed a case, accusing the four -- Rasel, SEE PAGE 17 COL 2

Panic grips Sri Lanka

Country on edge with security scares; death toll revised down to 253 from 359; defence secy quits

Sri Lankan authorities yesterday locked down the central bank and shut the road leading to the jittery capital's airport because of a bomb scare as more people were swept up in the search for those behind Easter Sunday

bombings. Two bank officials told Reuters the street outside the building near the World Trade Centre in the capital, Colombo, was blocked to traffic before the security alert

was lifted. Underscoring the nervous atmosphere in the Indian Ocean nation, authorities also shut the entry road to Colombo's main airport after a suspicious vehicle was spotted at a car park. The road was reopened when the

alert was declared a false alarm. Meanwhile, the Sri Lankan authorities yesterday lowered the death toll in the Easter bombings by more than 100 to 253, admitting some of the badly mutilated

bodies had been erroneously double-counted. Catholic church also suspended all public services over security fears yesterday, as thousands of troops joined the hunt for suspects.

A senior Catholic priest told AFP that all public services were being suspended "on the advice of security forces". Private burials will still be carried out.
