# Transport leaders want orders reviewed

Say they may consider leaving the sector if things don't change

Road transport leaders yesterday urged the higher courts to review their recent orders asking transport companies to pay compensations to victims of road accidents. If the courts continue to impose fines in such ways in

road accident cases, transport owners and workers will have to consider leaving the sector, they said. At a joint meeting of transport owners and workers in the capital's Mohanagar Natya Mancha, Shajahan Khan, executive president of Bangladesh Road Transport

Workers' Federation, read out a statement that he termed "opinions" of transport owners and workers. They came up with the call amid a rise in road accidents for which errant drivers and owners of vehicles are often blamed. The country saw two major student agitations for safe road in the last nine months over deaths of students

in road crashes in the capital. Shajahan, a ruling party lawmaker, compared the situation in the transport sector with "great danger signal no-10", referring to cyclonic storm Fani which is likely to hit Bangladesh today.

The meeting was attended by leaders of Bangladesh Road Transport Owners' Association, Bangladesh SEE PAGE 17 COL 5

## Man accused of raping 6 schoolgirls

A man in Jashore's Sadar upazila has been accused of raping six students of a government primary school in the last two months, luring them with snacks. The president of the school's governing

# Maduro hangs on

Pompeo says military action 'possible' in Venezuela; China calls for talks

Venezuelans heeded opposition leader Juan Guaido's call to take to the streets on Wednesday in a bid to force President Nicolas Maduro from power, but there was little concrete sign of change in a crisis that increasingly looks like a political stalemate.

Guaido had called for the "largest march" in Venezuela's history and said on Twitter that "millions of Venezuelans" were in the streets in "this final phase" of his move to oust Maduro.

But by late afternoon, many of the protesters in the capital Caracas had drifted home. National Guards fired tear gas at a hardcore of demonstrators who remained, and one injured demonstrator was carried by others to a first aid truck, Reuters video showed.

## Mysterious human fossil found in Tibet



A jawbone found in a cave on the Tibetan Plateau in China is providing surprising insights into Denisovans, the enigmatic extinct cousins to Neanderthals and our own species, including that they were pioneers at enduring high-altitude environments.

Scientists on Wednesday described the pivotal new fossil: the right half of the lower jaw of an adolescent, including two teeth, dating from 160,000 years ago.

# Ensure welfare of returnee migrants

Migration experts urge govt

Bangladesh should have an effective reintegration programme for the returnee migrants to ensure their social and economic well-being, say migration and development experts.

According to them, a good portion of the migrants face financial, social and psychological problems upon return home due to exploitation and enduring hardship abroad. The returnees continue to suffer from trauma at home.

The observations came at a programme

organised to inform the key migration stakeholders about the activities of Prottasha -- a project funded by the European Union and implemented by the International Organisation for Migration in partnership with Brac and the Bangladesh government.

Under the five-year project launched in 2017, 355 returnees from the EU and 372 returnees from Libya, a transit country, are being provided support for psycho-social and economic reintegration.
