Char children getting poor schooling

Handful of teachers available; they come late, leave early

It was late March. Around 3:30pm, the Biramer Pachgachchi Govt Primary School was already closed, an hour too early. So was the nearby Kashirpara Govt Primary School. Both schools face a similar problem --neither the students nor the teachers are much interested in class. While many families ask students

to stay home and tend farm or help in household work, teachers are either few in numbers or they live far from the chars, and so come to school late and leave early. This is the scenario of almost all 44

government primary schools in the char areas of Sariakandi upazila. Poor infrastructure and a lack of awareness of the families are two additional problems. There are 168 government primary

schools in the upazila.

The Daily Star visited 16 of the 44 char schools last month and found 20 of the 78 teachers' post vacant. Another five teachers were on study leave, worsening the crisis.

In Kazla New Govt Primary School, there are 159 students. Headteacher Zesmin Akter said, "We need at least six teachers, but we have just two.

"To overcome the crisis, we temporarily hire local people having only higher secondary education while a bachelor degree is required for the position." SEE PAGE 11 COL 5

Indians vote in penultimate phase of polls

EVM glitches reported in several areas in Delhi

Tens of millions of Indians voted yesterday in the penultimate round of a seven-phase general election, with the opposition seeking a united stand to deny Prime Minister Narendra Modi a second term.

Violence was reported in some areas of West Bengal and complaints about EVM malfunctioning poured in from several places of Delhi as voters came out in good numbers to exercise their franchise.

India's almost seven-week election wraps up next Sunday with results due on More than 100 million people across

seven states are eligible to vote in the sixth phase of the 39-day-long poll, which Modi began on April 11 as front-runner after an escalation of tension with neighbouring Pakistan.

But diverse opposition parties have recently taken heart at what they see as signs Modi's Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) may be losing ground and have begun negotiations over a postelection alliance even before polling ends on May 19.

Some voters in Delhi said they were backing Modi because they were won over by his tough stand on security.

"I have voted for Modi's sound foreign policy and national security," said a 36year old first-time voter who declined to be identified.

3 of a family Half the drivers, helpers have poor eyesight

76 percent of them need glasses, medications, finds Brac survey on 1,200 transport workers

About 50 percent of public transport workers have vision problems, according to a survey conducted in the capital's Sayedabad among 1,200 drivers and their assistants.

Of those with vision problems, 76 percent need glasses and medication and 12.60 percent surgery, it said. Brac Road Safety Programme and Junior

Chamber International (Dhaka West) conducted the survey as part of an "eye camp" at Sayedabad Bus Terminal on April 23 and 24. Kamran ul Baset, head of the Brac

programme, yesterday revealed these at the Findings Sharing Meeting on Eye Camp at the Bangladesh Road Transport Authority headquarters in Banani. At the eye camp supported among

others by Sohoz Rides and Fashion Optics, medicines and glasses were distributed among the workers by Brac and JCI. Workers were also promised low cost surgeries. The initiative was taken ahead of the 5th

UN Global Road Safety Week.

Yesterday's event was organised by the BRTA, Brac Road Safety Programme and JCI with Ahmed Najmul Hussain, director of administration and road safety programme at Brac, in the chair.

They recommended raising awareness among transport workers about the importance of addressing eye problems.

Of the 1,200 workers, 50 percent were drivers, mostly of buses, and 49 percent

Twenty-nine percent of the participants were aged between 31 and 40, 27 percent between 40 and 50, and 19 percent between 51 and 60.

were assistants and the rest were both.

According to the findings, 21 percent respondents work from 12-16 hours a day, 40 percent from 8-12 hours, 34 percent from 4-6 hours and 5 percent about four hours.

Fifty-two percent of them work at daytime, 12 percent at night and 36 percent at both day and night.

Although 96 percent of the respondents were aware of their problems, 72 percent of them never visited an eye specialist.

However, 87 percent participants were interested in paying for eye care. All of the participants said proper eye check-ups and care could increase road

safety. The researchers recommended that the government make vehicle owners ensure regular eye check-ups for their employees and eye tests be required for renewal of

It also urged the BRTA and National Institute of Ophthalmology to open eye testing booths at BRTA offices.

driving licences.

Ahmed Najmul Hossain of Brac said the survey shed light for the first time on the issue of drivers' vision.

To achieve the Sustainable Development Goals 3.6, Bangladesh and other countries have to reduce next year the number of deaths on roads by half.

Bus driver confesses; class-I student raped in Habiganj

Bus driver Nuruzzaman, one of the accused in the murder case of nurse Shahinoor Akter Tania, gave confessional statement at a Kishoreganj court on Saturday.

Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Md Al Mamun recorded the statement under section 164 in the afternoon and later sent him to jail, said Sarwar Jahan, officer-in-charge (investigation) of Bajitpur Police Station.

Quoting the statement, the OC said, "Nuruzzaman confessed that he, along with his helper Lalon Mia and another man, killed the woman after raping her inside the bus."

He, however, did not name the third accused for the sake of investigation.

London to get world's first fuel cell doubledecker buses

London will become the first city in the world to have double-decker hydrogen-powered buses next year. Transport for London (TfL) has unveiled the

newest bus to be added to its fleet: a £500,000 hydrogen model which only emits water as exhaust. Twenty of the new buses have been ordered by

TfL and will begin service on the capital's streets next year. Although hydrogen-fuelled single-decker buses

have been running in London and cities elsewhere for years, TfL said the new double-deckers would be a world first.

As well as producing zero emissions, the buses,

JSD leader

leaders say cops picked him up

A leader of the pro-Jatiyatabadi Swechchhasebak (JSD) has been missing since he was picked up by plainclothes men from Sirajganj on Friday, alleged BNP and JSD leaders.

They made the allegations during a human chain formed near the BNP district headquarters yesterday, demanding the return of the missing JSD leader.

According to BNP sources, Sanwar Hossain Sanu, 45, convener of Sirajganj's was JSD, allegedly picked up by law enforcers in plainclothes on Friday noon from Sirajganj Sadar upazila's Malshapara area while he was returning home on a rickshaw.
