Price woes for rice growers

Prospects of good harvest fail to bring any joy to farmers in 10 south-western districts

Although paddy farmers are poised to get a bigger harvest this year, low prices have sapped their joy in the 10 southwestern districts of the country.

The amount of paddy the government plans to buy directly from farmers would not help them much as well, they said while talking to The Daily Star yesterday.

In the 10 districts, Boro paddy was grown on 6.25 lakh hectares of land this year. It was 6.23 lakh hectares last year. The amount of harvest they expect is about 40 lakh tonnes, 60,000-70,000 tonnes higher than last year, said officials.

"Harvest has been good so far, but we are not going to reap the benefit because of low prices," said Asadur Rahman, a farmer of Kushtia's Khoksa upazila. "We're frustrated. According to farmers, per maund of paddy is selling for

Tk 580-850, based on the variety, while they expect the price to be Tk 1,200-1,350. Mosarraf Hossain, a farmer of Gangni upazila in

other crops. "All sorts of expenses are on the rise." Echoing him, farmer Asad said paddy farming is costlier, but it rakes in lower profits. "If I had cultivated maze, I

Meherpur, said paddy cultivation is less profitable than

would have Tk 30,000-35,000 in profit." Ramesh Chandra Ghosh, an upazila agriculture officer of Department of Agricultural Extension (DAE) in Kushtia, said farmers spent Tk 15,000 to Tk 15,850 per bigha, but they are earning about Tk 19,000 to Tk 19,450.

Finding no other way, he had to buy the ticket for the next morning, and his seat was in the back.

Just 300 yards away, in front of SR Paribahan 50-year-old counter, Rubina Akhter came from Azimpur with her daughter to get tickets of AC buses for Rangpur. But a notice was hung on the counter's window reading "no advance ticket for AC bus".

Talking to The Daily Star, Rubina said she was unaware of the matter.

new plan on immigration

Emphasises skills, education over family ties to Americans; Democrats dismiss proposal

President Donald Trump on Thursday proposed overhauling the US immigration system to favour young, educated, Englishspeaking applicants instead of people with family ties to Americans, a plan he will push in his 2020 re-election campaign but has little to no chance of being approved in Congress.

Trump's plan, roundly panned by Democrats and immigration advocacy groups, is aimed at trying to unite Republicans - some who want to boost immigration, others who want to restrict it - ahead of next year's presidential and congressional elections.

"If for some reason, possibly political, we can't get the Democrats to approve this merit-based, high-security plan, then we will get it approved immediately after the election when we take back the House (of Representatives), keep the Senate, and, of course, hold the presidency," Trump said in a Rose Garden address to Republican SEE PAGE 10 COL 2

Trump unveils | Clashes hit Kolkata city after Modi rally

Police arrest 26, bolster security ahead of final round of voting tomorrow

Police made new arrests following clashes and poured thousands of security forces into the eastern city of Kolkata yesterday as tensions mounted ahead of the final round of voting in India's marathon election. Supporters of right-wing Prime Minister Narendra Modi and opposition followers clashed in the eastern metropolis late Thursday after Modi held a rally there.

It was the second night of street battles between activists of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the regional Trinamool Congress (TMC) this week.

Police said at least 26 arrests were made yesterday over the latest unrest as they bolstered security before Sunday's voting.

India's six-week election ends on Sunday with the seventh round of voting in eight northern states, including West Bengal, where Kolkata is the capital.

With Modi seeking a second term, but scrambling to hold on to his overall majority, the results will be announced on May 23. Modi's BJP has been aggressively campaigning in West Bengal, hoping

to making gains from the TMC, which controls the state, to make up for losses expected in other states. An official election observer, speaking on condition of anonymity, said

there have been more than 300 incidents of poll violence across West Bengal since campaigning started on April 11.

"Kolkata will witness an unprecedented deployment of security forces before Sunday," the official added.

Army man killed in blast during training

11 others injured STAR REPORT

A member of the Bangladesh Army was killed and 11 other soldiers were wounded when a bomb exploded at a firing range in Bandarban during a training exercise yesterday.

Air Force helicopters flew the injured soldiers to Combined Military Hospital in the capital immediately after the incident took place around 10:30am, according to a release from the Inter-Services Public Relations.

The body of deceased soldier Jahidul Islam of Bandarban's Lama upazila was handed over to the army after an autopsy in the afternoon, said Prottosh Paul Tripura, resident medical officer of

Driverless truck hits Swedish roads

A driverless electric lorry has begun making deliveries using public roads in Sweden in what its creators believe to be a world first.

The T-Pod, which weighs 26 tonnes when fully loaded, does not have a driver in the cabin.

It is being tested out by developer Einride and logistics company DB Schenker. Swedish start-up Einride estimate that it will reduce road freight operating costs by about 60 percent compared to a diesel truck with a driver.

The T-Pod will not be completely autonomous, as an operator sitting miles away will be able to supervise and control up to 10 vehicles at a time.

Having a permit to use the semi-autonomous lorry on public roads to make deliveries was a "major milestone", said Einride's chief executive SEE PAGE 10 COL 6

HRW slams recent arrests Urges Bangladesh

to uphold right to peaceful expression

The Human Rights Watch slammed yesterday authorities Bangladesh after some arrests this week under the country's internet laws, raising worries over the freedom of expression in the nation.

Poet Henry Swapan, lawyer Imtiaz Mahmood and human rights defender Abdul Kaium were arrested in the past few days, prompting social media outrage and protests in the capital Dhaka and elsewhere.

Swapan and Mahmood were released on bail but Kaium Thursday, remained in detention and faces charges of extortion and defamation under the digital security law.

These were first major arrests since the government of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina took power in January for a third term SEE PAGE 10 COL 6

5-month-old boy killed in road crash

Pick-up plying wrong side hits 3-wheeler STAFF CORRESPONDENT

A five-month-old infant was killed in a road accident on Moghbazar-Mouchak flyover in the city's Satrasta area early yesterday. The dead, Md Shihab,

had been suffering from severe diarrhoea from the last couple of days and was being taken to Mohakhali's International Centre for Diarrhoeal Diseases Research, Bangladesh (icddr,b) in a CNGrun auto-rickshaw, said Hannan Mia, sub-inspector of Tejgaon Industrial Area Police Station, quoting family members.

Four other passengers, including three of the child's family members, of the auto-rickshaw were injured when a pickup, allegedly being driven through the wrong side, crashed head-on into the vehicle around 5:15am, the SI added.


