India has termed Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's telephone call to greet her Indian counterpart Narendra Modi on his victory in the Lok Sabha Elections 2019 as a "reflection of the extraordinarily close and cordial ties between the two neighbours".

"Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina became one of the first foreign leaders to congratulate the prime minister, thus reflecting the extraordinarily close and cordial ties between India and Bangladesh, and the excellent rapport that the two leaders enjoy," according to a statement issued on Thursday evening by Indian Prime Minister's Office.

"The two leaders pledged to continue to raise the India-Bangladesh relationship to unprecedented new heights," the statement read.

Sheikh Hasina phoned Modi on Wednesday evening to extend her heartiest congratulations to him on the resounding victory of the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) led by Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) under his dynamic leadership in the 17th Lok Sabha Elections.

During the five-minute telephonic conversation, they also recognised the importance of rapidly completing ongoing plans for deepening the partnership in security trade, transportation, energy and people-to-people ties, the statement

"Doing so within the next three years would have specific significance in view of the birth centenary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in 2020 and the 50th anniversary of Bangladesh's Liberation in 2021," it added.

According to the statement, the two leaders also agreed to identify dates for a meeting at the earliest to resume work in service of the bilateral relationship. During the conversation, Sheikh Hasina told Modi that "this emphatic verdict is a reflection of the trust and confidence reposed on you by the people of India."

Describing the victory as historic one, she said the people of South Asia will be happy over this win and they could work together.

The prime minister, in the conversation, invited Narendra Modi to visit Bangladesh and wished him success and good health and a long life.

Earlier in a congratulatory message to Modi, Sheikh Hasina said Bangladesh attaches highest importance to its multifaceted relations with India which is driven by genuine goodwill, mutual trust and respect.

The year 2021 is the 50th anniversary of the independence of Bangladesh, and 2022 will mark the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relationship between Japan and Bangladesh, he said.

To mark these anniversaries, a number of big development projects are underway, including construction of three bridges on the Shitalakhya, Meghna and Gumti rivers, Jamuna Railway Bridge, Dhaka international airport 3rd terminal, Dhaka Metro Lines and Matarbari Port and Power Plant, Izumi said.

Last year, the amount of ODA to Bangladesh was about \$1.8 billion, the largest ever loan support to Bangladesh for a year.

"This fact is attracting Japanese Bangladesh to companies increasingly, and 279 now Japanese companies are working in Bangladesh," Izumi said, adding, "I am expecting that this number will rapidly increase in the coming years. I always have this in mind that we are creating Bangladesh's bright future together with all of you."

A finance ministry official said the four projects under the 40th

ODA agreement of over \$1.2 billion to be signed include Dhaka Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) Development Project (Line-1), Matarbari Port Development Project Maheshkhali of Cox's Bazar, Foreign (II), and Energy Efficiency and Conservation Promotion Financing Project (phase-2).

The agreement of loan for Matarbari Ultra Super Critical Coal-Fired Power Project (V), which was supposed to be signed during the PM's forthcoming visit, is not being inked because the project is not ready yet, said the official, requesting anonymity. MRT Line-1, the country's first

underground railway, will connect the capital's airport and Kamalapur. Its construction is scheduled to begin in July this year. It is estimated to carry 14 lakh people a day.

MRT Line-1 is second among the five MRT lines to be built under Company Ltd.

Japan is also funding Bangladesh's first elevated metro rail, MRT Line-6, from Uttara to Motijheel. It's now under construction.

The loan under the Foreign Direct Investment Promotion Project means to develop infrastructure at the economic zone of Mirersharai

of Chattogram. Japanese companies will be able to establish industries there, officials said.

Other than that, some Japanese companies may also sign agreements Bangladesh's with Public-Direct Investment Promotion Project Private Partnership Authority for investments in some of the projects in Bangladesh, finance ministry officials said.

Three survivors return home

Three Bangladeshis who survived a boat capsize in the Mediterranean Sea off the coast of Tunisia on May 9 returned home yesterday.

A Turkish Airlines plane carrying them reached Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport at 5:38am, said Tanveer Hossain, assistant director of Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training.

The three are Mahfuz Ahmmad, Billal Ahmmad and Bahadur.

"Their identities were being verified through local police stations of the survivors," Tanveer told The Daily Star over phone.

At least 40 Bangladeshi migrants died after a boat carrying 80 people capsized in the Mediterranean Sea. Tunisian fishermen and coastguard rescued them the next morning, around nine hours after the capsize.

Eleven more Bangladeshi survivors now in Tunisian Red Crescent camp, three of them will be repatriated soon, ASM Ashraful Islam, labour counsellor of Bangladesh embassy in Libya, told this correspondent by phone.

Meanwhile, Libyan coastguard on Thursday rescued 290 Europe-bound migrants, including 14 Bangladeshis,

AP reported yesterday. Asked about it, Ashraful said they were trying to verify the identities of the Bangladeshis.

On March 16, the PM inaugurated the Second Kanchpur Bridge on the Shitalakkhya river.

Nuruzzaman Japanese said contractors -- Obayashi Corporation, Shimizu Corporation, JFE Engineering Corporation, and IHI Infrastructure Systems Company Limited -- started constructing the Second Kanchpur Bridge along with the 2nd Meghna and 2nd Meghna-Gumti bridges on the Dhaka-Chattogram highway in January 2016.

The cost of the three bridges was estimated at Tk 8,487 crore, of which Japan International Cooperation Agency (Jica) provided Tk 6,430 crore.
