In 2012, he received a scholarship from Yunnan Provincial Government to study Fine Art in Kunming, China.

A solo exhibition of Mong Mong Sho titled, *The Songs of Fisherman* was held at Yunnan Arts

University in Kunming from May 21 to May 25. The artworks focused on the daily life of fishermen in Bangladesh's seaports.

Chen Liu, a teacher of Yunnan Arts University, spoke highly of the exhibition while inaugurating the show.


He said that Mong Mong Sho listened to his inner heart and made efforts to record the characteristics of the place where he was born and raised.

Deputy Director of Nazrul Academy, poet Rezuddin Stalin, said that Kazi Nazrul was not only a poet of revolution and humanity. "He was also a poet of time. His creativity carried the motive to stand beside people and against wrong activities," said Stalin.

Professor Niranjan Adhikary said that Kazi Nazrul Islam was a scholar in every branch of literature and that many of his poems, songs, ghazals and essays are of great importance. Afterwards, a cultural function was held, during which people rendered songs and recited poems.
