19 'controversial' leaders to lose post

Bangladesh Chhatra League is going to drop at least 19 members from the organisation's recently announced committee following various allegations, said BCL insiders.

BCL General Secretary Golam Rabbani said they had served show cause notices to 16 "controversial" leaders on May 15. Eight of them failed to come up with evidence in favour of their innocence. As a result, they will be excluded from the committee.

"Besides, we found another 11 controversial leaders in the committee and will expel them," he said, adding, "these 19 posts will soon be declared vacant."

Asked about the delay in fulfilling his promise to expel the "controversial" leaders, Rabbani said BCL had verified the allegations with the help of different intelligence agencies in the last 10-12 days, which took time.


He told this correspondent that they would issue a press release by night mentioning the names of the dismissed leader.

The press release, however, was not issued.

On May 13, Chhatra league, the pro-Awami League student body, announced 301-member full-fledged central committee, creating huge controversy and demonstration by some of those who could not make it to the body.

2 killed in Japan stabbing spree

17 more people, mainly children, hurt before attacker kills himself

Two people including a schoolgirl were stabbed to death and more than a dozen injured in Japan yesterday in a rampage that targeted children as they waited for a bus.

The 51-year-old attacker, identified by police as Ryuichi Iwasaki, crept silently up behind a group of children at the bus stop and slashed randomly at them before fatally stabbing himself in the neck. He later died in hospital.

Police said an 11-year-old schoolgirl named Hanako Kuribayashi and a 39-year-old parent, identified as government official Satoshi Oyama, died in the attack, which shocked a country where violent crime is rare.

Seventeen more people, mainly young children, were injured, according to authorities who had previously given the schoolgirl's age as 12.

Middlemen control the rice market and they are the ones who are to blame for the fall in prices, noted economist and banker Khondkar Ibrahim Khaled said yesterday.

"A group of people favoured by the government forces farmers to sell rice to them at a low price. They make a quick buck ... They are the middlemen. They are very powerful," said Ibrahim.





ROHINGYA RETURN UNHCR, UNDP extend deal with Myanmar

The UN Refugee Agency and the UNDP yesterday signed an extension of an MoU with Myanmar for one year. The deal is aimed at creating conducive conditions for voluntary and sustainable repatriation of the Rohingyas from Bangladesh.

The memorandum of understanding was signed in Naypyidaw on June 6 last year.

The MoU provides a framework of cooperation to create improved and resilient livelihoods for all communities living in northern Rakhine state, according to a press release issued yesterday.
