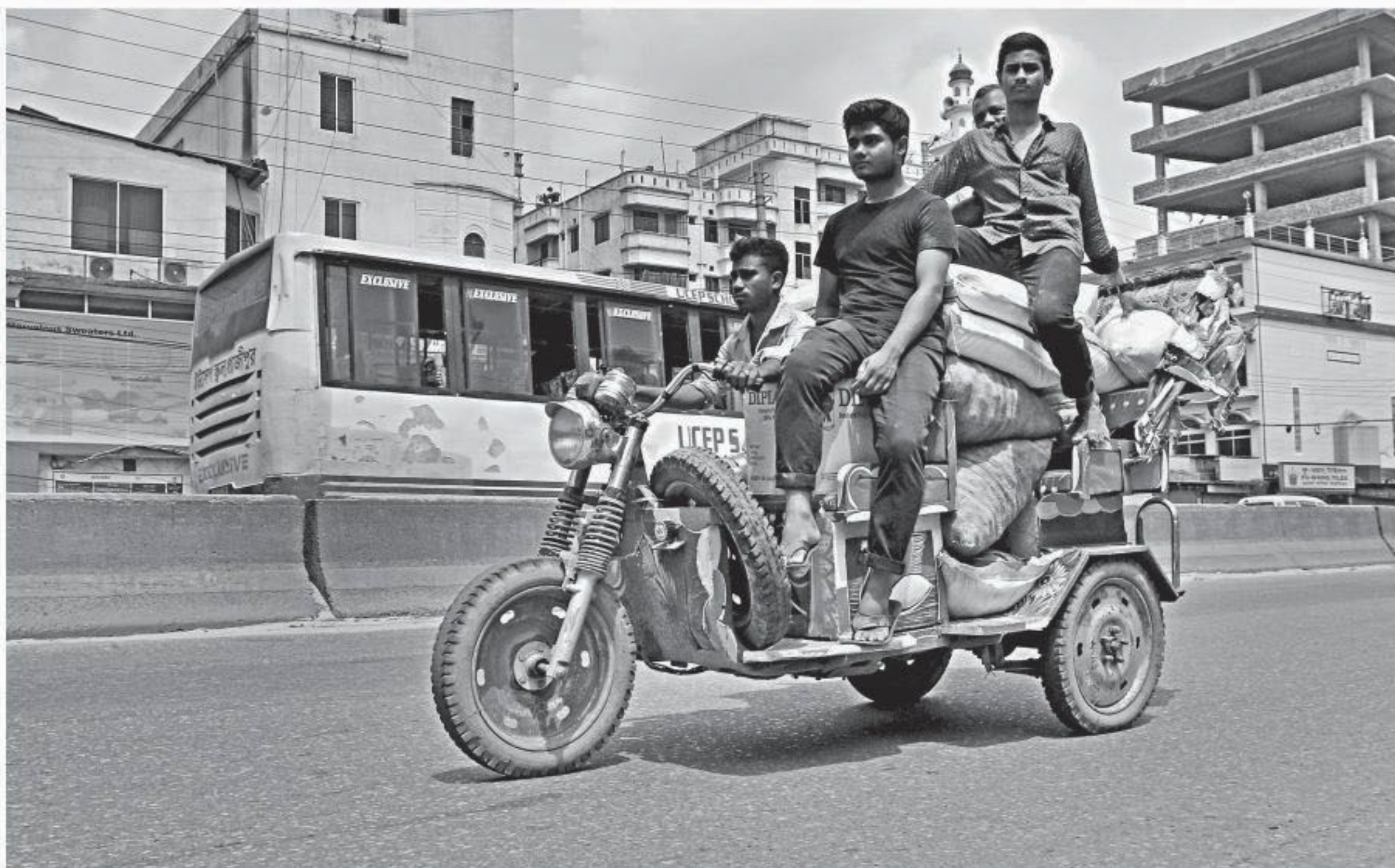


Man found dead behind wheel in Uttara

Police recovered the slit-throat body of a man from the driver's seat of a car in the capital's Uttara early yesterday. The deceased was identified as Arman Hossain, 40. He used to provide ride-sharing services with a rented car for around a year, said his cousin Arif Hossain. The incident took place in between 12:05am and 1am on Road-16 of Uttara-14, said Abul Kalam, inspector (investigation) of Uttara West Police Station. Notified by locals, police recovered the body around 1:30am. None of Arman's belongings, including two mobile phones and wallet, was missing, said the inspector. "We are looking into the matter," he added. According to police, Arman picked up passengers from Rampura at 11:21pm and was supposed to drop them off at Uttara-14. CCTV footage in the area showed that the car reached there around 12:04am. But CCTV does not cover the spot where he was found dead, said police. Hailing from Ishwardi of Pabna, Arman lived in a rented house at Mirpur-11 with his family members, said Arif Hossain. The car Arman drove is owned by a businessman from Mirpur, who owns more vehicles used for ride-sharing services, he added.

"Today, in the 21st century, Malaysia has created an underclass of workers called migrant workers who are open to extreme forms of exploitation that reflects modern day slavery," said Glorene Das, executive director of Tenaganita. Joanna Ewart-James, executive director of Freedom United, said they are concerned that the proposed wage deduction puts vulnerable workers at a much greater risk of modern slavery and restricts their movement that goes against fundamental labour rights. "Migrant workers who have done nothing wrong do not deserve punishment," she said, expecting that the Malaysian government would reconsider its strategy.

75yr old arrested for raping minor

An elderly man was arrested yesterday for raping a nine-year-old. The arrestee is Shamsu Mallik, 75, from Rupsha upazila in Khulna. Investigation officer Harunur Rashid, sub-inspector of Rupsha Police Station, said Shamsu raped the minor on June 1 and threatened her not to disclose the incident. "Yesterday Shamsu again tried to force himself on the girl," said the IO. Hearing her screams, locals rushed in and held Shamsu. After a case was filed by the victim's mother, police arrested Shamsu. He was sent to jail.

Panchagarh couple lose lives as microbus hits rickshaw-van

Kaimuddin was pulling his rickshaw-van with his wife Anwara Begum sitting on it. After receiving a loan from an NGO office, the couple was returning to their Kumar Char village home in Panchagarh. When they reached Proshika intersection, a microbus hit the rickshaw-van from behind. The accident happened on Debiganj-Domar road in Debiganj upazila around 4pm on Thursday. Kaimuddin, 45, died on the spot. His 40-year-old spouse was still alive with critical injuries, said Debiganj Police Station Officer-in-Charge Rabulul Hasan Sarkar. Locals took Anwara to Debiganj Upazila Health Complex from where she was being transferred to Rangpur Medical College Hospital. She succumbed to her injuries on the way, said the OC. In Thakurgaon, a boy was killed as a truck ran him over at Akhanagar rail crossing in Sadar upazila on Thursday. Azharul Islam, 12, son of Sadequl Islam from Akhanagar village, was crossing the road. Locals said he was hearing impaired. The driver managed to escape with the vehicle. In Pirojpur, Al Amin Sheikh, 26, passenger of a bus, died on the spot as the vehicle skidded off the road and overturned on a field in Charkhola village of Nazirpur upazila yesterday. In another incident, motorcyclist Abdullah Al Sakib, 18, a student of Indurkani Degree College, and Monirul Islam Gazi, 57, a pedestrian, were killed as the motorbike hit the latter in Dakkhin Indurkani village of Indurkani upazila the same day. Sakib died around 11pm on the way to Dhaka for treatment and Monirul on the way to Khulna Medical College Hospital. In Savar, an RMG worker was killed as an unidentified vehicle hit him on Nabinagar-Chandra road in Mojarml area while he was returning home from work on bicycle yesterday, said police. The deceased was identified as Anis Miah, 40. Meanwhile, Montu Mollah, 26, a student of Govt Bangla College, was killed as a bus hit his motorcycle on Dhaka-Aricha highway in Boliapur area of Savar. One of the victim's friends, who was a pillion, was also injured, said AFM Sayeed, officer-in-charge of Savar Model Police Station. In Gaibandha, helper of a bus driver was killed and 10 were injured in a head-on collision between the vehicle and a truck on Rangpur-Bogra highway in Chapriganj area yesterday. The deceased, Shafiqul Islam, 28, was from Kurigram. Fire service took the injured to Gobindaganj Upazila Health Complex.

Security man dies at Ctg port

House help found dead

A house help was found dead in between two buildings in Sylhet city yesterday. On information, police recovered the body of Sahana Aktar, 17, from the spot. The victim, from Bateshwar area in Sadar upazila, used to work at the house of one Akhtaruzzaman and Dr Hasina Munni on the ninth floor of adjacent Apon Blue Tower. Sahana had been working there for six to seven months, said Akhtaruzzaman, adding that she might have fallen from the rooftop. Sahabul Islam, inspector (investigation) of Kotwali Police Station, said, "We recovered the body with the help of Fire Service and Civil Defence."

UAE-bound passenger arrested in Ctg airport

Chattogram Shah Amanat International Airport officials arrested a UAE-bound passenger with 60,000 dirham and US \$300 yesterday. The arrestee is Jahur Alam, 35, from Hathazari upazila in Chattogram, said airport officials. Jahur was supposed to fly to UAE's Sharjah by an Air Arabia flight at 9:30am yesterday, said Wing Commander ABM Sarwar-e-Jaman, manager of the airport. During checking at the immigration point, the money was found in his bag, he added. Jahur was carrying the money without declaration and so he was arrested. Sarwar-e-Jaman said. Filing of a case was under process against him on charge of money laundering.

Expired drugs in pharmacies 'not unusual'

Says president of pharmaceutical industries' association

Availability of date-expired medicines in the country's drugstores is "not unusual" and there is "no reason to be worried", said Nazmul Hasan Papon, president of Bangladesh Association of Pharmaceutical Industries, yesterday. He claimed that only "top 20" pharmaceutical industries usually collect back expired drugs. However, he could not confirm whether all the companies follow standard operating procedure to safely destroy expired medicines. Papon was speaking to journalists at his residence in Dhaka's Gulshan in response to the recent claim that "93 percent of pharmacies in Dhaka city keep expired medicines". Papon, however, did not dismiss the claim. On Monday, Monjur Mohammad Shahrir, deputy director of Directorate of National Consumer Rights Protection, said they found expired medicines in 93 percent of the 200 pharmacies in the capital where it conducted drives for over six months. Papon yesterday said medicines will be produced and will eventually expire. "And, we [companies] are bound to refund pharmacy owners regularly. So, there is no reason for them to sell expired medicines," he said. Papon claimed that of the total products, a drugstore can stock not more than five percent of expired medicines. According to Directorate General of Drug Administration, pharmacy owners must check for expired medicines every week, maintain a list and keep those separate for drug companies to replace. Also, standard operating procedure (SOP) must be maintained to destroy expired medicines, according to WHO. Papon said, "You might assume we just throw them away. But there is a systematic process." "All good companies must have SOP. Others also know about it, but we don't know whether they follow it."
