Govt backtracks on slapping advance tax

Tk 5,23,190cr budget passed in JS

Entrepreneurs will not be required to pay Advance Tax on import of capital machinery and spare parts this fiscal year, as the government has backtracked on its move to levy the indirect tax on such import to facilitate industrialisation.

In the proposed budget for fiscal 2019-20, the government sought to slap 5 percent Advance Tax (AT) on import under the new Value Added Tax (VAT) to widen the VAT net and curb scope for money laundering through trade mis-invoicing.


The proposal for imposing AT raised concerns among businesses that it would push up operational costs of businesses, particularly for domestic market-oriented industries, as import of raw materials by export-oriented factories is now out of the purview of AT.

And finally, in his closing speech on the budget on Saturday, Finance Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal proposed AT exemption on import of capital machinery and spare parts, and machinery and other materials for power plants to encourage investment.

"We welcome the withdrawal and [are] thankful [to the government] for accepting part of our proposal for the manufacturing sector," said Sheikh F Fahim, president of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of SEE PAGE 8 COL 3

Shaheen still unconscious

PM takes charge of teen threewheeler driver's treatment

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has promised the best possible treatment for the teen who was beaten up by a group of unidentified criminals in Satkhira's Patkelghata upazila on Friday.

The driver Shaheen, 14, has been receiving treatment at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) since Saturday. Brig Gen AKM Nasir Uddin, director of DMCH, said

PM's Deputy Press Secretary Ashraful Alam Khokon visited the hospital early yesterday and enquired about Shaheen's condition. Khokon urged the doctors to ensure best possible

treatment for Shaheen and said the PM would bear all the medical costs for the boy, he added.

The DMCH director also said, "Although Shaheen is doing slightly better now, we are unable to say anything clearly before 48 hours pass by.

End mobile internet shutdown in 2 states

US urges Myanmar

The United States on Saturday called for an end to a mobile internet shutdown in two strife-torn states in Myanmar, saying the cutoff undermines transparency amid clashes between the military and insurgents. Myanmar's government last week took

the unprecedented step of ordering mobile phone operators to shut down all internet data across at least eight townships in Rakhine state and one in neighbouring

Chin state. The move came as the military moved

against insurgents fighting for more autonomy for the region's ethnic Rakhine Buddhists. "Internet service should be restored

without delay," the US State Department said in a statement.


