

# Tigers save their worst for the last

 hander top-scored with 64 and that saw him make it back to the top of the tournament's run-scorers' list. He also became the only batsman after Sachin Tendulkar in 2003 to have seven 50-plus scores in a World Cup. Having finished on 606 runs, he is also the third batsman in World Cup history -- after Tendulkar and Matthew Hayden -- to go past the 600-run mark in a single edition of the mega event.

Mustafizur Rahman also picked up his second five-wicket haul on the trot, which shot him up to second in the tournament's wicket-takers' list, but that he gave away 75 runs while doing so spoke volumes of Bangladesh's plight in this tournament -- a bowling and fielding unit that has just not been up to scratch.

In chase of a total that seemed manageable, especially after Bangladesh had cantered past West Indies' 321 in Taunton on June 17, the disheartening aspect was the lack of fight displayed by the Tigers in the chase. Tamim Iqbal's underwhelming World Cup met a tame end when a brilliant off-cutter from Shaheen Shah Afridi in the 11th over snuck through his defence and disturbed the furniture, dismissing Bangladesh's leading run-scorer for eight off 21 balls. Soumya had departed earlier, hitting Mohammad Amir straight to point in the sixth over. That it was not going to be Bangladesh's day was evident when Mushfiqur Rahim -- the other man in form -- inside-edged a Wahab Riaz delivery onto his stumps in the 18th over to leave the score on 78 for three.

Shakib persisted, seemingly batting on a different wicket than his teammates, and put on 58 for the fourth wicket with Liton Das, but Liton's second soft dismissal in a row, check-driving Afridi to cover, was followed swiftly by Shakib's dismissal, caught behind off the same bowler in the 33rd over.

With their talisman back in the hut and the score reading 154 for five, the fight had left the Tigers completely. Mahmudullah Riyad, coming back into the side after missing the match against India because of a calf muscle tear, scored 29 as Mosaddek Hossain and Mohammad Saifuddin came and went. Mahmudullah was eighth out to Afridi, who completed a five-wicket haul with a swinging yorker that bowled Mahmudullah off his toes. Mashrafe came in and gave the crowd something to cheer about with sixes off Shadab Khan and Afridi, but was stumped off the former in the 44th over. Afridi then did not waste any time, bowling Mustafizur with a yorker to end up with figures of six for 35 -- Pakistan's best individual figures in a World Cup.

Earlier, Pakistan's innings was based around a 157-run second-wicket stand between centurion Imam-ul-Haq and Babar Azam. Babar, however, was given two lives in successive overs. Mosaddek Hossain dropped him off Mustafizur at point in the 26th over when the batsman was on 57 and then Mushfiqur Rahim failed to get a glove to an edge in the following over off Mosaddek's bowling.

Instead of halting a threatening partnership that was yet not past the century mark after seven overs and leading up to Babar's life had produced just 24 runs, Bangladesh conceded

43 runs in the five overs following Mosaddek's miss. Mohammad Saifuddin was taken for two boundaries in the 32nd over but he broke through with the last ball, trapping Babar in front for 98-ball 96.

Imam then picked up the pace and reached his seventh ODI century off 99 balls, but was out to a freak dismissal off his next ball, when he stepped on to the stumps while flicking Mustafizur off his hips to be out hit-wicket in the 42nd over.

The score was then on 246 for three and Mehedi Hasan Miraz -- the only Bangladesh bowler to make use of the slow conditions and keep a lid on the scoring -- made it 248 for four in the next over by getting Mohammad Hafeez caught at deep square leg.

# Dutch startup

 The car, created by Dutch startup Lightyear, has a charging port to plug into a charger. But the solar panels can charge the Lightyear One's batteries at a rate of about 7.5 miles of charge every hour. That's slow compared to plugging it in. Still, if you parked it outside your office on a sunny day, it could soak up enough power to drive 60 miles, which is more than most people drive on a typical day.

"In the summer in the Netherlands, you probably won't have to charge for about two months," said Lightyear CEO Lex Hoefsloot, "and that's with average driving."

The company was founded in 2016 by several members of Eindhoven University of Technology's team that won the Bridgestone World Solar Challenge, a competition for solar-powered cars. If it reaches production, Lightyear One will be the company's first car.

The batteries hold enough energy for 450 miles of driving, the company says. The solar panels will work even when the car is moving, meaning that as you're going down the highway -- assuming you're traveling in the daytime -- the sun's energy will replenish at least some of the power you're using. On a long drive, help from the sun could add as much as 50 miles to a fully charged battery.

**NARAYANGANJ MADRASA PRINCIPAL SUED**

Two cases were filed yesterday against Al-Amin, principal of Baitul Huda Cadet Madrasa, for his alleged involvement in raping around a dozen female students since 2018.

A guardian of one of the victims filed a case against Al-Amin under the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act while Rab sued him under the Digital

Security Act.

Alep Uddin, senior assistant director of Rab-11, said investigated the allegation and found that the principal raped 10 to 12 girls since 2018 and tried to violate many others.

They also found pornographies in his cellphone and his personal computer.

Rab will produce Al-Amin before court today with a 10-day remand plea, he added.

When his wife was not at home or the madrasa was closed, he used to intimidate the girls with threats of beating, giving poor marks in exams, and outright failing them to make them go to his house, the Rab official said.

During primary interrogation, he confessed that he had raped and sexually harassed girls, the official added.

**MINOR RAPED AT DHANMONDI HOSPITAL**

Police on Thursday arrested a canteen staffer of a private hospital in the capital on charge of raping a minor girl.

Mosharof Hossain, sub-inspector of Dhanmondi Police Station, said the girl went to the hospital with her mother, who is also a staffer of the hospital.

As the girl was loitering around the canteen around 3:30pm, the 17-year-old boy lured her with his mobile phone and took her to the power generator room where he raped the girl, the SI said.

The girl was taken to the One-Stop Crisis Centre at Dhaka Medical College where she is undergoing treatment, police said.

Later, victim's mother filed a case with Dhanmondi Police Station, the SI added.

 risks as clashes intensify nearby, IOM said.

The Tripoli-based government, which is recognised by the UN, blamed the attack on forces associated with General Khalifa Haftar, whose Libyan National Army has been waging an offensive against rival militias in the capital of the war-torn North African country since April, according to an AP report.

According to IOM, the ongoing conflict in the Libyan capital has forced nearly 100,000 Libyans to flee their homes.

"We are doing all we can to help. IOM and UNHCR have dispatched medical teams, while a wider UN inter-agency team awaits clearance to visit the area. We remind all parties to this conflict that civilians must not be targets and must be protected under both International Refugee Law and International Human Rights Law."

The UNHCR with partners that include IOM has relocated more than 1,500 refugees from detention centres near combat to safer areas.

Separately, in 2019, IOM's Voluntary Humanitarian Return operations have assisted

in the departure of more than 5,000 vulnerable individuals, including Bangladeshis, returning to their countries in Asia and Africa.

"We urgently call on the international community to provide humanitarian corridors for migrants and refugees to be evacuated out of Libya," said IOM and UNHCR in a joint statement.

According to officials of Bangladesh Embassy in Libya, there are some 20,000 Bangladeshis in Libya. Many have tried to cross the Mediterranean Sea to reach Europe.

In May, some 40 Bangladeshis were feared dead in the sea as their Europe-bound boat capsized.

On June 18, 64 Bangladeshis and some other nationals were rescued from the sea some 25km off the Tunisian coast of Zargis. At least 52 of them have been repatriated so far.

Some 500 Bangladeshis, who were either rescued from the Europe-bound ships in the sea or were stranded in Libya due to civil war, had been repatriated from the country since 2018, said ASM Ashraf Islam, labour counsellor of Bangladesh Embassy in Libya.

 was providing a lot of subsidies in this sector.

Otherwise, the government will have to count more subsidies, he said, calling upon all to accept the decision.

Responding to another query over the PM's China visit, he said, "We will knock at the door of those who will come forward with investment for the development of our country."

Quader said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and Chinese President Xi Jinping were putting emphasis on the Rohingya issue.

"Mounting pressure on Myanmar over the Rohingya issue is very important and they [China] have given us their assurance of putting pressure on Myanmar to repatriate its nationals with due dignity," he said.

Referring to the BNP's reaction to a Pabna court's verdict on the attack on a train carrying the then opposition leader Sheikh Hasina, Quader said, "BNP terms court verdicts fabricated whenever the judgements go against the party. It is nothing new. They speak according to their tradition and always try to shift blame on the government."

About BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's stay at hospital, he said, "It is the matter of the court whether she [Khaleda] will be staying in the hospital or in the jail."

"She [Khaleda] did not seek release from jail on parole. If she had done it, we could have talks held over the issue," he said.

"After all, she needs to stay healthy first. She will stay at the hospital until she recovers fully," the AL leader added.

# Iran threatens retaliation

 United States ignored their pleas and pulled out of a pact between Iran and world powers that gave Tehran access to global trade in return for curbs on its nuclear programme.

Over the past two months, Washington has sharply tightened sanctions against Tehran with the aim of halting its oil exports altogether. The moves have largely driven Iran from mainstream markets and forced it to find unconventional ways to sell crude.

The confrontation took on a military dimension in recent weeks, with Washington accusing Iran of attacking ships in the Gulf and Iran shooting down a US drone. President Donald Trump ordered, then cancelled, retaliatory strikes.

With nuclear diplomacy at the heart of the crisis, Iran announced this week it had amassed more fissile material than allowed under its deal, and said it would purify uranium to a higher degree than permitted from July 7.

The Grace 1 was impounded in the British territory on the southern tip of Spain after sailing the long way around Africa from the Middle East to the mouth of the Mediterranean, a route that demonstrates the unusual steps Iran appears to be taking to try to keep some exports flowing.

The Gibraltar spokesman said the 28-member crew, who have remained on board the supertanker, were mainly Indians with some Pakistanis and Ukrainians. Police and customs officials remained on board the vessel to carry out their investigation, but the Royal Marines were no longer present.

While the European Union has not followed the United States in imposing

broad sanctions against Iran, it has had measures in place since 2011 that prohibit sales of oil to Syria.

Gibraltar said on Thursday it had reasonable grounds to believe the Grace 1 was carrying crude oil to the Baniyas refinery in Syria. It made no mention of the ownership of the vessel or the origin of its cargo.

Shipping experts say it may have been avoiding the more direct route through the Suez Canal, where a big tanker would typically be required to unload part of its cargo into a pipeline to cross, potentially exposing it to seizure.

If officials in Gibraltar have not fully established the nature of the cargo or the final destination, they could in the coming days ask a court for permission to hold the vessel for longer.

**BMW boss Krueger to step down in 2020**

German car giant BMW yesterday said its boss Harald Krueger would not seek another term when his current office runs out next April.

"The Supervisory Board will address the matter of succession in its next meeting on 18 July 2019," said the group in a statement.

Krueger, 53, had been under pressure over criticism that he has not moved swiftly enough in steering the group through the shift from combustion to electric engines, according to German media.

 the representatives of the two countries will work together. They'll also use their goodwill on Myanmar," Shahidul said.

The PM told the Chinese president that the Rohingyas did not want to go back to Myanmar as they were afraid of a recurrence of persecution there.

In response, Xi Jinping said there is a very slim possibility of a recurrence of such incidents as there is international attention on it.

The president said his country would try as much as possible in this regard as both Bangladesh and Myanmar are its close friends. China treats the two friends equally, he added.

Talking about the projects being implemented with Chinese assistance in Bangladesh, Hasina said during the Chinese president's visit to Bangladesh in 2016, 27 agreements and MoUs were signed between the two countries to implement a number of projects.

She put emphasis on expediting project implementation.

The PM requested the Chinese president to ease the terms and condition of loan agreements for timely disbursement of fund to expedite the project implementation.

Xi Jinping said he would take proper measures in this regard.

About trade and investment, the PM said Chinese companies should invest in Bangladesh with a buyback facility to ease the big trade imbalance against Bangladesh.

Hasina said Chinese entrepreneurs can invest in economic zones as her government was setting up 100 economic zones across the country.

The Chinese president said they were aware about it and would make all efforts to reduce the trade imbalance. He said they encourage Chinese investors to invest in Bangladesh.

The Chinese side discussed the trade gap issue very rationally rather than arguing that

there were not enough products to be imported from Bangladesh to reduce the trade gap, said the foreign secretary.

The PM sought Chinese assistance for implementing the Delta Plan 2100 and setting up a Climate Adaptation Centre, and implementation of Teesta River Comprehensive Management and Restoration project.

The Chinese leader assured that they would help Bangladesh set up the Climate Adaptation Centre and consider extending Chinese assistance for Teesta River Comprehensive Management and Restoration Project.

Highly appreciating Bangladesh's GDP growth, Xi Jinping said both countries could learn from each other's development.

Both the sides gave importance to the Bangladesh, China, India and Myanmar (BCIM) Economic Corridor, saying that the initiative would have to be revived working together with India.

Later, the PM joined a banquet hosted by the Chinese president at the same venue.

**CPC TO HELP RESOLVE ROHINGYA CRISIS**

The Communist Party of China (CPC) yesterday said it would contact the top Myanmar leaders to amicably solve the Rohingya crisis and start the repatriation as soon as possible.

CPC Minister for International Affairs Song Tao gave the assurance when he met PM Hasina at Diaoyutai State Guest House in Beijing.

"We'll contact Myanmar political leaders, including Aung San Suu Kyi, to solve the Rohingya problem amicably and so that the repatriation of the first batch of the Rohingyas starts as soon as possible," he said.

PM's speechwriter Md Nazrul Islam briefed reporters after the meeting.

Bangladesh is currently hosting more than 1.2 million Rohingyas. Most of them fled their homeland in Myanmar's Rakhine State after the military had launched a brutal offensive targeting the ethnic minority in August 2017.

 [Ershad] is doing better than before. His breathing issues have been slightly eased but he is yet to get out of danger.

"Ershad is still on life support. His breathing has improved after he was put on artificial ventilation."

Ershad, the 89-year-old former military dictator who is now the main opposition leader in national parliament, have been undergoing treatment at Combined Military Hospital in Dhaka since June 26.

He has been on oxygen support since Sunday and placed on life support on Thursday.

According to Quader, doctors conducted a dialysis on Ershad on Thursday night to remove excess water from his body.


"Ershad received 28 bags of blood in the last seven days. Of those, eight bags were given in last eight hours," he said.

Quader also said that the record of Ershad's medical history was sent to doctors in Singapore and they advised not to move him anywhere in his present physical condition.

The doctors at CMH Dhaka are doing everything they can to ensure proper treatment to Ershad, Quader added.

Ershad was admitted to the hospital with low haemoglobin, high bilirubin, liver problems, severe knee pain and other old age complications.

Earlier on January 20, Ershad flew to Singapore's National University Hospital for treatment and returned on February 4.
