The announcement was made on Hauer's non-profit HIV/AIDS charity, the Rutger Hauer Starfish Association's website. On the 30th anniversary of the film's release in 2012, Hauer

told reporters in Milan that it "was completely delicious to work on. I can't even fathom how it feels to be alive and an icon basically because of this movie".

The recipient of many awards, Hauer was also a noted campaigner for HIV/Aids research and set up his own association in 2000, in addition to his work as an environmentalist.


## Raihan Rafi to begin shooting for 'Poran' from next month
