

Starting off her rendition with the song Abar Eshechhe Ashar, Aditi, who is the only Bangladeshi singer to secure first class with first position in both her B Mus and M Mus at Visva Bharati University, Shantiniketan, continued to stun the music connoisseurs with her repertoire
