Rajarbagh police hospital without detection kits for a week

The Central Police Hospital in Rajarbagh has been without NS1 kits needed for dengue detection since July 30.

Mariam Jamila Shapla, a pathology consultant at the hospital, said, "A shortage of kits has been ongoing since

July 26, but we arranged for 200 kits from a local company on July 28. Those have run out too," she said.

The pathologist said they were currently diagnosing dengue through antibody tests and using their post

ADULT AEDES Capital sees 14-fold rise compared to pre-monsoon

The adult female Aedes mosquito population in the capital is now around 14 times higher than it was in the pre-monsoon period, a government survey has found.

The concentration of mosquito larvae is also much higher, meaning the mosquito population will grow further in the upcoming days, according to the survey, done by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS).

breeding Potential sources of Aedes include discarded tires, flooded tires, plastic drums, plastic buckets, water tanks and clay pots, according to the report that says the growing number of adult female Aedes is the key reason behind the ongoing spread of dengue.

Speaking The Daily Star yesterday, MM **DGHS** Aktaruzzaman, programme deputy Malaria manager and Aedes Transmitted Diseases, said people in their houses should take necessary measures; the city corporations should do better solid waste management considering SEE PAGE 2 COL 3
