

## GAZETTE FOR 9TH WAGE BOARD Govt to take legal steps: info minister

Information Minister Dr Hasan Mahmud yesterday said the government would take all legal steps for implementation of the gazette notification on the ninth wage board award.

He made the remark while talking to journalists after addressing an event of Asian University for Women (AUW) at its Mehidibag campus.

"I cannot elaborate on this, and can only hope for the best as the matter is sub-judice," the minister said.

He added that all preparations for the gazette notification on the ninth wage board award have been finalised, and the cabinet committee has also approved it, now awaiting the nod of the cabinet.

"The court has stayed for two months the publication of the gazette notification following a writ petition filed by Newspapers Owners Association of Bangladesh," the minister said.

He hoped that the court would consider fair rights of journalists and employees of newspapers.

Earlier, in his speech at the closing ceremony of the AUW event, the minister said the university is not only providing quality education to women and but also contributing to women empowerment.

He said the government has always extended help to the development of women education, and the dream of AUW for shifting its own campus will come true soon.

The minister asked students to reach their desired destinations successfully showing their zeal for fighting.

## Cattle trader killed in Rajshahi

Muggers killed a cattle trader on a running truck in Rajshahi on Wednesday night and snatched Tk 2.50 lakh from him.

The police recovered the body of Jorip Ali, 36, from Kukhandi area in the city at 11pm where the muggers had dumped his body, said Zillur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Katakhal police station.

Jorip Ali, a cattle trader of Singra upazila in Natore went to Rajshahi City Haat for buying cattle. His father Alal Mridha and uncle Rashedul Islam were accompanying him, the OC said quoting his relatives.

Without buying any cattle, they were returning home in a truck.

Departing the market at 7pm, the truck stopped at Nawdapara and took four other persons on board, before heading towards Natore.

Shortly after, the four unknown persons equipped with sticks and iron rods asked them to give away their belongings.

They searched Alal and Rashedul and found nothing with them, then tied the two with ropes.

Jorip denied to hand them the money, and they beat him dead with a rod.

After the murder, the truck wandered around Rajshahi for more than two hours and later left them at Kukhandi area.

Jorip's father Alal Mridha filed a case with Katakhal police station accusing the four unknown persons and the truck's unidentified driver and helpers.

## Four killed in road accidents

Four persons were killed and another injured in road accidents in two districts during the last two days.

In Sirajganj, two motorcyclists were killed as a truck hit a bike in Pachalia area near Bangabandhu bridge-Hatikumrul highway on Wednesday night, reports our Pabna correspondent.

The deceased were Tanvir, 22; and Ajim, 17.

Hatikumrul Highway Police Station OC Akteruzzaman said the accident occurred at 10pm.

BSS from Bhola adds, two motorcyclists were killed and another was injured when their bike and a cattle-laden truck collided in Borhanuddin yesterday.

The deceased were identified as Shadat Hossain, 24, and Mizan, 23.

The injured was admitted to local Sadar Hospital.

Borhanuddin Police Station OC said they seized the truck and were trying to arrest the driver.

where Mannan was involved like First Leasing International, Sunman Industrial Corporation, Banglalion Communications, Sunman Pharmaceuticals, Deep Sea Trawling Company, Tower Builder, Sunman Spinning Mills Ltd and Sirina Garments Textiles.

"It appears that Mannan was the main beneficiary of the money withdrawn through forgery," it said.

BIFC issued two loan sanction letters to Click to Design in 2010 and 2011. The limit of the loan was Tk 4 crore. But some Tk 15.46 crore was given to Click to Design. The business has so far repaid Tk 15.82 lakh.

Meanwhile, ACC has issued a letter to former district and session judge court Rezaul Karim Khan to submit his wealth statement within 21 work days. The letter was issued on August 7.

Although he gets no additional payment for this incredibly specific skill-set, Chunnun takes pride in his work, as sometimes experts come to him for assistance.

"I get a call once a month on average to supply mosquitoes; sometimes from city corporation, sometimes from IEDCR (Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research) and sometimes from Krishibid Institution," said Chunnun.

Liakat Hossain, store and purchase officer of DSCC, however had high praise for Chunnun.

"Whenever we need mosquitoes, we can always turn to Chunnun Mia. He has been doing it for years for us," he said.

Chunnun has two sons, and a daughter who recently got married. Chunnun sometimes takes his son-in-law to help him with his work.

A PARTING TRICK

Near the end of the conversation, this correspondent asked whether he could distinguish male mosquitoes from female.

"I learned that a long time ago from a doctor. Come, let me show you," said an enthused Chunnun, drawing attention to a mosquito cage.

He then proceeded to show a simple feature to distinguish between the two -- one that can be done with the naked eye.

## Grameen Bank chairman Mozammel Haque dies

Chairman of Grameen Bank, Khandaker Mozammel Haque passed away at Square Hospital early morning yesterday. He was 74.

According to a statement of the bank, he was born in 1944 at Kesharparh village under Senbagh upazila of Noakhali district.

He was appointed chairman of the bank in 2011, and served it till his last day.

Haque left behind his wife, a daughter and a son. Abul Hossain, general manager of Grameen Bank, said Haque was suffering from kidney and old-age complications.

His first Namaz-e-Janaza was held at Dhanmondi's Taqwa Mosque after Zuhur prayers and second Janaza at the premises of Grameen Bank after Asr prayer.

Nobel Laureate Muhammad Yunus, founder of the bank, took part in the second Janaza.

Haque will be buried at his family graveyard in Kesharparh village after Juma prayer today.

transport was taken on requisition," he claimed.

Saying that police officials who were found involved in unlawful activities faced just punishment, he said, they not only took departmental but also legal actions in many cases.

"We have tried to bring about change and we are not saying that we are one hundred percent successful," said the outgoing DMP chief.

Asaduzzaman said that he has taken many initiatives like introducing citizen information database service, beat policing [assigning an official for each area] in every police station to take the service door to door, printed general diary form and electronic traffic prosecution system so that people can pay the penalty fee digitally.

"We have had tremendous success in combating militancy and ensuring security at national and international events," said Asaduzzaman.

The DMP boss, however, said they have not been able to fully provide people-oriented service at police stations. "We have brought changes but there is still a lot of work to do in that regard."

Asaduzzaman further said that he has another failure when it comes to traffic management.

"I was not able to free Dhaka of severe traffic congestion. But I alone am not accountable for this failure as many other organisations are involved."

Another major reason behind it is the culture of violating law, he said. Driving on the wrong side and ignoring traffic signals are common examples, he added.

DMP additional commissioners Monirul Islam, Mir Rezaul Alam, Krishno Pada Roy, Abdul Baten and other high officials were present at the programme.

# Supporting mothers at workplace

To mark World Breastfeeding Week 2019 (August 1-7), the International Labour Organization (ILO) has reiterated its commitment to supporting and promoting breastfeeding in the workplace.

The occasion also provided an opportunity to look at how garment factories in Bangladesh are making a difference in the lives of nursing mothers at work, supported by the Mothers@Work initiative.

The first of its kind in Bangladesh, Mothers@Work is a partnership between Unicef and ILO's flagship 'Better Work Bangladesh' (BWB) programme -- jointly managed by the International Finance Corporation (IFC), according to a press release.

Mothers@Work was launched in 2017 to help safeguard the wellbeing of mothers and ensure that their children receive the early nutrition they deserve. The initiative has been rolled out in 80 BWB partner factories.

Tania Akhter is one of around 80 breastfeeding mothers employed at Sparrow Apparels Ltd in Gazipur. The

28-year-old Quality Inspector is a mother of two and has been bringing her nine-month-old son to the on-site childcare centre and breastfeeding room since her return from maternity leave. The breastfeeding corner offers Tania and her child a private, clean and well-equipped space.

The childcare centre also has three nurses and two doctors. The breastfeeding mothers get two additional breaks (30 minutes each) before and after lunch hour to spend time with their little ones.

In addition to a supportive work environment, Mothers@Work focuses on paid maternity leave, health protection, cash and medical benefits, child care and employment protection and non-discrimination at workplace.

"Workplace facilities, such as the breastfeeding room, has helped our factory retain staff and skills in an industry with a high staff turnover rate," Said Fatama Akter, compliance officer at Sparrow Apparels Ltd.
