Brexit turmoil drives UK towards recession

AFP, London

Britain's economy unexpectedly shrank in the second quarter of the year on Brexit turmoil, official data showed yesterday, placing the country on the verge of recession and sending the pound tumbling to a 2.5-year low.

Gross domestic product (GDP) fell 0.2 percent in the April-June period, the first time the economy has contracted in almost seven years, the Office for National Statistics (ONS) said in a statement, blaming a dramatic slump in the construction and manufacturing sectors.

The data, which was worse than market expectations for zero growth and also reflects global economic strains, sent the pound diving to \$1.2056 -- the lowest level since early 2017.

Malaysia charges 17 Goldman executives

Malaysia yesterday filed criminal charges against 17 current and former executives of three Goldman Sachs subsidiaries, piling further pressure on the Wall Street titan over the multibillion-dollar 1MDB scandal.

They included Richard Gnodde, chief executive of Goldman Sachs International, and Michael Evans, former chief of Goldman's Asia operations who is now president of Chinese e-commerce giant Alibaba.

Huge sums were looted from Malaysian sovereign wealth fund 1Malaysia Development Berhad in a globe-spanning fraud, which allegedly involved ex-prime minister Najib Razak and his inner circle.

Goldman's role has been under scrutiny as it helped arrange bond issues worth \$6.5 billion for 1MDB. Malaysia claims large amounts were misappropriated in the process, and is seeking hefty compensation from the bank.

Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad re-opened investigations into the 1MDB affair last year after defeating Najib at the polls, in large part due to public anger at the scandal, and pressure has been steadily mounting on the bank since.

Announcing the latest charges, Attorney General Tommy Thomas said: "Custodial sentences and criminal fines will be sought against the accused... given the severity of the scheme to defraud and fraudulent misappropriation of billions in bond proceeds."

"They feel that development activities and overall welfare of the people of Jammu and Kashmir will nullify their justification for crossborder terrorism. They will not be able to incite separatist activities. They will not be able to support terrorism. They will not be able to mislead people," news agency ANI quoted him as saying. He also condemned Pakistan's

move to downgrade diplomatic and trade ties, which included expelling the Indian envoy and halting crossborder railway services.

The United States yesterday called on India and Pakistan to maintain calm and restraint.

"It's something that we've called for calm and restraint by all parties. We want to maintain peace and stability, and we, of course, support direct dialogue between India and Pakistan on Kashmir and other issues of concern," the State Department Spokesperson Morgan Ortagus said.

There have been no major protests in Kashmir so far, barring sporadic instances of stone-throwing in the last few days, but several residents and a police official told Reuters resentment against the decision was building.

"There is a lull right now...the situation can go out of control," said the police official, who declined to be named as he was not authorised to speak to the media.

The SC said the HC must be extremely cautious since such bail to some extent intrudes in the sphere of investigation of crime.

A seven-member bench of the Appellate Division, headed by Chief Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain, had delivered the verdict following 31 leave to appeal petitions filed by the government challenging the HC orders granting anticipatory bail to several BNP leaders and high-profile persons, including its Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, Moudud Ahmed, Khandker Mahbub Hossain and Mainul Hosein, in different criminal cases.

The apex court had pronounced the verdict on April 18 saying that the leave to appeal petitions were disposed of. The full text of the verdict was released recently. In the full text of the judgment, the

Appellate Division has directed the accused persons to appear before the lower courts concerned in two weeks from the date of receiving the copy of the lower court judgement and to approach the respective courts for their regular bail.

The lower courts concerned shall consider their prayers for regular bail in accordance with law and facts of the respective cases if those are so made, the SC said.

"The apprehension that the accused is in a position to influence, include or coerce witnesses to desist from furnishing relevant information to the investigating agency cannot be considered to be imaginary and the court ought to have considered that aspect seriously before granting anticipatory bail.
