

Will honour people’s trust: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on Monday vowed to reciprocate the trust and confidence the people placed in her party by electing it for a third consecutive term.

“You’ve put your confidence and trust in me, you’ve voted for Awami League. I’ll surely uphold the values of that trust and confidence. We’ll take the country ahead towards further development and prosperity,” she said, after exchanging Eid greetings with a cross section of people at her official residence Gono Bhaban.

Hasina said Bangladesh is making progress, and it will keep on doing so. “Defying all odds, we’ve been able to establish Bangladesh as a dignified nation in front of the whole world. Let this march towards advancement continue.”

The Awami League president said her government is working to ensure that Bangladesh is always treated with respect.

The people’s living standard is improving, their income is increasing, and the poverty rate is declining, she said. “We want to establish Bangladesh as a developed and prosperous country as dreamt by Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. We’re working towards that direction.”

The prime minister said the month August comes with pain, grief and sorrow.

Recalling the tragic incidents of August 15, 1975, when she lost her parents and most of the family members, Hasina said, “Keeping sorrow, pain and grief in the heart and sacrificing everything, I’ve dedicated my life for the wellbeing of the people of Bangladesh and improving their fate.”

She said the souls of my parents will rest in peace if the people live well because “my father has given everything of

RIFAT MURDER

Court defers charge-sheet submission till August 22

A Barguna court yesterday set August 22 for submitting the police report and producing all the accused before the court in the case filed over the sensational murder of Rifat Sharif.

Senior Judicial Magistrate Sirajul Islam Gazi set the next date of submission of the charge-sheet after hearing on the case, said lawyer Mahbubul Bari Aslam, lawyer for Rifat’s wife and now an accused in the case, Aysha Siddika Minni.

The report was scheduled to be submitted to the court yesterday. All the arrested accused, including Minni, were presented before the court for the hearing yesterday. However, police did not submit the charge-sheet or seek time for it, said Mojibur Rahman Kislu, counsel for complainant Abdul Halim Dulal, Rifat’s father.

Rifat, 25, an internet service provider, was indiscriminately hacked by a group of youths in front of Barguna Govt College on June 26 in broad daylight.

In a video footage of the incident that went viral in the social media, Minni was seen screaming and trying in vain to save her husband from the assailants.

The victim’s father filed a murder case with Barguna Sadar Police Station against 12 identified people on the same day. The prime accused in the case, Nayan Bond, was killed in a “gunfight” with police on July 2.

Minni, who was the prime witness of the case, was arrested on July 16 by police, and sent to jail on July 19 after she gave a confessional statement to court. She has been denied bail by a lower court and the High Court since.

Khaleda spends time with granddaughters on Eid

Jailed BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia spent a couple of hours with her relatives, including her two granddaughters, and took homemade food they brought for her at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) on Eid day.

Party sources said six relatives of the BNP chief entered BSMMU cabin-621 -- where she is receiving treatment -- around 1:30pm, with homecooked food, new clothes and flowers. Sharmila Rahman Sithi, wife of Khaleda’s late son Arafat Rahman Koko, Sithi’s two daughters Zahia Rahman and Zaifa Rahman, Khaleda’s brother Shamim Iskandar, his wife Kaniz Fatema and son Ovik Iskandar met her.

They came out of the cabin around 3:30pm.

After the visit, Khaleda’s relatives said she was

Ducusu VP attacked in Patuakhali

A group of miscreants attacked Nurul Haque Nur, vice president (VP) of Ducusu, at Ulania Bazar area in Patuakhali’s Galachipa upazila yesterday.

Nur was travelling to Dashmina upazila town from his home village Char Biswas to meet his sister. On the way at around 1:30pm, the group forced him into a shop and beat him up.

On information from locals, a team from Galachipa Police Station rushed to the spot and rescued him. They took him to Galachipa Upazila Health Complex where he underwent primary treatment.

Five people who were accompanying Nur were also injured.

Akhter Morshed, officer-in-charge of Galachipa Police Station, confirmed the incident but could not ascertain the identities of the attackers yet. None of the attackers were caught as they had already fled the scene.

Md Fahim, a student of Hajee Mohammad Danesh Science and Technology University, who was accompanying Nur, said the attackers beat up Nur with iron rods and sticks.

This correspondent tried to contact Nur on phone several times but could not reach him. However, one of Nur’s travel companions, Rubel, a student of Government Shaheed Suhrawardy College, alleged that the attackers comprised of local Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL)

Keep houses clean to prevent dengue

President urges citizens

President Abdul Hamid on Monday urged the authorities concerned to encourage people to keep their houses and surroundings clean for preventing dengue.

He made the call while addressing guests at Bangabhaban on Eid day. President Hamid said Eid is being observed at a time when dengue fever has taken a heavy toll on public health and spread all over the country.

“Authorities concerned will have to take measures to encourage all to keep their houses and surroundings clean... It’s possible to prevent dengue if we’re aware of the situation,” he said, requesting people not to panic.

In a message, the president said the spirit of sacrifice of Eid-ul-Azha is a unique example of showing love and respect to the almighty.

“Azha means Qurbani (sacrifice) or dedicating something. Realising the essence of sacrifice, we’ll have to be imbued with the mindset of sacrifice and restraint to pave the way for establishing peace and welfare in society.”

Hamid said peace will prevail in society if the lesson of sacrifice is reflected in personal lives.

Referring to the devastation caused by floods, the president urged the affluent to come forward and help the affected people. “People of different flood-hit regions have been suffering ... they’re deprived of Eid joy,” he said.

Advisors to the prime minister, ministers, the chief justice, army and navy chiefs, diplomats, police chief, and distinguished people joined the programme. Secretaries attached with the president’s office were also present.

Port city resident Ibrahim Hossain visited the park with his children on Tuesday afternoon.

Sabrina, his elder daughter, said, “I just loved the rides at the park.” Her brother Samrat, meanwhile, was having too much fun with other

children to talk to this correspondent.

Ibrahim said, “They [his children] wanted to go out and have fun... this place is the perfect getaway for the entire family.”

Avijit Paul, assistant manager (marketing) of Concord Amusement World, Foy’s Lake, said yesterday’s turnout was higher than the previous two days.

“The crowd was less on Tuesday due to the rain but over 4,500 people visited the park and sea world yesterday.”

The Chittagong Zoo was also crowded with visitors. Around 10,000 people visited the zoo in the last three days, Shahadat Hossain Shuvo, veterinary surgeon at the zoo, told The Daily Star.

Port city residents also thronged Shwadhinat Park, Karnaphuli Park, Kazir Dewri Park and Butterfly Park to make the best of their Eid holidays.

Schoolgirl dies from electrocution

A schoolgirl died of electrocution at her house in West Rampura of Chattogram city yesterday.

The deceased is Afsana Jahan Tasfi, 15, daughter of Habibur Rahman. She was a tenth-grader at Khaza Garibe Newaz High School in the city, said police.

Afsana was critically injured around 10am when she came in contact with the balcony grill that was electrified by a live wire, said Assistant Sub-inspector Shilabrata Barua of Chattogram Medical College Hospital (CMCH) Police Outpost.

She was rushed to CMCH where the on-duty doctor declared her dead, he said.
