Govt mulling taskforce to curb road accidents

Says Obaidul Quader

The government is considering forming a taskforce to curb road accidents and bring discipline to the transport sector, Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader said yesterday.

The minister said the taskforce will oversee the implementation of the recommendations given by a committee led by former Shipping Minister Shahjahan Khan. The committee had recommended for setting up one or more taskforces to oversee the implementation.

The minister however said they will take final decision in this regard at the next meeting of National Road Safety Council (NRSC) to be held on September 5.

"We have got a proposal to form a strong taskforce. We will approve it at the meeting of the road safety council,

Shahjahan Khan, also the executive president of Bangladesh Road Transport Workers Federation, handed over the report of their committee to Quader.

At the last meeting of National Road Safety Council on February 17, the committee was formed to give recommendations for curbing road accidents and bringing discipline in the transport sector. The committee on April 28 submitted its report, with 111 recommendations, to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina as Quader was undergoing

Railways ministry asks authorities to ensure it

The railways ministry has directed authorities concerned to intensify efforts to stop people from travelling on trains roofs, terming it a major reason behind fatalities and slowing down of trains during Eid rush.

Railways Minister Nurul Islam Sujan and Secretary Mofazzel Hossain on Wednesday gave the directives to Railway Nirapotta Bahini (RNB), Railway Police and relevant section of Bangladesh Railwav.

"We have asked them to ensure that no one can travel on train roof," Mofazzel Hossain told this newspaper

Chairman of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) Iqbal Mahmood esterday warned its officials that no irregularity, nepotism, partiality and laxity will be tolerated in investigation into any complaint.

He made the remarks while addressing an urgent meeting with directors of all ACC divisional offices, deputy directors of all district coordinated offices, and secretary, directors general and directors of the head office on how to ensure transparency and accountability in investigation and enquiry.

Taking about the timeline of enquiries, he said, "From now on, those who will fail to follow the timeline should switch to another institution, as the ACC rules do not allow this."

Expressing his dismay over the delay in enquiry in the name of queries, Iqbal Mahmood said this will not be allowed from now on. "No query can be given without the approval of the Commission. We're trying our best to make this organisation a symbol of people's confidence. We can't allow the image of the institution to be tarnished for negligence and authoritarianism of anyone."

Mentioning that there were allegations of rude behaviour against some officials, he urged them to behave well with people, saying "Be careful of your behaviour and responsibility."

ACC Commissioner Dr Md Mozammel Haque Khan said the legal mandate of the Commission will be implemented. "So, any rude behaviour is not desirable. If you respect the law, you cannot be arrogant," he said.

People with visual disabilities, students, and others participated at a demonstration yesterday at Abahani playground in Dhanmondi, with the slogan "We are not as blind as you are".

Participants at the event -- organised by Bangladesh Youth Climate Network -- demanded that high carbon-emitting countries halt emissions rapidly, impose high carbon taxes, reduce fossil fuel consumption and switch to renewable energy at the earliest.

Governments need to take strong action now to dramatically reduce carbon use, if we are to have any hope of a habitable globe when we are in our 40s and 50s, said a visually-impaired demonstrator.

"High emitting countries like the US and China must take action now to end their addiction to fossil fuels," said Gaous Pearee, Director of WBB Trust.

Form nat'l commission for low-income people

Speakers demand at roundtable

Speakers at a discussion yesterday demanded forming a national slum commission to ensure permanent housing project for the low-income people, and investigate causes behind slum fires.

They alleged that although the High Court has issued a rule not to evacuate slum dwellers without proper rehabilitation, slums are burnt down and evacuated every year. It should be revealed whether there blazes are accidents or sabotage, they said.

They were speaking at a discussion titled "Frequent fire incidents at slums and permanent solution to housing crisis" at the capital's Jatiya Press Club. Environmental rights body Poribesh

Bachao Andolon (Poba) and nongovernment development organisation Bangladesh Resource Center for Indigenous Knowledge (BARCIK) jointly organised the

Speaking there, Pankaj Bhattacharjee, president of Oikya NAP (National Awami Party), alleged that the government is

deceiving the people by being negligent in developing their standard of living.

"A commission should be formed immediately to look into all issues of slum dwellers" he demanded.

He also suspected involvement of an influential group behind evacuating the slums by setting fire, to occupy these places.

Citing acute disparity in housing between poor and rich people, he stressed the importance of changing the state policies resolve such crisis. The discriminatory view of the state

about slum dwellers has to be changed, as it is important to remember that this state is dependent on their contribution in many ways," he said. In his speech, Pavel Partha, a researcher at

Wrong Treatment HC for compensating DU student Tk 5cr

The High Court yesterday issued a rule seeking explanations from authorities concerned as to why a Dhaka University student -- whose left side was paralysed due to wrong treatment at a private hospital -- will not be compensated with Tk 5 crore.

The bench of Justice JBM Hassan and Justice Md Khairul Alam issued the rule, after hearing a writ petition filed by Barrister Jyotirmoy Barua.

Mehedi Hasan Shamim, a student of Women and Gender Studies Department of Dhaka University, at a press conference at Dhaka University on April 18 said he was admitted to Square Hospitals in the capital on October 14, 2018 with brain tumour.

After admission, he said his physician Dr Krishna Prabhu suggested he needed to undergo urgent surgery, and did not disclose anything about its possible risk or post-operative complications.

The operation was conducted on January 23, 2019. Two days after the surgery, the duty doctor at the hospital informed Shamim's brother that the left side of his body was not working. When he sought the CD of the surgery for SEE PAGE 4 COL 1
