

## Road accidents kill eight

of his vehicle and hit the van, killing the puller on the spot. Police seized the truck but the driver fled the scene, they added.

In Pirojpur, a man was killed when a bus collided with his motorbike at Charkhola village on Pirojpur-Nazirpur-Gopalganj road yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Md Tanvir Hasan, 42. Witnesses said he was critically injured, and was rushed to a local health complex where doctors declared him dead.

Police seized the bus but the driver fled the scene.

In Rangpur, a man was killed and two others were injured after a car hit their motorbike at Muchirbazar village in Pargachha upazila yesterday.

The deceased is Nazmul Hossain, 40.

Quoting witnesses, police said Nazmul died on the spot. Pillion passengers Alamin and Nahid Islam were injured, and were taken to Rangpur Medical College Hospital.

The car driver fled the scene with the vehicle.

A police constable was killed when a passenger bus ran over his motorbike in Bandarban town on Saturday.

The deceased is Imran Khan Jony, 24. He was working under Bandarban district police.

Critically injured Jony was rushed to Chattogram Medical College Hospital where he died later.

Police arrested bus driver Saiful and seized the vehicle.

In Bogura, an army sergeant was killed and six were injured after a bus overturned at Rahobol area on Rangpur-Bogura highway in Shibganj upazila on Saturday.

The deceased was identified as Abdul Aziz, 35. He was posted in Bandarban.

The bus overturned around 7am, killing Aziz on the spot. Locals took the injured to a local health complex, and police seized the bus.

In Faridpur, a man was killed when a bus of Shohag Paribahan ran over his motorbike at Komorpur on Dhaka-Khulna highway.

The deceased is Ershad Mollah, 28. He was killed on the spot, said police, quoting locals.

Later, Rab personnel seized the bus and arrested its driver from Goalandia area in Rajbari, they added.

port jetties, Chattogram Customs House, private off docks and other facilities to see the ISPS code implementing process.

CPA started improving security systems on July 1, 2004 in compliance with the ISPS code ratified by the International Maritime Organization.

Delegates from US Coast Guard have made several visits to the port earlier.

During the previous visit in September 2017, a delegation gave at least 16 recommendations regarding improvement of security measures at different installations of the port.

CPA has so far taken several steps accordingly, including preparing a data base of over 80,000 port users and staff, issuing digital entry passes to them, installing digital access gates at the port's 13 entry points, increasing the number of close circuit cameras to 459 inside the port's restricted areas and more, said the port officials.

After inspection, the team will submit a report on the security of the port to the US Coast Guard head office.

## JU students, teachers protest 'unplanned dev'

Agitated students of Jahangirnagar University (JU) yesterday staged a demonstration on campus, protesting what they termed "ongoing unplanned development", corruption, and endangering bio-diversity.

The protest was organised by a newly formed platform, "Jahangirnagar Against Corruption".

Over 200 teachers and students of the university brought out a procession that started from social sciences faculty and ended at Murad Chattar on the campus.

At a rally that followed, they demanded relocating the three male students' dormitories which are planned to be constructed near Rabindranath Hall, and a judicial enquiry into corruption and tender snatching.

Speakers there also protested assault on two journalists when they went to ask Vice-Chancellor Prof Farzana Islam on Thursday at her office about corruption in the ongoing mega-project.

Prof Sayeed Ferdous of Anthropology department said, "From the beginning of the mega project, university authorities are playing hide-and-seek about a 'master plan', creating ambiguity among all. Disregarding the campus communities' opinions, they (authorities) are trying to spend a huge amount of money in an unclear manner."

President of JU cultural alliance Ashikur Rahman said, "University administration has created a farce in the name of development. We demand a judicial inquiry against the corruption as soon as possible."

"We are not against development, we also want it. But, development should be planned properly," said Shamima Sultana, a student of the university's Bangla department.

Coordinator of the platform, associate Prof Rayhan Rhyne; Chhatra Front general secretary Mohammad Dider, JU Chhatra Union executive member Rakibul Rony, and quota reformist leader Abu Sayeed also spoke at the rally, among others.

sound condition is 50dB for daytime (6am to 9pm) and 40dB for night (9pm to 6am) in "silent zones" -- that include hospitals and schools. If the rules are violated, the punishment for noise pollution is one month of imprisonment, Tk 5,000 fine, or both -- for a first-time offense. For a second offense, the punishment is six months' imprisonment, Tk10,000 fine, or both.

However, there is little implementation of the law.

Asked, auto-rickshaw driver Rahim Talukder at Shahbagh area said he knew of a law against honking in front of hospital. "But since the road stays jam-packed and movement of the pedestrians is irregular, there is nothing I can do but honk."

Referring to research by Department of Environment (DoE), Work for a Better Bangladesh Trust Programme Manager Maruf Hossain said, "The sound level around Shahbagh intersection is 80-150dB, which is not acceptable at all. Rules need to be implemented properly to reduce it."

Law enforcing agencies, Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA), DoE and local authorities (city corporations, pourashava parishad) should be more

responsible and prioritise it, he said, adding that mass awareness is required through campaigning.

Contacted, Dhaka Metropolitan Police (Traffic Division) Additional Police Commissioner Mofizuddin Ahmed said, "If any vehicle causes sound pollution in the area where it is prohibited, we fine violators Tk 100 under section-139 of the Motor Vehicles Ordinance."

Asked why their measures are not working, he replied, "We confiscated at least 10,000 hydraulic horns at different times. We are trying our best."

Regarding the implementation of the law, DoE director Farid Ahmed said, "We arrange drives via mobile court with the help of BRTA, but due to shortage of manpower, we cannot arrange the drives regularly."

Besides, DoE conducted research between 2015 and 2017 regarding the level of noise pollution in different areas, and trained 19,000 people, including officials of police, BRTA, DoE, as well as drivers, he said.

In future, they have plans to run a pilot project to reduce noise pollution with the help of locals in different areas, he added.

smiling emoji in the post, the groups' old rivalry surfaced again, Sarower said. Star Bond gang members later in the day wielded machetes, axes and other sharp weapons, looking for the Molla Rabbi group member in Rayerbazar area.

As several Rab men, who were deployed in plainclothes for surveillance of Janmashtami programme on that day, intercepted them on their way, the gang members intended to attack the law enforcers. This prompted the law enforcers to carry out the raid next day, the magistrate said.

During the drive, Rab members recovered some sharp weapons including machetes and axes from their possession.

In recent years, teenagers under different names formed gangs in the city's Abdullahpur, Tongi, Uttara, Uttarkhan, Dakkhin Khan, Mohammadpur, Hazaribagh, Kamrangirchar areas and different districts.

They got involved in drug peddling, mugging, and even murder, to establish supremacy over rival groups, law enforcers said.

Law enforcers said they strengthened surveillance with constant drives against the gangs after one such gang in Barguna called 'Bond 007' hacked a youth to death in broad daylight on June 26.

Shahzadpur Police Station accusing Miru and 17 other named persons along with 25 unnamed persons.

On May 2 the same year, police pressed charges against Miru, his brother Mintu, and 36 others in the case.

The case was under trial at Sirajganj Additional District and Sessions Judge's Court. On December 24, 2018, the home ministry ordered to transfer the case to Rajshahi Speedy Trial Tribunal, but the order took seven months to reach Rajshahi, on July 14 this year.

Rajshahi's Speedy Trial Tribunal Judge Anup Kumar had initially fixed August 8 for holding hearing on framing charges in the case.

while Barrister Juanyed Ahmed Bhuiyan appeared for Grameenphone.

BTRC issued three letters on November 6 and 29, 2016 and on January 1, 2017 asking Grameenphone to pay Tk 30 crore as fine for providing broadband internet services -- under Go Broadband -- illegally to Sonali Bank.

Grameenphone filed the writ petition with the HC in February 2017, challenging the legality of the BTRC letters.

Following the writ petition, the HC on February 9, 2017 issued a rule asking BTRC to explain why the letters should not be declared illegal and stayed the effectiveness of the letters.
