Her collections for blouses range from the halter straps, the high necks, to the illusion cuts, and Grecians. This compilation is certainly meant for the bold and the beautiful.

The colour palette used for each of the saris range from the soothing pastels to the majestic white; perfect for the scorching summer, or the monsoon blues. The aquamarine range is particularly worth mentioning as it portrays tiny sea urchins, flora and fauna, all in geometric form, replicating a scenery, thousands of feet below the levels of the earth.
