

on August 30, 2019 titled Poetry for Peace. The arrangement of this event was focused on getting poets and poetry lovers


together. Two renowned poets from Mexico, Dr Yuri Zambrano and Dr Mayra Chavez joined the event, where prominent poets

On Friday night, the play Chakha, written by Selim Al-Deen, was staged in Mohsin Auditorium in Srimangal Upazila town in Moulvibazar.

Directed by Jewel Kabir, the drama was staged by Prantik Theatre.

The play revolves around a cart carrying a dead body. The story begins when the carman and his accomplice deliver the corpse to the wrong address.

Together, they set on a journey to take the lifeless corpse home.

The theme of the play revolves around how the state is imposing the responsibility of an unjust death on marginalized people.
