Special police Legal action against party men if involved in misdeeds: Quader

Awami League General Secretary Obaidul Quader yesterday said not only organisational but also administrative and legal actions would be taken against party men if they are found involved in misdeeds.

Quader, also road transport and bridges minister, made the remark days after the president and general secretary of Bangladesh Chhatra League were removed from their posts for their controversial activities, including alleged involvement in extortion.

He was taking to reporters after a views exchange meeting with officials of Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) at its headquarters in Motijheel.

When a reporter tried to ask him about Chhatra League, Quader said, "I don't want to hear this question...Why should I answer such questions every day? Don't I have

any work to do?" He said the prime minister has taken the decision to remove them from their posts and she will take the next step in this regard.

Asked whether the ruling party is going to take similar actions regarding its youth wing, Jubo League, Quader said he has "learnt from the media that Jubo League has already formed a tribunal to resolve its issues."

"We will observe how they are solving their problem," he said.

The minister said apart from party men, the PM received information from different intelligence agencies and from her won cell on irregularities.

"I can tell you for sure, none would be spared if found involved in misdeeds -- no matter what position they hold in the party or whatever power they have," said Quader.

DENGUE OUTBREAK

Suspected number of deaths 203: IEDCR

The suspected number of deaths caused by dengue -- sent to the Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control And Research (IEDCR) for review -- went up to 203 yesterday.

According to the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), a committee of DGHS reviewed 116 deaths and concluded that 68 were from dengue till yesterday.

Prof Meerjady Sabrina Flora, who is leading the DGHS death review committee, recently said the committee members assess medical documents and treatment records of a deceased.

Several months later, they conduct "verbal autopsy". It is a method of interviewing one or more people who know about the symptoms and circumstances of the deceased, members of the committee said.

They also collect blood samples of the dead patients and examine them at labs of IEDCR, said Flora, also director of the institute.

"For verbal autopsy, we wait for one to

numbers," she added. According to DGHS data, 653 dengue patients were admitted to hospitals across the country till 8am yesterday, of which 460 are in Dhaka. With the addition, a total of 81,839 have been admitted to hospitals

all over the country this year. Some 2,507 dengue patients are undergoing treatment at the moment, of which 983 are in Dhaka.

Akash is undergoing treatment at National Institute of Neuroscience and Hospital at Agargaon. He suffered injuries in head, said a doctor of the hospital. Quoting students, officer-in-charge (OC)

of Kafrul Police Station Selimuzzaman said, Akash jumped off a three-storey building of the college after one of his teachers hurled abusive words at him and his parents as he failed an examination.
