Police were their close neighbours

Only a boundary wall separated two 'casinos' and a police barracks in Motijheel

They were next-door neighbours.

Fakirerpool Young Men's Club and Dhaka Wanderers Club that had been running "casinos" are just behind the Motijheel Police Station, separated only by the walls of a police barracks.

About 100 feet further ahead, two more casinos at Arambagh Sporting Club and Dilkusha Sporting Club had been in operation round-the-clock for a number of years

But police never shut them down.

A few years ago, these clubs had shabby walls. Now, they have a gorgeous look with neon lights and eye-catching interiors to attract visitors.

On Wednesday, Rab arrested Jubo League Dhaka South Organising Secretary Khalid Mahmud Bhuiyan for running a "casino" in Fakirerpool Young Men's Club.

The Rab team led by a magistrate also raided at least five clubs in the city and detained and sentenced 182 people in connection with running "casinos", gambling, and drug abuse. Rab also sealed off two casinos. SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

Wrists of a man chopped off

Fingers pointed at UP chair's cadres; feud over cattle market lease seen as reason

Goons of a union parishad chairman cut off the wrists of a man early yesterday following feud over the leases of a cattle market and a river ghat in Chapainawabganj's Shibganj upazila, the victim has alleged.

The man, Rubel Hossain, 24, of the upazila's Ranihati Bazar area, is receiving treatment at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Talking to reporters at the hospital yesterday, Rubel said armed with sharp weapons, some 10 followers of Foyezuddin, chairman of Ujirpur union parishad, stopped a motorcycle carrying

An alleged drug addict apparently slit the throats of his sister-in-law and her two minor daughters and then stabbed his own daughter at a house in Narayanganj's Siddhirganj yesterday.

Police arrested Abbas Mia in connection with the murders of 26-yearold Nasrin Begum and her daughters Nusrat, 8, and Khadiza, 2, in the afternoon.

Abbas' 15-year-old mentally and physically challenged daughter Sumaiya was sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital in critical condition.

The bodies had multiple stab wounds, Harun-Ur-Rashid, superintendent of Narayanganj police, told journalists after visiting the home at a sixstorey building in CI Khola area. The SP claimed that Abbas killed the three around 8:00am yesterday

after he had an altercation with his wife the night before. His wife Yasmin Begum and Sumaiya had then gone to Nasrin's home to stay. Nasrin's husband Suman Mia, who works at a filling station, said he found the front door open when he returned home from work around

10:00am after doing the graveyard shift. He found the bodies and Sumaiya in pools of blood on the floor and

PM warns as new BCL leaders meet her

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has hinted at even tougher action against party men indulging in corruption and misdeeds.

"I have taken action against Chhatra League and Jubo League. I won't spare anyone," she was quoted as saying when acting Chhatra League president Al Nahian Khan Joy and general secretary Lekhak Bhattacharya met her at the Gono Bhaban last night.

The drive against the corrupt people would continue, she said, adding that it would be difficult but she would solider

Hasina cautioned leaders of the pro-AL bodies not to do anything that tarnishes its image and hampers the country's development.

Talking to The Daily Star, Nahian said, "She [Hasina] suggested we emphasise on organising educational programmes and workshops on the country's history and heritage.

She also asked them not to bring out motorcade processions on campus unnecessarily.

She directed the BCL leaders to follow the principles of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman.

Two Rohingyas among 3 killed in a 'gunfight'

Three suspected criminals, including two Rohingya refugees, were killed in a "gunfight" with police in Cox's Bazar early yesterday, a day after they were arrested.

The dead are Mohammad Jamil, 20, Asmat Ullah, 21, and Mohammad Rafique, 24. Of them, Jamil and Asmat were inhabitants of Balukhali Rohingya camp and Rafique hailed from Teknaf upazila, said police. SEE PAGE 2 COL 3

US Drone Strike in Afghanistan

30 farm workers mistakenly killed

A US drone strike intended to hit an Islamic State (IS) hideout in Afghanistan killed at least 30 civilians resting after a day's labour in the fields, officials said yesterday.

The attack on Wednesday night also injured 40 people after accidentally targeting farmers and labourers who had just finished collecting pine nuts at mountainous Wazir Tangi in eastern Nangarhar province, three Afghan officials told Reuters.

"The workers had lit a bonfire and were sitting together when a drone targeted them," tribal elder Malik Rahat Gul told Reuters by telephone from Wazir Tangi. SEE PAGE 2 COL 1

Reforms key to drawing Japanese investment

Speakers at Standard Chartered-The Daily Star roundtable

Japanese investors have never been so interested in investing in Bangladesh, but administrative and regulatory reforms are needed to attract them, analysts and businesspeople said yesterday.

They said Japanese investors are trying to relocate their units from China and are looking for alternative destinations.

As of August, 300 Japanese companies were doing business in Bangladesh. There were only 82 of them a decade ago.

In 2011, the number of Japanese companies operating in the country was 100, said Yuji Ando, country representative of the Japan External Trade Organisation (JETRO).

Around 2,000 Japanese businesspeople visited Bangladesh in 2018 alone, according to the JETRO.

"I personally see a very good future for Japanese investment in Bangladesh," said Yasunori Takeuchi, chief executive officer of Standard Chartered Japan.
