placards with slogans -- "Our world, Our Future", "Plant Trees and Save the World" and "There is No Planet B" -- to show solidarity with the call. Meanwhile, Center for Participatory Research and Development, COAST Trust, Coastal Development

Partnership, Network on Climate Change Bangladesh and Shariatpur Development Society (SDS) organised a human chain in front of Jatiya Press Club, said a press release. Rapid deforestation is gradually destroying nature's

capacity to absorb carbon dioxide whereas carbon emissions is on the rise due to urban sprawl, speakers said.

Though scientists have warned about the adverse effects of climate change, countries responsible for carbon emissions are yet to shoulder the liability, they added.

universal health coverage."

But the new estimates reveal that 6.2 million children under 15 years of age died in 2018, and over 2,90,000 women died due to complications during pregnancy and childbirth in the year before.

Of the total child deaths, 5.3 million occurred in the first five years, with almost half of these in the first month of life. An estimated 2.8 million pregnant women and newborns

die every year, mostly of preventable causes, the new estimates say.

Children face the highest risk of dying in the first month, especially if they are born too soon or too small, have complications during birth, congenital defects, or contract infections.

"Around the world, birth is a joyous occasion. Yet, every 11 seconds, a birth is a family tragedy," said Henrietta Fore, Unicef executive director.

"A skilled pair of hands to help mothers and newborns around the time of birth, along with clean water, adequate nutrition, basic medicines and vaccines, can make the difference between life and death. We must do all it takes to invest in universal health coverage to save these precious lives," Fore said.

Road accidents kill five, AL itself exposing its graft, injure three

At least five people were killed and three injured in road accidents across the country during the last two days, our correspondents and news agencies report. In Joypurhat, a schoolboy was killed

after a speeding truck hit him at Tetultoli village in Sadar upazila yesterday afternoon. The deceased is Joy Hossain, 11, son of

Golzar Hossain. He was a fifth-grader at Joypurhat Barind Campus School.

Quoting witnesses, police said Joy was going to his friend's house, riding his bicycle. The accident left him critically injured and he later succumbed to his injuries while locals were taking him to a nearby hospital.

Police seized the truck but its driver managed to flee.

In Savar, three people were killed and three injured in separate road accidents in Genda, Amin Bazar and Modhumoti Model Town areas yesterday.

At Genda, Shahin Alam, 42, was killed and two were injured after a truck hit an auto-rickshaw around 4am, said police.

After the accident, three people,

including Shahin, were injured. They were taken to a local health complex where the on-duty doctor declared Shahin dead.

At Amin Bazar, Atiar Rahman, 32, was

killed and one injured after a covered van and truck collided. Driver and helper of the van were seriously injured after the accident. They were taken to Enam Medical College

Hospital where the on-duty doctor declared helper Atiar dead. In Modhumoti Model Town, Jibon, 38, was killed when a vehicle ran him over.

All bodies were sent to Shaheed Suhrawardy Medical College Hospital and the injured were referred to Dhaka Medical College Hospital, said police.

In Manikganj, Arifa Akhter, 28, suffocated to death after her scarf got caught in the wheel of the engine-driven rickshaw carrying her on Shahid Swarani road near Manikganj Zila Parishad around 8:15pm on Thursday, said witnesses.

On information from locals, police rushed to the spot and took Arifa to Manikganj District Hospital where the onduty doctor declared her dead.

Police seized the rickshaw but its puller fled the scene after the accident.

plundering: Fakhrul

BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir yesterday said Awami League leaders themselves are now exposing that they are indulging in "corruption" and "plundering" public money.

"No one now needs to talk about Awami League's misrule, corruption and repressive acts. The leaders of Awami League, Jubo League and Chhatra League are now exposing their own corruption. Awami League itself has proved that they're plundering the wealth of the people of Bangladesh," he said. Speaking at a human chain programme,

the BNP leader said Chhatra League president and general secretary were removed for demanding their "fair share" of Tk 86 crore. "Awami League plunged the country into such an anarchic situation that a university VC has also been involved in bribery."

Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal arranged the programme in front of Jatiya Press Club, demanding the release of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia.

Fakhrul said Dhaka University students

in corruption by enrolling students without any test while the students of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Science and Technology University are demonstrating for the removal of their VC for his immoral acts. "The current illegal government has chosen the worst people and appointed them to the post of VCs," he said.

Referring to media reports, he said 60 casinos are now in Dhaka run by Awami League and Jubo League leaders.

Fakhrul also said the government has failed to deliver on all fronts as it was not elected with people's votes. "People have now started realising that they won't get justice and security of their lives as long as Awami League remains in power. The situation has turned so awful that minors are being raped and killed, but none is facing trial," he said.

He said their party Chairperson Khaleda Zia's health condition is critical and she is unable to move without help, but she is not getting proper treatment.

The BNP leader said they have long been demanding their chairperson's release for her better treatment, but the government is

When asked about the money taken from the hawkers, he said some vendors rent out spaces to others and charge them for that. "The ones who pay the money may term it extortion. This is all I know...," he added.

save money and wait for the day of sapling distribution," he said. Pijush Kumar, a 10th grader at Bagha Model School, said, he planted some 57


trees over the last four years. "My parents and neighbours are supportive of me taking care of the trees," he said.
