Registrar of WUB, Heads of the departments, faculties and students of Civil Engineering were also present in this ceremony.

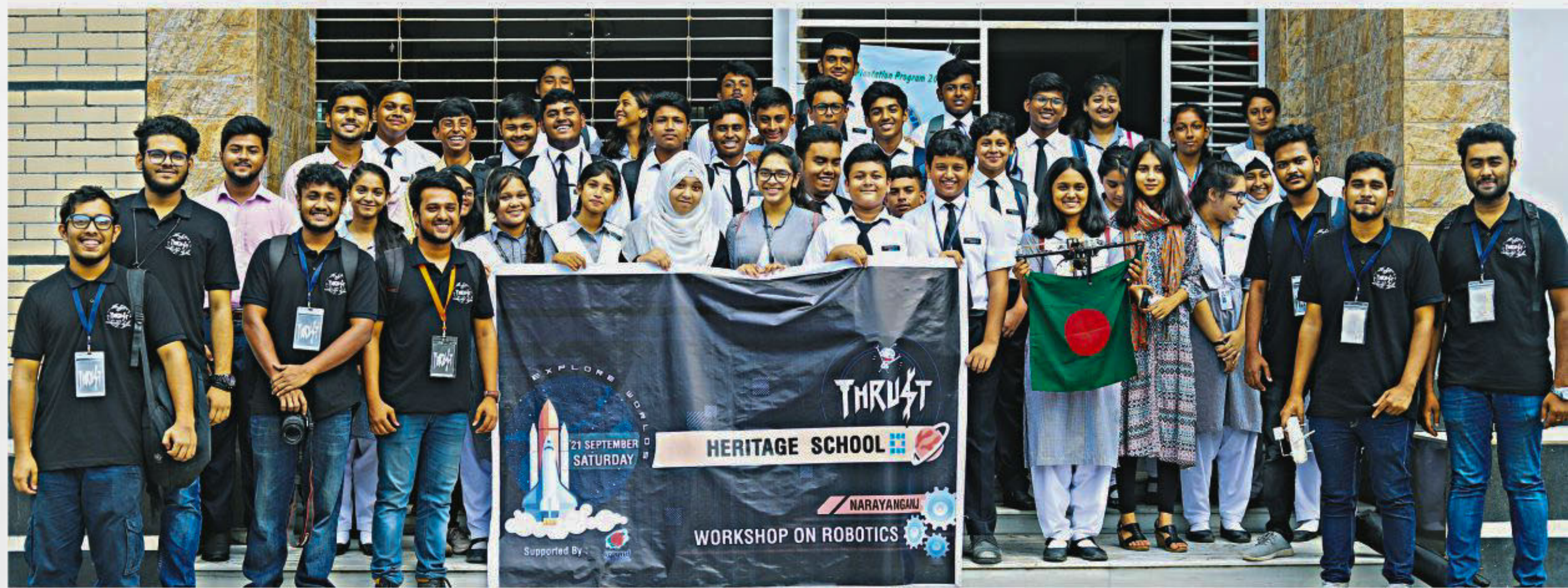
IUB-SBCC hosts HYD MUN 2019
