No teachers, classrooms, course outline for botany students

Almost every graduate has some sweet memories of being a freshman at university. But if anyone asks the students of botany at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Science and Technology University, they will probably share something that reflects how irresponsible the university authority was.

No teachers, proper classrooms or course outline -- yet the university this year launched the department with 70 students.

"January 1 was our orientation day. January 2 was our first class. A teacher from biotechnology and genetic engineering taught us botany at her department," said a botany student. On January 3, Mostafa Kamal Pasa, a retired botany

professor of Chittagong University, joined the university on a six-month contract and started giving lessons at the department. "I then prepared the course curriculum for the botany

department," he told this correspondent, adding that five courses that were outlined for the first semester, including microbiology and virology; mycology and lichenology; phycology; bryology; and pteridology, and a non-major SEE PAGE 10 COL 2



Report says Pompeo took part in Trump-Zelenskiy call

The US House of Representatives' impeachment probe into President Donald Trump intensified on Monday, as Trump raged about the inquiry and news reports suggested he had used additional diplomatic channels to go after his adversaries.

Three House committees said a subpoena for documents had been sent to Trump's lawyer Rudy Giuliani. The former New York mayor had said on television he asked the government of Ukraine to "target" former Vice President Joe Biden, who is seeking the Democratic nomination to run against Trump in the 2020 election.

Giuliani said in a tweet the subpoena raised legal issues including attorney-client privilege. "It will be given appropriate consideration," he added.

The Democratic-led House initiated an impeachment inquiry against Trump last week after a whistleblower report raised concerns that Trump tried to leverage nearly \$400 million in US aid in exchange for investigating Biden from Ukraine's leader in July.

Onion prices fall at wholesale

Amid increased import of onions from Myanmar, prices of the essential cooking ingredient came down a little in the capital's wholesale markets yesterday, a day after the price skyrocketed following an export ban by India. Prices of locally grown onion fell to Tk 75-Tk 80 per kg yesterday from Tk 88-Tk 90 a day before at Shyambazar market, one of the biggest wholesale spice markets in Dhaka.

Mohammad Abdul Mazed, general secretary of Shyambazar Onion Wholesalers' Association, confirmed the price drop.

Prices at the retail market, however, remained unchanged.

Narayan Saha, a wholesale trader of different spices at the Shyambazar market, said the increase in onion imports

had brought a change in the buying behaviour of retailers. "They are purchasing less than the usual, assuming the price may fall further," he added.

The government has imported around 4,142 tonnes of onions from Myanmar since early September, and some 569 tonnes were imported yesterday alone.
