



Iti, Tomari Dhaka, Bangladesh's first anthology film, is set to release in November this year. It was recently approved by the Film Censor Board of Bangladesh. The film has made successful rounds at close to twenty different international film festivals across the globe, including the 23rd Busan International Film Festival, Global Cinema Festival Siliguri 2019, Singapore South Asian International Film Festival and Durban International Film Festival, among several others. It won an award under the category of Russian Film Critics' Guild at the 15th Kazan International Muslim Film Festival, and an award under the category of best original screenplay at the 11th Jaipur International Film Festival.

With eleven exceptionally promising young directors from Bangladesh, Impress Telefilm's Iti, Tomari Dhaka is an assortment of shorts, with Dhaka as its central theme. The film stars Nusrat Imrose Tisha, Intekhab Dinar, Shatabdi Wadud, Iresh Zaker, Lutfur Rahman George and Fazlur Rahman Babu, among others, in key roles.

## Ramendu Majumdar looks back on his childhood Puja memories

Ekushey Padak awardee Ramendu Majumdar has been working in the field of theatre as an actor, producer and director for five decades. On the occasion of Durga Puja, he shares his childhood memories of the festival with The Daily Star.

Ramendu Majumdar was born in Lakshmipur. He finished his schooling there, and later, left the place for college. He spoke fondly about his hometown.


"Any festival was a joyous occasion for us. However, I especially miss the Durga Puja celebrations," he says. "My village is located 12 kilometres away from the main town. Consequently, we had to take

a trip by boat to get there. The journey was a celebration in itself. As a child, I loved walking around the areas and visiting friends and neighbours during the festivities."

The artiste recalled that making preparations for Puja, building and decorating Maa Durga's statue, waiting for days to buy new clothes and visiting his friends were things that he was most excited about.

"My Muslim friends used to come over to our house during Puja," he recalls. "We used to visit cultural programmes, where renowned folk singers performed. We celebrate the occasion together with our Muslim friends even today."

## Beatles' Abbey Road' back at top of charts 50 years after its release

The Beatles' Abbey Road has returned to the top of the British album charts, decades after its first release.

Featuring such songs as Something and Come Together, Abbey Road was the second-last album released by the Beatles before their acrimonious split, although most of their final release, Let it Be, was recorded before the Abbey Road sessions.

The album's initial 17-week run at number one ended on January 31, 1970, and it returns to the top of the charts after a gap of 49 years and 252 days, a feat certified as a Guinness ... World Record. The 50th anniversary of Abbey Road was marked last month by the release of a special deluxe edition.

# Bogura Youth Choir celebrates 43 years

Toufiqul Alam Tipu, the founder and secretary of the organization, delivered the welcome address.


