'A manifestation of intolerance'

Abrar murder sparks countrywide protests

The brutal killing of Buet student Abrar Fahad has sparked protests by students across the country, demanding justice and that educational institutions be cleansed of dirty politics.

"No educational institution in the country has an environment conducive to learning," said Abu Talha Abdullah, convener of Bangladesh Sadharan Chhatra Odhikar Songrokkhon Parishad's Narayanganj district unit, at a demonstration in front of Narayanganj Shaheed Minar.

Whenever any such incident happens, it is somehow linked to Jamaat-Shibir, he said, referring to the questioning of Abrar by leaders of Bangladesh Chhatra League's Buet unit, hours before he was found dead at a university dormitory.

Talking to reporters earlier, Buet BCL leaders said Abrar had been called in for "questioning" over his alleged involvement with Shibir, student front of Jamaat-e-Islami.

"We can see and hear but we cannot say anything. What kind of a country we are living in? What kind of nation are we?" Abdullah said yesterday.

Law enforcers suspected that the 22-year-old student of Buet's electrical and electronic engineering department had been attacked in response to his recent Facebook posts -- critical of some recent deals that the government signed with India.

In Rajshahi, several hundred students protested for the second consecutive day, starting 11am.

The agitators took position in front of Rajshahi University's main entrance and blocked the Dhaka-Rajshahi highway for an hour.

They demanded punishment of the killers, a ban on BCL's political activities, removal of university officials involved in corruption and security of general students on university campus. Students of Hajee Mohammad Danesh Science and

Technology University in Dinajpur and Begum Rokeya University in Rangpur also held demonstrations protesting the murder of Abrar.

Protests will continue until killers of Abrar are punished, students said.

Newlywed held in Ctg over death of wife

A man was arrested on Monday night from Chattogram Medical College Hospital (CMCH), on charges of killing his wife Sharmin Akhter Mitu, 22. The arrestee is Md Solaiman Liton, said police.

Inspector (investigation) Shahadat Hossain of Panchlaish Police Station said Liton brought his wife to CMCH on Monday night in an unconscious condition, where doctors pronounced her dead.

Shahadat said on information from the CMCH police outpost, they rushed to the hospital and detained Liton.

"We found an injury mark on the victim's face, and a mark of asphyxiation on her neck," said the

inspector. Victim's mother Cheman Ara Khatun said Mitu

and Liton got married just two months ago. The bride's family gave Tk 50,000 cash along with furniture as per groom's "family's demand", on the wedding day. "After marriage, she was often tortured by her husband, and we had several meetings to resolve the issue," she said in a choked voice at CMCH yesterday, claiming that Liton killed her daughter over dowry.

"I talked to her at around 8pm over the phone, and at 10:30pm I got my daughter's death news," she said.

A maternal uncle of Mitu said he was called from the hospital by a doctor with the death news. He said he told the doctor to detain the husband, who brought her to the hospital.

A new breathing space for port city residents

Bayezid Sabuj Udyan opens

With 3,000 trees of 41 different species, Bayezid Sabuj Udyan in the port city was inaugurated yesterday to provide a new green space to city dwellers.

Engineer Mosharraf Hossain, member of parliament and also chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on ministry of housing and public works, inaugurated the park at 11:55am.

The park has been built on 1.94 acres of land, owned by Public Works Department (PWD). The land was previously occupied by grabbers, who had set up shanties and rented those out.

2017, PWD authorities evicted the illegal occupants from the place, said Jahedun Nabi Chowdhury, sub-divisional engineer of the department.

After the project was approved in August

4,000 feet walkway. With a 3,000 square

feet pool at the centre, two open galleries

have been built around it.

There are 46 benches throughout the park. To keep the park clean, 20 trash cans have been installed at several points.

Two public toilets and a maintenance office have been built inside the park while children can play on seesaw and swing.

A master drain was excavated inside the park to keep rainwater from accumulating. To ensure security, the whole area has been brought under CCTV camera monitoring.

To give a dazzling view at night, 108 compound lights, 16 garden lights, and 55 fountain lights have been installed.

"Initial budget for this project was estimated at Tk 12 crore. But we managed to finish the work with Tk 8 crore and returned the surplus to the department," said Nabi.

MP Mosharraf said this kind of green public spaces is truly necessary in all the People can enter the park through two cities, so that weary city dwellers have a separate entrances to take a stroll on the place to walk, rest and recuperate.
