Pirjabad Councillor Shaheda Begum Baby said, "PDB officials apparently do not care about how risky the situation is." She also alleged that some PDB staffers had set up the connections before installing concrete poles and they visit the area every month to "collect fees".

"We have informed the matter to the officials numerous times but to no avail," she said, adding that not so long ago, a man got electrocuted after he came in contact with a live electric wire.

Contacted, Shariful Islam, executive engineer of Northern Electricity Supply Company (Nesco) in Rangpur, said it is illegal to use bamboo poles for drawing power lines. Nesco is a part of PDB, which oversees sales, distributions and bill collections.

Shariful said he was unaware of the situation in Pirjabad area. "We will look into it and take steps accordingly."

The executive engineer was also unaware of the power line workers.

He said, "Installing concrete poles is a continuous process... it is usually done by a third-party on contractual basis. I will look into the allegations.

This correspondent tried to get in touch with them, which turned out to be a strenuous task. None of the residents or PDB employees apparently knew anything about them nor had their contact information.

Meanwhile, at least five people were killed and two injured in other accidents across the country in the last two days, our correspondents report.

In Brahmanbaria. two forest officials were killed after a truck hit their motorbike at Ghatura area in Sadar upazila around 6am yesterday, said police, quoting locals.

The deceased are Dolon Sarkar, 36, and Rajib Chowdhury, 38. Both were office assistants of Brahmanbaria Forest Department office.

Dolon was killed on the spot and Rajib was critically injured after the accident. Locals took Rajib to a nearby hospital, but he succumbed to his injuries while being shifted to Dhaka for better treatment.

In Mymensingh, Rahmat Ali, 55, was killed after a truck hit the battery-run auto-rickshaw carrying him at Krishnachura Chattor area in Gafargaon upazila around 8am yesterday, said police, quoting locals.

Ali was critically injured after the accident and died while locals were taking him to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH), they added.

Police sent the body to MMCH morgue for autopsy. They seized the truck but its driver managed to flee. A case was lodged with Pagla Police Station.

In Dinajpur, Tango Roy, 50, was killed on the spot and two were injured after a bus hit them at Ranirbandar area in Chirirbandar upazila around 8:30pm on Wednesday.

The injured are Moktarul Hosain, 22 and Reazul Islam, 40.

Police, quoting witnesses, said after the BRTC bus's breaks failed, it hit three people one after another.

Locals took the injured to M Abdur Rahim Medical College Hospital for treatment.

Police detained the bus, but its driver and helper fled after the vehicle stopped.

MAN DIES IN TRAIN ACCIDENT

A man was run over by a train at Jorarganj area in Mirsharai upazila of Chattogram early yesterday.

The deceased is Nazrul Islam, 31. On information from locals, police recovered Nazrul's body, said police.

The body was handed over to his family, and railway police were informed to take necessary steps, they added.
