37pc teachers rely on 'guidebooks'

Study reveals lack of subject-specific training of teachers badly affecting classroom teaching

About 55 percent of English and mathematics teachers in secondary schools have not been specifically trained to teach the two key subjects. The lack of training is affecting their teaching methods and the quality of education.

Moreover, about 75 percent of physics teachers, 78 percent chemistry teachers and 64 percent general science teachers do not have the necessary training, according to the Education Watch Report 2018-19.

The report prepared by Campaign for Popular Education (CAMPE) also shows that 37.1 percent of the teachers use

unauthorised "guidebooks" sold in the market.

"The lack of subject-specific training is definitely affecting the quality of education. At the secondary level, teachers are supposed to be experts on subjects they teach," CAMPE Executive Director Rasheda K Choudhury told The Daily Star.

Teachers without subject-specific training usually fail to give proper instruction to students. If the teachers are bad at their jobs, the students get deprived of knowledge, said the eminent educationist.

BNP leader Maj Hafiz gets bail
Court rejects remand prayer of cops

BNP Vice-chairman Maj (retd) Hafizuddin Ahmed was granted bail yesterday, a day after his arrest under the Digital Security Act.

Metropolitan Magistrate Atiqul Islam passed the order, rejecting a seven-day remand prayer of police.

Rab arrested Hafiz at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport when he arrived from Singapore on Saturday.

He was accused of being involved in the "sending of false, misleading, fabricated, and ill-motivated information about intelligence and law

Foreign ministry tells UN's Mia Seppo

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs has told the UN Resident Coordinator in Bangladesh Mia Seppo that the killing of Buet student Abrar Fahad had nothing to do with freedom of expression.

"We explained to her the position of the government and the actions taken after Abrar killing, which was not linked to

Charge sheet next month DMP official says; another accused Chhakra League man confesses

Buet student and BCL activist Mujahidur Rahman Mujahid, an accused in Abrar Fahad murder case, yesterday confessed to a magistrate that he along with several others hit Abrar with a skipping rope.

Mujahid in his confessional statement named several Chhakra League leaders and activists who beat Abrar indiscriminately with cricket stumps and skipping ropes leading to his death, said a police official involved in the murder investigation.

Meanwhile, DMP Deputy Commissioner (Media and Public Relations) Md Masudur Rahman told The Daily Star that the charge sheet in Abrar murder case would be submitted to a court in the first week of next month.
