## Jobs abroad on decline

*Malpractices in recruitment, falling demand, lax efforts to find new market draw grim picture for Bangladeshi employment seekers*

- Demand for foreign workers in the Gulf declining
- Irregularities in recruitment lead to labour exploitation, market restrictions
- Market-driven skills programme and international accreditation needed
- Experts say Bangladesh need to initiate strong labour diplomacy
- The country should look for labour markets in the developed world

Bangladesh continues to witness decline in overseas jobs over the last two years amid unabated malpractices in recruitment process, falling demand in the Gulf countries and an absence of effective steps to explore new markets.

More than 10 lakh Bangladeshis secured jobs overseas in 2017 but that came down to 7,34,181 last year, according to the Bureau of Manpower Employment and

Training.

In the first eight months this year, the number of jobs Bangladeshis got were 4,17,084. The projected number of jobs by the yearend is 6,25,620.

Labour migration experts and recruiting businesses fear this trend will affect the inflow of remittance, create pressure on local job market and the economy.

An estimated one crore Bangladeshis working abroad sent home around \$15 billion last year, which

## Samrat placed on 10-day remand

Former Jubo League leader Ismail Hossain Chowdhury Samrat, an alleged kingpin of the illegal casino business in the capital, was placed on a 10-day remand in two cases filed under the arms and narcotics control acts.

Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate Tofazzal Hossain passed the order after two investigation officers produced Samrat with a total 20-day remand plea in two cases.

Samrat's alleged accomplice Enamul Haque Arman was also placed on a five-day remand.

Defence lawyers sought bail saying their clients were implicated in the cases as part of a conspiracy to harass them.

Besides, a vested quarter is trying to drive Samrat away from politics as he is a popular figure, the

## Buet protest called off

*Another confesses over Abrar killing; Anik was not beaten in jail, says IG prisons*

Buet students protesting and demanding justice for Abrar Fahad yesterday called off their protests, but declared to boycott their academic activities until the authorities expel the students involved in the killing.

They made the announcement at a press conference in front of the Shaheed Minar at the Buet campus after holding a series of meetings.

"Showing respect to the prompt action that the Buet authorities and law enforcers have shown by making progress in the ongoing investigation, we are calling off our protest," said Mahmudur Rahman Sayem, a student of the electrical and electronic engineering department batch-15 and a spokesperson of the protesters.

"We will be monitoring whether the Buet authorities are implementing
