

Brexit hangs on a knife edge

British parliament set for extraordinary vote today to decide fate of Johnson's deal

Britain's exit from the European Union hung on a knifeedge yesterday as Prime Minister Boris Johnson scrambled to persuade doubters to rally behind his last-minute European Union divorce deal in an extraordinary vote in parliament.

In one of the most striking flourishes of the three-

year Brexit drama, Johnson confounded his opponents on Thursday by clinching a new deal with the EU, even though the bloc had promised it would never reopen a treaty it agreed last year. Yet Johnson, the face of the Brexit campaign in the

2016 referendum, must now ratify the deal in the British parliament where he has no majority and opponents are plotting maximum political damage ahead of an imminent election.

The numbers are too close to call: Johnson must garner 318 votes in the 650-seat parliament to get a deal approved. Yet his Northern Irish allies are opposed to a deal and the three main opposition parties have pledged to vote it down.

"We've got a great new deal that takes back control now parliament should get Brexit done on Saturday,"

Fastest ant found in Sahara

It's official: The Saharan silver ant is the fastest of the world's 12,000 known ant species, clocking a blistering 855 millimetres -- nearly a metre -- per second, researchers said Thursday.

Measured another way, the six-legged sprinter covers 108 times its own body length per second, a feat topped only by two other creatures, the Australian tiger beetle and the California coastal mite.

To run 100 times his body length as quickly, the fastest man in the world, Usain Bolt, would need to sprint the 200-metre dash in less than a second.

Making the exploit even more remarkable, the Saharan silver hits top speed racing at midday across desert sands that reach 60 degrees Celsius (140 degrees Fahrenheit), the researchers reported in the Journal of Experimental Biology.

One arrested, over rape

A man was arrested yesterday for allegedly raping a college girl, while another was sent to jail on Thursday night on charge of raping his stepdaughter.

RISING DEFAULTS ON LOANS

another jailed IMF raises alarm

The rising defaults on loans poses the biggest risk for the Bangladesh economy that stands to grow at a remarkable pace, said the International Monetary Fund yesterday, raising the urgency level for the government to address the banking sector's ills.

"Now is the time to start a reform programme in the financial sector of Bangladesh," Anne-Marie Gulde-Wolf, deputy director of IMF's Asia Pacific Department (APD) told a press briefing during the World Bank-IMF's annual meeting here in the American capital.

As of June, the total defaulted loans in the banking sector was Tk 112,425 crore, up 19.71 percent from December last year, according to data from Bangladesh Bank.

"The percentage of defaulted loans in Bangladesh is around 11 percent. This means a good amount of fund was not paid back to the banking sector. For this reason, the country's private sector is not getting required loans,"

The high level of defaulted loans is "a very big issue" for Bangladesh and the trend will have to be arrested to ensure future growth, she said.

Gulde-Wolf particularly singled out the state banks, which are saddled with high levels of defaulted loans.

"This has narrowed their capacity to give out credit to businesses," she said, while calling for an urgent improvement in corporate governance in state banks.

The authorities concerned of Bangladesh should start working on modernising the financial sector, she said, adding, "A modern financial sector will help banks disburse their credit evenly to economically reliable sectors."

Gulde-Wolf also said economic reforms were essential to make the Bangladesh economy more vibrant and ensure SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

Air raids, shelling test Syria 'truce'

Air raids and shelling could be heard at the Syrian-Turkish border yesterday morning despite a five-day ceasefire agreed between Turkey and the United States, and Washington said the deal covered only a small part of the territory Ankara aims to seize.

Reuters journalists at the border heard machine-gun fire and shelling and saw smoke rising from the Syrian border

battlefield city of Ras al Ain, although the sounds of fighting had subsided by midmorning.

The truce, announced on Thursday by US Vice President Mike Pence after talks in Ankara with Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan, sets out a five-day pause to let the Kurdish-led SDF militia withdraw from an area controlled by Turkish forces.
