Young Elephants face Mohun Bagan today

Tournament favourites Mohun Bagan will play against unfancied Young Elephants FC of Laos in the only match of the second day of the Sheikh Kamal International Club Cup today.

The second match of the tournament as well as of Group B will get underway at the MA Aziz Stadium in Chattogram at 7:00pm.

Kolkata giants Mohun Bagan have come to Bangladesh after two decades.

The club do not boast national players of the India team like the past, but they have brought an almost full-strength side with six foreign players and see this tournament as the perfect platform for the I-League, which starts in the first week of November.

While there are no Indian national team players in the team currently, the six foreigners including five Spaniards and

one Trinidadian make them one of the strongest teams in the competition.

Coach Kibu Vicuna is confident his side can lift the title despite it being a pre-season tournament for them.

"We have come here to do our best. We are trying to create a good team. Even though it is part of preparation for I-League, our target is to lift the trophy," the Spaniard said during a pre-tournament press conference on Friday.

As the name suggests, Young Elephants are a very young team. Having been established only four years ago, they boast a squad with an average age of 21. The team has not yet played any international tournament.

"We have only four national team players. We play the premier League without any foreign players. We are all very excited and we will try to do our best," said Young Elephants coach V Sarvaraj.

Mohun Bagan next face TC Sports Club on October 22, before facing Chattogram Abahani on October 24.

Bayern held by last-gasp Finnbogason

Bayern Munich were denied top spot in the Bundesliga when Alfred Finnbogason's injury-time equaliser snatched Augsburg a 2-2 draw on Saturday.

Niko Kovac's men sit one point adrift of both leaders Borussia Moenchengladbach and second-placed Wolfsburg, who drew 1-1 at RB Leipzig.

It was the second league match in succession that reigning champions Bayern had slipped up, having lost 2-1 at home to Hoffenheim in their last outing.

Augsburg opened the scoring in stunning fashion, Marco Richter finding the net just 30 seconds after kick-off, the fastest goal of the season so far.

Bayern replied as Robert Lewandowski stretched his scoring streak to eight games in the 14th minute from a Serge Gnabry cross and Gnabry then threaded the needle in the 49th minute to put Bayern 2-1 ahead.

But a strong run in injury time by Sergio Cordova set up Finnbogason, who put another early dent in Bayern's title defence.

Immobile completes comeback

Serie A leading scorer Ciro Immobile's late brace of penalties helped Lazio wipe out a three-goal deficit in a thrilling 3-3 draw with Atalanta on Saturday, as Arkadiusz Milik's double helped Napoli beat Verona to close in on the top three.

Atalanta had led 3-0 with 21 minutes to go at the Stadio Olimpico.

But Immobile scored from the spot on 69 minutes and less than 60 seconds later set up Joaquin Correa for the second, before capping the comeback two minutes into injury time with his ninth goal in eight league games this term.

Murray nears first title since 2017

Former world number one Andy Murray reached his first semifinal since the 2017 French Open with a battling three-set win over Romania's Marius Copil in a European Open encounter in Antwerp on Friday.

The 32-year-old British star, steadily rebuilding his career after major hip surgery earlier this year, defeated qualifier Copil 6-3, 6-7 (7/9), 6-4.

"I feel OK, it's more how you pull up the following day," said Murray, who is two wins away from a first title since Dubai in March 2017.

"The good thing about the indoor matches is that the points are fairly short so it doesn't take as much out of you as on some of the slower courts outside."

Murray, now ranked a lowly 243 in the world, had the chance to wrap up the quarterfinal when he had a match point in the second set tiebreak.

He eventually sealed victory after more than two and a half hours on court with an ace for his third win in three meetings against the 92nd-ranked Copil.

Murray goes on to face France's world number 70 Ugo Humbert who put out Argentine fifth seed Guido Pella 5-7, 6-4, 6-4.

Sharma continues fine run against SA

Opener Rohit Sharma hit his third century of the series to lead India's charge after they lost early wickets against South Africa on day one of the third Test yesterday.

Sharma, on 117, combined with Ajinkya Rahane, on 83, to put on an unbeaten 185-run stand after the hosts were wobbling at 39-3 following their decision to bat first in Ranchi.

India reached 224 for three when bad light stopped play in the final session.

Sharma and Rahane ensured that India, who have already taken an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series, denied the opposition bowlers any wickets after lunch.

Kagiso Rabada got two early scalps in a fiery morning spell and fellow paceman Anrich Nortje claimed his maiden Test wicket after he trapped India skipper Virat Kohli lbw for 12.

Proteas captain Faf du Plessis had deputy Temba Bavuma call the toss in an effort to change his side's fortunes but South Africa went on to lose its 10th successive coin flip in Asian Tests.

Sharma, who hit twin centuries in his debut game as an opening batsman at the start of the series, then steadied the innings along with Rahane, who completed his 21st Test fifty. Sharma played it cool to fifty then soon launched an attack with a barrage of sixes, reaching his sixth Test hundred with his fourth hit over the fence.

India sans Kohli in BD T20 series

India captain Virat Kohli will be missing the three-match T20I series against Bangladesh, scheduled to begin on November 3.

The right-handed batsman will reportedly take a break to manage his workload as he has been playing non-stop since the ODIs against Australia in March.

"Yes, he will skip the T20 series as he has been playing non-stop and needs a break considering that he has been part of the Australia series, IPL, World Cup, tour of West Indies and now the series against South Africa. Managing the play's workload, especially those playing all formats, is something that is a priority with this team to ensure that they are on the top of their game at all times," a source told IANS.

However, the 30-year old will be back for the following two-match Test series against the Tigers.

Chelsea, City win as Spurs slip again

Manchester City brushed aside in-form Crystal Palace 2-0 on Saturday while Tottenham narrowly avoided an embarrassing home defeat to bottom club Watford on a night that saw Chelsea and Leicester win.

Pep Guardiola's defending champions travelled to Palace with questions over their ability to sustain a title challenge after two defeats in four league games but produced some incisive football to narrow the gap to Premier League leaders Liverpool to five points.

City were rewarded for their dominance in the 39th minute when Bernardo Silva whipped in a left-footed cross. Gabriel Jesus shaped to head the ball but it came off his shoulder and crept into the net off the far post past a rooted Wayne Hennessey. They doubled their lead just two minutes later following a speedy counter-attack, culminating in David Silva's goal.

Liverpool travel to Old Trafford on Sunday, chasing a record-equalling 18th consecutive Premier League win while United are just one point above the relegation zone.

Earlier, Chelsea's Marcus Alonso broke the deadlock for Frank Lampard's side at Stamford Bridge against Newcastle for a 1-0 win while Youri Tielemans sealed a 2-1 victory for Leicester over Burnley at the King Power Stadium.

But Spurs boss Mauricio Pochettino saw his side labour to a 1-1 draw at home to Watford, following a 3-0 thrashing at Brighton and a 7-2 humiliation at home to Bayern Munich.

Spurs, who reached the Champions League final in June, have now won just three of their opening 12 games in all competitions and appear unable to find their spark.

Leicester are third in the table, seven points behind leaders Liverpool, while Chelsea, also on 17 points, were fourth.
