The conclave was inaugurated by Meher Afroz Chumki, member of parliament and chairperson of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Women and Children Affairs. Harry Verweij, ambassador of Netherlands; Maya Vandenent, health chief of Unicef Bangladesh; Professor Abdul Mannan, director at Directorate of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education; Dr Abul Hossain, project director of Multi-sectoral Programme on gender-based violence; Mushfiqua Zaman Satiar, senior advisor (SRHR & Gender) at Netherlands embassy, and Barrister Sara Hossain, executive director at BLAST, attended the programme among representatives from different

national and international organisations and youth leaders.

The conclave informed that the UBR project has been working with adolescents and youths since 2011 to ensure access to SRHR information and services. From the very beginning, the project is striving to realise this objective through providing comprehensive sexuality education and youth friendly services to 10-24 year-olds, with support from the government and development partners. In this context, the conclave was a step in advocacy for spreading the UBR model across the country.

While inaugurating the event, Meher Afroz Chumki said the government is establishing clubs for adolescents in all upazilas. She indicated her commitment towards integrating UBR's beneficiaries in those clubs.

6-century old inscription

600-year-old Manda Masjid which used to stand there was lost in time. Matiur Rahman Bepary, another descendant, revealed, "Years ago, the mosque was irreparably damaged. After that, it was rebuilt following the trending design of the time, and in 2009, it was further modernised."

Every historic feature of the structure -- its antique design and wall decorations made of valuable stones, its dome, and even its name - has been erased. There is no way one can infer that a centuries-old mosque used to stand there going by the current structure.

Only one piece of evidence of its existence remains: the tablet with the inscription, which is still conserved at the National Museum. The authorities recovered the tablet from Manda before 1965, when Dhaka Museum was in Nimtoli.

The black basalt tablet, which contains four lines in Arabic, mentions Sultan Jalal al-Din Muhammad Shah. Jalal al-Din was a Sultan of Bengal in the 15th century. He ruled for 16 years in two periods -- from 1415 to 1416, and then from 1418 to 1433.

The first two lines of the inscription praise God and his messenger. "The mosque was built in the name of the sultan," reads the third line.

The final line reads, "Muzaffar Muhammad Shah al-Sultan; may Allah perpetuate his kingdom and sovereignty. [Built by] Ulug Khan Muazzam Dinar Khan...Shiqdar of Affairs Nayk Muhammad copied [it] on Jumad-al-Awwal, 836 AH (January 3, 1433)."

Bengal grew in wealth and population during Jalal's reign. He had commissioned construction of many mosques and buildings, combining Bengali and Islamic

architecture. He died in 1433 and was buried at Eklakhi Mausoleum in Pandua of India's West Bengal. The year of his death coinciding with that of the structure's construction indicates that Manda Masjid was possibly built to mark his

demise. As the centuries passed by, Jalal's kingdom was gone, his structures demolished, and his name gradually became obscure. Only some vestiges, like the tablet and his tomb, are left to remind us of a ruler who was once considered to be the greatest of all greats.

He said the circular enclosure lacked the required slope around its banks so that the gharials can bask.

The enclosure has a circular sand covered island in the middle, but it gets submerged in water in rainy season -- making it difficult for the gharial to lay eggs and hatch them, he said.

The zoo in-charge Dr Farhad said the enclosure also lacks facilities of extraction of excess water. He said the zoo authorities began pumping out extra water from the enclosure after they found the eggs were being damaged.

Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, IUCN Country Director Raquibul Amin said, "Our experts are inexperienced, but they are working towards success."

maintenance and public awareness are the key reasons behind failure of this initiative.

Talking to the news agency, Prof Nazrul Islam, a renowned urban expert, said the situation is getting worse gradually for lack of good governance and irresponsible attitude of the city corporations. He said people are also not aware and

they throw waste everywhere without thinking about its negative impact. "If you look around, you'll find trash everywhere. We must raise awareness among people to change their habit." Stating that littering is a social crime

which affects the environment, Nazrul said the government should enforce law and fine those who litter. Also, shop owners have to keep their premises clean. "This problem does not exist in the cantonment area as people there obey the

law and are aware of the adverse effects of littering," he said. Environment activist and architect Iqbal Habib said littering is considered a crime and people responsible for it are fined in

many cities across the world. The authorities concerned should make it a social crime and penalise people for committing the crime, he added.

Habib said though the two mayors promised to turn Dhaka into a clean and beautiful city, the capital has become an ugly one. "The mayors did not take any well-planned measure or build durable infrastructures to resolve the problem."

He said there are no trash bins within two-three kilometre areas along the road to dump waste. "In Singapore, you'll find

three-four bins within a half kilometer area with warnings of being fined... We need such a system."

He said the city corporations installed faulty and unsuitable trash bins in an unplanned way that is why those were either stolen or got damaged. "Durable trash bins were set up at Hatirjheel in a planned way several years back and all of those still remain intact." Habib said local community must

be involved with the efforts to address the problem. "A community's problem should be resolved with participation of its members. We can create volunteers in every area who will detect people involved in such bad practice and make them aware." Poribesh Bachao Andolon (Poba)

Chairman Abu Naser Khan said littering is largely a cultural problem. He said it is the main responsibility of the city corporations to keep the city clean, but they are not playing their due role in this regard. "Our government, city corporations and

other authorities concerned don't consider littering a serious problem. That is why this problem is persisting and worsening," said the Poba chairperson.

Bangladesh Poribesh Andolon (Bapa) General Secretary MA Matin said, "Littering is a serious problem in Dhaka as it's an over populated city, with number of its residents growing day by day. But no effective step has been taken to address the issue."

Matin said littering is not only ruining the beauty of the capital, but also causing air, soil and water pollution. "This issue needs to be taken seriously by both the authorities and city dwellers," he stressed.
