ETO'O RULES OUT CAREER IN POLITICS

Samuel Eto'o is up there with George Weah as an African great on the football field, but he says he has no plans to follow the Liberian into politics "for the moment". "Everyone wants me to go into politics, but there won't be 10 million Weahs," Eto'o said in an exclusive interview with AFP. Weah, the only African player to win the Ballon d'Or, became president of Liberia in January 2018. "Éveryone is born with their own star. Everyone at some point gets involved in politics at their own level, but, for the moment, it doesn't interest me." The 38-year-old Cameroon legend recently brought the curtain down on a glittering playing career during which he won the UEFA Champions League twice with Barcelona and once more with Inter Milan.

Hosts take on Terengganu in final today

The general perception of the rising stature of Bangladesh as a footballing nation and the participation of three Indian teams has piqued the interest of even the casual fans, with the India versus Bangladesh rivalry working as an X factor.

After 14 matches and 56 goals, a few controversies here and there amid mostly entertaining football, the two teams still standing are Chattogram Abahani and Terengganu FC.

Both teams have shown attacking prowess, but also defensive frailties as this has been a high-scoring tournament so far. Chattogram Abahani have conceded six goals against 11 scored while Terengganu have scored 13 goals against seven

There is very little to choose from between the two sides at this stage, but Terengganu coach Nafuzi Bin Mohamad Zain believes that an extra day's rest as well as the home support make the home side the favourites.

"It will not be easy to play against the hosts but I'm hoping for a good performance. The home team are favourites because they have home crowd, better


Chattogram Abahani are aware of the season for Abahani. While the hosts have plans for the Englishman, they have also worked out the other sources of danger.

The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has ordered 72 SG pink balls to be delivered by next week for use in the first-ever day/night Test between Bangladesh and India at the Eden Gardens in Kolkata from November 22.

BCCI President Sourav Ganguly previously confirmed that SG pink balls would be used in the match and SG Sales and Marketing Director Paras Anand confirmed the order was placed.

The Indian domestic limited-overs Duleep Trophy was played with Kookaburra pink balls for three seasons before the BCCI returned to the red ball this year.

The SG ball had come under fire from some Indian players in the previous domestic season, with captain Virat Kohli saying it got scuffed up too early in comparison to the Dukes used in England and Kookaburra in Australia.

However, Anand was confident that top-quality balls would be delivered for the Kolkata Test. Compared to the red ball, the pink one attracts a lot more dust and tends to get dirty rather quickly, making it tougher to see.

Pak whitewash BD women

The Bangladesh women's cricket team were whitewashed in a three-match T20I series against their Pakistani counterparts as the visitors were handed a 28-run defeat in the final match at the Gaddafi Stadium in Lahore yesterday.

Electing to bat first, a 48-ball 54 from opener Javeria Khan and another 29-ball 31 from Umaima Sohail helped Pakistan post 117 for seven in 20 overs. Right-arm seamer Jahanara Alam was the pick of the bowlers for Bangladesh, returning figures of three for 12 in her four overs.

Following the exchange, only three batters could get into double figures, with a team high 44-ball 30 coming from Nigar Sultana's bat, as Bangladesh could only manage 89 for eight in 20 overs.

BCCI orders 72 pink balls Messi back to his best



Lionel Messi made it clear he is fit and back to his scintillating best by tearing apart Real Valladolid on Laliga Tuesday in a thumping 5-1 victory for Barcelona.

Messi scored another spell-binding free-kick at Camp Nou after his sumptuous pass had already teed up Arturo Vidal for Barca's second. He then drove home his second late on before sliding through Luis Suarez to make it five.

Yet in truth his two goals and two assists were just the start of it, the defining moments of another mesmeric all-round performance that was dotted with flicks, passes and dribbles, not to mention two humiliating nutmegs. "I don't know what more I can say,"

said Barcelona coach Ernesto Valverde. "There were wonders coming out

of his foot," said Valladolid's Michel. You can only applaud and enjoy it."

Valladolid had threatened to make a game of it when Kiko Olivas benefitted from a rare Marc-Andre ter Stegen error to equalise, after Clement Lenglet had struck in the second minute.

But with Messi in this sort of mood, the result never felt in doubt as victory sent Barcelona back to the top of La Liga, after Atletico Madrid were held to a 1-1 draw by Alaves a couple of hours

Valverde's side have now won seven consecutive matches in all

competitions, a run that began by beating Villarreal on September 24, when Messi returned from injury to make his first start of the season.

Valladolid were perhaps unfortunate the 32-year-old was fresh after the postponed Clasico on Saturday meant Barcelona and Real Madrid were given the weekend off.

It meant this was the first game at Camp Nou since violent protests broke out across Catalonia after nine proindependence leaders were sentenced

to imprisonment on October 21.

Giant yellow banners 'Independencia' and 'Llibertat' written across them were unfurled before kickoff but there was no sign of unrest. Instead, the mood turned celebratory as Messi got to work.

It was his free-kick that Valladolid made a mess of clearing, as Sergi Guardiola lashed the ball against Joaquin Fernandez and Lenglet reacted fastest, his shot deflecting in before two minutes were on the clock.

KEY PLAYERS

TERENGGANU FC

ANDREW LEE TUCK The English forward has been the driving force behind Terengganu FC's run to the final. With six goals including two hattricks in the last two matches, the 31-year-old is top of the goal-scorer's



chart. But scoring is not his only quality, the former Abahani forward contributes as much in building attacks and setting up goals. He is by far the biggest contender for the player-of-the-tournament award.

SYAFIK BIN ISMAIL Syafik Bin Ismail is a pocket dynamo for Terengganu FC. Despite often finding himself under the shadow by the looming presence of Andre Lee Tuck and centre-forward Bruno Suzuki, this 18-year-



old forward managed to catch attention with his sublime dribbling skills, giving a hard time to the opposition defences. He is also adept in scoring as his goal gave Terengganu FC the lead against Mohun Bagan in the semifinals.

The Brazilian-born Japanese striker is a true centre-forward, always on the prowl. He knows where he needs to be at the right time and finishes off his chances with great accuracy. He scored four goals in the first



match of his team, and despite going goalless since, earned a valuable spot-kick in the crucial semifinal against Mohun Bagan.

CHATTOGRAM ABAHANI

JAMAL BHUIYAN The Chattogram Abahani skipper was part of the team back in 2017 as well. Jamal has scored in that semifinal defeat against Pocheon FC of South Korea. Now Jamal is a more matured player and a leader. He scored



one goal, but was involved in a few other goals as he and his role has changed from a pure defensive midfielder to an attacking one. His set-pieces have improved too, and he has already bagged two player-of-the-match awards.

CHINEDU MATTHEW The Nigerian striker has been the most consistent performer, not only for his side, but also in the whole tournament. He scored two goals in the first game and followed it up with another in the second. The



Nigerian was not on target in the third game where he played only last 30 minutes, but came to his side's rescue by scoring the extra-time winner in the semifinal against Gokulam Kerala.

JEAN CHARLES DIDIER The Ivorian attacking midfielder was an unknown quantity in Bangladesh football. But he has already become the engine of Chattogram Abahani team, with opposition coaches keeping a close eye on him. The



Ivorian scored one goal in group stages but showed his true class with a two-goal haul in the semifinal against Gokulam Kerala. He makes a deadly attacking combination with Jamal and the dynamic duo could decide the outcome of the final.
