

Wait now gets even longer

Authorities seek to push deadline by one and a half years

People's wait for the Padma bridge is going to get longer as the authorities now seek to extend the deadline for one and a half years.

The new deadline to complete the work will be June 2021; currently it is December this year. This is the fourth time the deadline is being changed. However, the authorities did not seek escalation of the project cost, which is Tk 30,193 crore, officials said.

The Bridges Division, the implementing authority of the project, in September sent a proposal to the planning ministry, seeking extension of time. And the Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation Division (IMED), after a recent spot visit recommended the time extension with some

Toll rises to 7; boy, 13, may not see again; another, 6, lost an arm SHAHEEN MOLLAH and MUNTAKIM SAAD

Rupnagar cylinder blast has changed the lives of Bishwajit Chandra Das, 13, and Sadikur, 6, forever.

Bishwajit does not know whether he would be able to see again. His eyes were damaged by splinters. And Sadikur lost his right arm and received serious injuries to his left.

Families of other victims have also been devastated.

Bishwajit was taken to National Institute of Ophthalmology and Hospital yesterday morning with bandages on his eyes.

Doctors operated on his eyes but didn't tell family members what they could expect. His mother Jhuma Rani Das, a garment

worker, said, "All of my dreams have shattered." Jhuma said Bishwajit came to Dhaka

from their home in Sunamganj two months ago and worked at a sweatshop.

"My salary is about Tk 9,000 and my son earned Tk 3,500," said Jhuma, who raised her son alone since she was divorced by her husband years ago.

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld the death sentence of top Jamaat-e-Islami leader ATM Azharul Islam for his involvement in genocide and crimes against humanity during the 1971 Liberation War.

A four-member bench of the SC's Appellate Division, headed by Chief Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain, delivered the verdict around five years after the International Crimes Tribunal-1 handed down capital punishment to Azhar for the crimes committed in Rangpur.

29 cases still pending with the top court

Some 29 appeals filed by the convicted war criminals against their death sentences are still pending with the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court.

The division has so far disposed of only eight such appeals, including the one filed by ATM Azharul Islam, in the last six years.

Falu's properties Councillor Manju held for extortion

Local traders distribute sweets in celebration

Rab yesterday arrested Dhaka South City Corporation ward councillor Mainul Haque Manju at his office for his alleged involvement in extortion and recovered firearms and narcotics in his possession.

Manju, councillor of ward-39, was arrested in a case filed on Wednesday over demanding Tk 2 lakh from a trader at the capital's

Rajdhani Super Market, said Rab-3 Commanding Officer Lt Col Shafee Bulbul, adding that the councillor had long been running an extortion racket in the area. "He amassed crores of taka from extortion, grabbing

properties of others, and expanding his activities," the Rab CO said, adding that he used to send the money to his family in the USA through Hundi (an illegal non-banking channel). Rab said they found two firearms, some bottles of liquor,

pills in the ward councillor's office. His office is in the same building in which a Rab-3 office is located. The councillor could not show any valid documents of

The Anti-Corruption Commission has opened an investigation into the wealth of Bangladeshis who played in the casinos of Singapore in the last five vears.

The move came as part of an ongoing anticorruption campaign, which saw the rounding up of several people involved in illegal casino business in the country.

Seeking details of the Bangladeshi gamblers, the ACC wrote to the Corrupt **Practices Investigation** Bureau of Singapore on Wednesday, an official told The Daily Star on condition of anonymity.

"An investigation has revealed that a number of people have laundered their ill-gotten money to different countries including Singapore,"
