Messi returns for Argentina after ban

Lionel Messi was called up by Argentina on Thursday for friendly games against Brazil and Uruguay next month, the country's football association announced on Twitter.

The striker has not played for Argentina since he was sent off against Chile in their victorious third-place play-off match in the Copa America on July 7.

The striker was then handed a three-month suspension for comments he made after the game, in which he accused CONMEBOL, the governing body of South American football, of corruption.

In-form Manchester City forward Sergio Aguero has been recalled after missing out on the last four friendlies, while Manchester United defender Marcos Rojo remains in the squad following his surprise recall after the Copa America.

In Messi's absence, Argentina have played four friendlies, drawing against Chile (0-0) and Germany (2-2) while thrashing Mexico 4-0 and Ecuador 6-1.

They face Brazil in Saudi Arabia on November 15 and then Uruguay in Israel on November 18. Messi's ban ends on November 3.

The five-time Ballon d'Or winner has endured an injury-hit start to the season after hurting his foot in August and then

his thigh in September.

But his recovery has coincided with a return to form for Barcelona, who have won their last seven consecutive games in all competitions. Messi scored twice in a 5-1 win over Real Valladolid on Tuesday.

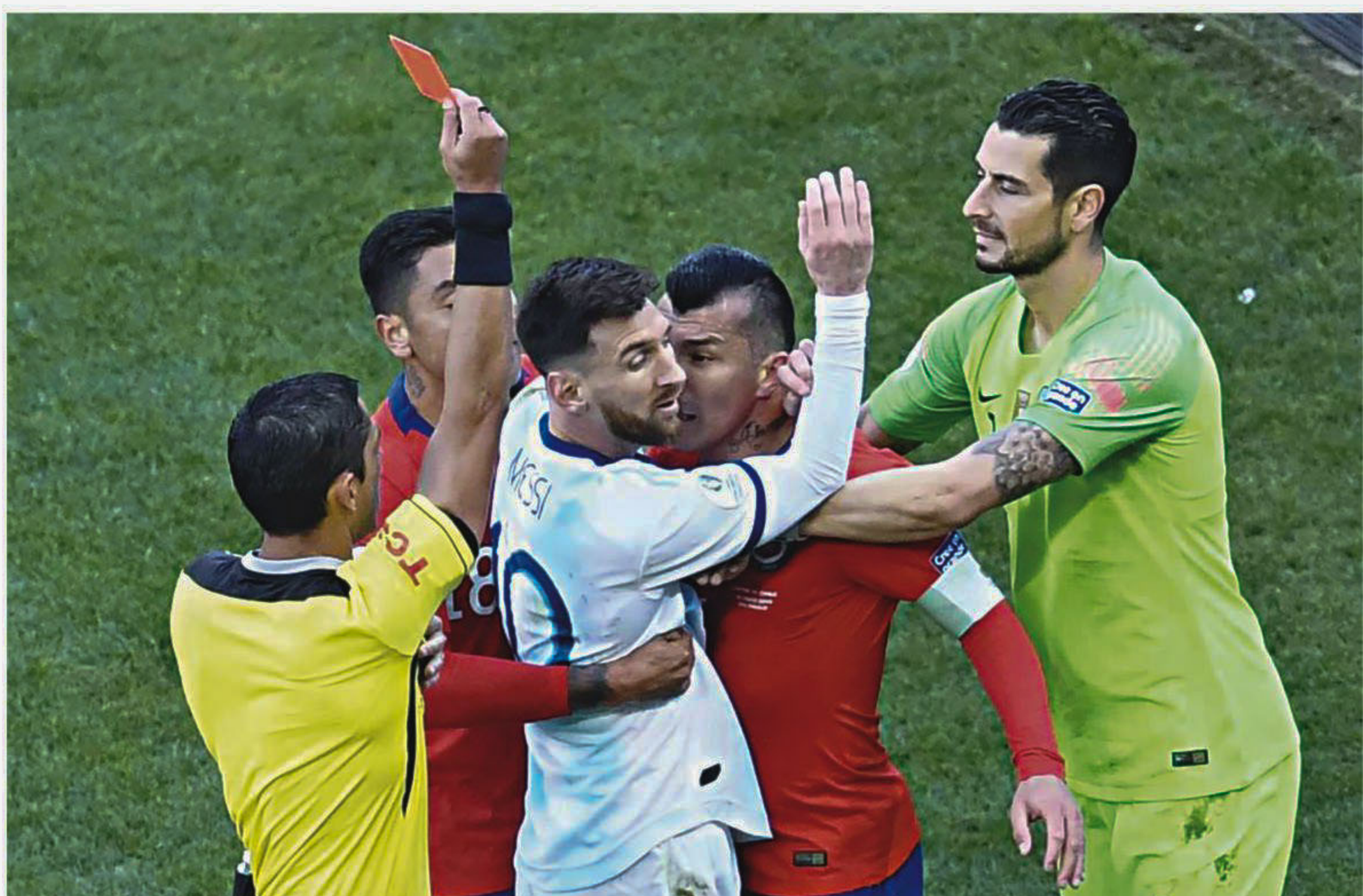

Nadal eases past Wawrinka

Rafael Nadal and Novak Djokovic continued their battle for the year-end world number one ranking on Thursday as both players reached the Paris Masters quarterfinals with wins over Stan Wawrinka and Kyle Edmund respectively.

The 33-year-old Nadal is already guaranteed to usurp Djokovic at the rankings summit next week, but winning a maiden Bercy title would also secure the year-end top spot before next month's ATP Tour Finals in London.

He produced an impressive display to take his career head-to-head record against three-time Grand Slam champion Wawrinka to 19-3 with a clinical 6-4, 6-4 victory.

Djokovic had earlier booked his last-eight place with a 7-6 (9/7), 6-1 win over Britain's Edmund.

Nadal has never won the Paris Masters or the ATP Finals and only two of his 84 titles have come indoors.

"That's the beautiful thing about this sport, (to) have the capacity to adapt yourself

to the different conditions," said the 12-time French Open winner, who called the doctor onto the court in the second set to help deal with a stomach problem.

Nadal will face 2008 champion Jo-Wilfried Tsonga in the quarterfinals after the French wildcard saved two match points to edge out Germany's Jan-Lennard Struff 2-6, 6-4, 7-6 (8/6).

"I have a match against a player that is playing well," said Nadal. "I need to do a lot of things well, but I hope to be ready to make that happen."

Nadal took the first set thanks to a single break of serve in game three, saving break points in the second and eighth games himself before serving it out in style.

Wawrinka's backhand started to fire at the start of the second set, but Nadal kept the Swiss at bay, helped by one incredible forehand winner to direct a smash from his opponent into the corner of the court.

The 19-time Grand Slam champion saw off Wawrinka's challenge with a break to lead 5-4 in the second set and served out the match to make it his seventh Paris Masters quarterfinal in as many appearances.

Murshed denies anomalies

Although the Bangladesh Tennis Federation (BTF) can barely stage domestic tournaments on a regular basis, the game's local governing body manages to stage International Tennis Federation (ITF) and Asian Tennis Federation (ATF) sanctioned tournaments routinely with the playoff phase of the Bangladesh ITF Junior (U-18) Tennis Championships set to get underway at the National Tennis Complex in Ramna today.

However, the alleged financial anomalies found on BTF General Secretary Golam Murshed are being discussed more than the tournament itself, where upwards of 100 tennis players are set to participate.

The treasurer of the BTF ad-hoc committee, Sheikh Mohammad Aslam, brought up the financial irregularities he found against Murshed, who allegedly pocketed Tk 72,000 from the federation's rooms and rent budget and also tried to withdraw more money to pay unauthorised employees.

"The federation has a monthly expenditure of Tk 1.52 lakh for its employees but Mr Murshed suddenly asked me to sign a check of Tk 1.97 lakh, but I opposed it because he did not take any approval from the executive committee to appoint anyone," alleged Aslam.

"Ask him why he did not deposit the rooms' and shop rent worth Tk 72,000 to the federation account," said Aslam, adding that he was going to resign because he does not want to stay in 'such an unhealthy environment'.

"He [Murshed] sent me a letter asking me to resign because I am not helping him and trying to degrade the image of the country. I don't know whether he has any right to ask me to resign

from the post. I will talk to my lawyer as I feel dishonoured," said the former national footballer.

It was also learned that Murshed withdrew Tk 2.58 lakh from the federation's account on the ground that it was to cover the expenses of the BTF president, state minister for youth and sports and himself for their trip to England, where they attended a Wimbledon match in July.

Additionally, office executive Mahmud Alam, who has been involved with the federation since 1997, was terminated in August because he was not helping the federation, disobeying instructions from the general secretary, violating the laws of accommodation and trying to influence the higher-ups.

Mahmud had apparently refused to sign any final documents put forward by the general secretary as Murshed allegedly went against the norms. The federation also drove out caretaker Abdul Latif from his accommodations within the federation.

With Alam and Latif displaced, the career of Latif's son, under-14 champion Mehdi Hasan Alvee, and that of Alam's daughter, under-14 champion Masfia Afrin, are under threat.

However, Murshed has denied all the allegations brought against him.

"All it has done is tarnish my image because we have a small budget which is met through the NSC, sponsors and international organisations and we have every record of our expenditures. You can come and see the documents," said Murshed, who also denied having withdrawn money to watch a Wimbledon match.

In response to a query, Murshed said that Alvee's and Afrin's careers would not be affected by the loss of their accommodations as both of them will still have the opportunity to use the facilities like any other local player.

Chess C'ship from today

The 45th National Chess Championship has been deferred by one day following a dispute between the participating players and organisers over the format of the tournament, which is set to get underway today at the Institution of Engineers in Dhaka.

Last year, the Bangladesh Chess Federation (BCF) opted to change the National Chess Championship format from the traditional round-robin league system to the 10-round Swiss-League system in a bid to give more exposure to junior players. However, a group of players recently demanded that they use an 11-round Swiss League format instead.

To further complicate matters, another group of players, including GM Niaz Murshed, GM Ziaur Rahman, then opposed the BCF's move to the 11-round Swiss League format without informing the players. The BCF then later convinced both factions to begin the league today with the existing 10-round Swiss League system.

"The national championship had before followed the round-robin league system with the participation of some 12 to 16 players but from last year, we have increased the players to make it 30 and introduced a 10-round Swiss League system and all players took part in the championship sans GM Abdullah Al Rakib and GM Enamul Hossain Razib.

"Regarding the issue, we have discussed with both groups and they agreed to play in existing system from tomorrow [today] and they proposed to hold a Super Championship with the top 10 players of the national championship and we have agreed in principle to introduce new a Super Championship from the next edition," said BCF general secretary Syed Shahabuddin Shamim.
