



doors," said Arshedul.

Except on the weekends and public holidays, Mir Arshedul Karim leaves his rented home in Mirpur for Dhaka University every morning, guided by his trusted white cane.

He is an assistant librarian at the DU and a person with a visual impairment. His journey on the 10km route begins with a rickshaw ride. But the real

challenge starts once he joins others waiting for buses at the bus stop. "Buses show little interest in picking me up. Sometimes I have to throw myself into the crowd of passengers to get hold of handles of the bus

Once on the bus, he is faced with a new hurdle: finding a seat in the speeding vehicle driven with hardly any care.

The law provides for designated seats in public transport for physically challenged persons but those are only in name in most cases.

"Often I find non-disabled people sitting in the seats designated for us and I am asked to find another seat," he said. Another big trouble is getting off the bus. Drivers stop vehicles in the

middle of busy roads, showing complete disregard for passengers' lives.

"One day I was about to meet an accident just after the bus dropped me in the middle of the road. A CNG-run three-wheeler ran over my feet," said 43-year-old Arshedul, one of the 16 lakh people who have disabilities of different kinds in the country.

From homes to footpaths, public transports to educational institutions, shopping malls to office buildings, almost everywhere the mobility of Arshedul and other people with disabilities is obstructed.

Roads and footpaths are built and rebuilt. New buses are added to the fleet of private and state-run Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation quite frequently. New wagons are joining the railways. Eye-catching public and private buildings are emerging, changing the skylines of cities.

Yet, for Arshedul and his peers, there is nothing to rejoice. Very few infrastructures could be found in Dhaka and other cities that have been developed taking into account the issue of accessibility SEE PAGE 2 COL 3

Working for strong rural economy

Says PM

Putting emphasis on improving the lifestyle of villagers, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the government was working to make the country's rural economy stronger.

"We want to make the rural economy stronger so that people can earn enough in their own village and make the rural economy more vibrant. We are taking steps keeping that in mind," she said.

The PM was addressing a function, marking the 48th National Cooperatives Day and distribution of the National Cooperatives Award at the capital's Bangabandhu International Conference Centre.

Hasina said people in rural areas would enjoy facilities similar to those provided in urban areas. The government wants to

Human Trafficking Brazil arrests Bangladeshi 'kingpin'

Brazilian federal police said they have arrested Saifullah Al-Mamun, born in Bangladesh and considered by authorities one of the world's most prolific human traffickers.

In an operation

conducted on Thursday after collaboration with US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), Brazilian police arrested members of a group allegedly implicated in a large scheme of smuggling people into the United States.

Several arrests were made in Sao Paulo, where Al-Mamun was living, and in three other Brazilian cities. The police also froze 42 bank accounts it says were used by the group to finance their activities.

Al-Mamun entered Brazil six years ago as a refugee, and was living in Bras, a diverse neighborhood in Sao Paulo that is home to immigrants SEE PAGE 2 COL 2

Recalling our four national heroes


On this day 44 years ago, they were shot dead after brutal bayonet charge inside jail



Syed Nazrul Islam was the acting president of the Mujibnagar Government and a cabinet member of the AL government after independence. He played a pivotal role in the historic Six-point Movement and the 1969 Mass Upsurge.



Tajuddin Ahmad was the prime minister of the Mujibnagar Government and a member of the cabinet after independence. One of the founders of Chhatra League and Awami Muslim League, he was a leading figure in all nationalist movements, including the 1952 Language Movement.



Captain M Mansur Ali was the prime minister of the first government under presidential form in Bangladesh. He was the secretary general of BAKSAL and also a key member of the Mujibnagar Government. His role in Six-point Movement was remarkable.



AHM Quamruzzaman was a key member of the Mujibnagar Government. He resigned from the cabinet in 1974 and became the president of the AL. He was the general secretary of the party in 1970.

Wearing Khaki uniforms and carrying Sten guns and SLRs (self-loading rifles), five army personnel arrived at the erstwhile Dhaka central jail around 4:00am on November 3, 1975.

The five, including one who introduced himself as Captain

Muslemuddin attached Bangabhaban, entered the jail and brutally killed four persons, says the FIR filed over the killing of the four national leaders -- Syed Nazrul Islam, Tajuddin Ahmad, AHM

Quamruzzaman and M Mansur Ali. The leaders had been put behind bars soon after the August 15, 1975,

bloodbath that claimed the lives of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and most of his family members.

Rights activists urge people

Freedom of speech is a fundamental human right and its absence turns a human life into an animal's life, rights activists said yesterday.

At a discussion on "Freedom of Speech Under Threat", the speakers, who included lawyers and university teachers, urged everyone to raise their voice in favour of freedom of speech as it underpins the other rights and allows them to flourish.

The right to speak freely plays a vital role in the healthy development of a society, they said at the discussion organised by Moulik Adhikar Suraksha, a platform for rights activists, in the capital's Jatiya Press Club.

"Raise your voice to ensure freedom of speech. If you do not have the right to speak, you will not have any other rights," eminent jurist Shahdeen Malik said while presiding over the discussion.

"In the absence of freedom of expression, our life will turn into that of animals. We were not born in an independent Bangladesh to live like animals."

He pointed out that one of the vital reasons behind the Soviet Union's fall was the absence of freedom of speech. Malik also said that in Bangladesh hurting or maligning

someone's image was still a criminal offence, whereas in most countries it has been a civil offence since the 1900s. Professor CR Abrar, former Dhaka University

international relations, said freedom of expression was the mother of all rights. "Without ensuring it, we cannot express ourselves

AL leader shot dead in Sirajganj

A group of unidentified criminals shot a local Awami League leader dead in Sirajganj yesterday.

The victim -- Bokul Hossain, joint secretary of Bagbati union unit AL -- was returning home around 8:30pm on a motorbike when he was shot, said police.

Rafikul Islam, officerin-charge (investigation) of Sirajganj Sadar Police Station, said the reason behind the murder could not be known immediately but the law enforcers were suspecting that Bokul was killed over previous enmity.
