ASIAN WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL Hosts off to winning start

Hosts Bangladesh made a rousing start to the Bangamata Asian Senior Women's Central Zone Volleyball Championship, beating Afghanistan in straight sets at the Shaheed Suhrawardi Indoor Stadium yesterday.

The Bangladesh team, which has been training for the last three months with this championship and the South Asian Games in sight, had a comfortable outing as they breezed through with a 25-9, 25-9, 25-3 points victory over the Afghans.

Bangladesh attacker Sabina Yasmin was adjudged the best player of the match.

Bangladesh coach Golam Rasul was satisfied with the performance, but felt his side could play better when playing against better oppositions.

"We played well, but we can play even better. We have played against Maldives and Nepal before and those matches have been competitive. Tomorrow's game against Maldives will be a competitive one," the Bangladesh coach said after the match.

Bangladesh men's team coach Alipour Arozi watched the match too and praised the performance of the host team.

Earlier in the day, Maldives edged past Kyrgyzstan by 3-2 sets in the opening match of the championship. Bangladesh had lost against the Kyrgyz in a practice match ahead of the championship.

Bangladesh will take on Maldives while Afghanistan will square off against Nepal in the two matches today. The top two teams after the round-robin league will meet in the final on November 14.

Sana to spearhead hopes in SA Games

Ruman Sana, the best archer of Bangladesh, said he is confident of delivering gold to the nation in the upcoming South Asian Games to repay the faith of the Bangladesh Archery Federation (BAF) and the support provided by the City Group.

The 24-year-old recurve archer, who qualified for the 2020 Olympics with a bronze-medal winning feat in the World Archery Championships in the Netherlands before winning gold medal in Stage 3 of the Asia Cup – both this year – wants to end the year on a high by adding an SA Games gold medal to his tally.

"All's well that ends well. I would really like to end the year on a high with a good performance at the SA Games after the achievements earlier in the year," Sana told reporters at the Bangladesh Olympic Association following a programme organised by sponsors City Group regarding the third-year budget disclosure of the company's sponsorship deal with BAF.

The archer from Khulna said he and the other Bangladeshi archers are much more improved than before, which is why they are confident of success in the SA

Games, which will be held in Nepal from December 1 to 10.

"I know the Indian archers who will play there and I also know their score updates. I have compared my scores to theirs'. This will be my first South Asian Games. My target is to go to the final, and if I can reach the final, I believe I can win gold medal," Sana said.

BAF's general secretary Kazi Rajib Uddin Ahmed Chapol echoed Sana's sentiment, saying that they expect two or more gold medals from the SA Games.

"In earlier editions, SA Games was not on our priority list. But this time we are prepared for the games and we are hoping to get at least two, maybe more, in recurve and compound events," Chapol told reporters.

Bangladesh had won three silver and three bronze medals in the last edition of the SA Games held in India in 2016.

Earlier, City Group's executive director Zafar Uddin Siddiqui highlighted various aspects of their sponsorship over the last two years and subsequent achievements of the archers. He also disclosed a Tk 2.41 crore budget for archery sponsorship – an increase of Tk 21 lacs from the previous year – for the third year of the five-year deal.

Liverpool's biggest test

Liverpool have lived through many false dawns in the 29 years since last lifting a league title, but the class of 2019/20 have the chance to prove they are the real deal when reigning champions Manchester City visit Anfield on Sunday.

City's relentless hunger to push the bar to new heights under Pep Guardiola has kept Liverpool waiting.

Despite posting the third highest points tally in English top flight history last season with 97, Liverpool lost out by a solitary point as City backed up their 100-point campaign with 98 to retain the title.

Beset by defensive injuries, those standards have slipped slightly at the

start of this season, allowing Jurgen Klopp's men to open up a six-point lead ahead of Sunday's battle between the top two.

"Last season we won the Premier League (against) the best contender I ever faced in my career," said Guardiola on Friday.

"Right now Liverpool are the strongest team in the world. Playing at Anfield, we know what it means for them and for all their rivals."

Revitalised since Klopp took charge four years ago, Liverpool have not lost a home game in the Premier League since April 2017.

Their solitary defeat in the last 50 league games on any ground came away to City in January in a titanic tussle that ultimately decided the title race.

The consistency of both sides has

seen this fixture become English football's biggest game in recent seasons.

In 2017/18 it was Liverpool who ended City's quest for an unbeaten league season and thrashed Guardiola's men 5-1 on aggregate in an ill-tempered Champions League quarterfinal.

"It's getting bigger and bigger," said Klopp.

"Man City is a pretty good football team. Thank God there is a rivalry because that means we are not in bad place as well."

While City have suffered shock defeats to Norwich and Wolves in the first 11 games of the season, Liverpool have had the air of champions in recent weeks with their ability to fight to the end for their rewards.

Wenger contradicts Bayern's claim

Arsene Wenger has contradicted a claim by Bayern Munich that they turned him down for the vacant head coach's job and accused the defending German champions of a lack of discretion.

Bayern need a new coach after Niko Kovac was sacked last Sunday with former Germany assistant Hansi Flick appointed interim boss for Wednesday's win over Olympiakos and Saturday's home league game against Dortmund.

On Thursday, Bayern put out a statement claiming Wenger had called club chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge to express interest in replacing Kovac, but said the former Arsenal boss had been turned down.

However, Wenger, 70, rejected those version of events and criticised Bayern for leaking "rumours from everywhere".

"My name came out of nowhere," said Wenger in an interview with beIN Sports on Friday.

"On Wednesday, Rummenigge called me, I called back out of courtesy.

"We talked for four or five minutes, maximum, and he reported that they signed Flick (as interim coach) for the next two games.

"He asked me if I would be interested, because they are looking for a coach."

Wenger says he told Rummenigge that he would think about it and "we decided together" to talk again "next week because I am in Doha until Sunday night. This is the true story."

Chelsea up to 2nd; Spurs slip to 12th

Chelsea beat Crystal Palace 2-0 to move up to second in the Premier League on Saturday, while Tottenham's troubles continued with a draw at home to Sheffield United.

League leaders Liverpool host Manchester City in a clash between the champions of Europe and champions of England at Anfield on Sunday.

And Chelsea took advantage of kicking off a day earlier to move a point ahead of City and close to within five of Liverpool with a patient performance to break down a defensively dogged Crystal Palace at Stamford Bridge.

Tammy Abraham moved level with Leicester's Jamie Vardy as the top scorer in the Premier League with 10 goals as the England striker pounced on a deft flick through by William seven minutes into the second half. Christian Pulisic then secured all three points when the American headed home his fifth goal in his last three Premier League games.

"We won relatively comfortably," said Chelsea boss Frank Lampard. "A nice, solid win with a clean sheet."

Tottenham slip to 12th and were lucky to even escape with a 1-1 draw as Sheffield impressed once more to move up to fifth.

John Lundstram struck the post for the visitors with the best effort of the first half, but a rare defensive error from the Blades set up Son Heung-min to open the scoring with his eighth goal of the season just before the hour mark.

David McGoldrick thought he had levelled almost immediately, but after a three-minute delay the goal was ruled out for Lundstram being millimetres offside in the build-up.

To their credit, Chris Wilder's men were not downhearted and survived another VAR review when George Baldock's cross from the right evaded everyone and found the bottom corner.

West Ham's woes continued as Manuel Pellegrini's men were beaten 3-0 at Burnley to stretch their winless streak to seven games.

SOUTH ASIAN KARATE BD fourth among five teams

Hosts Bangladesh finished fourth among five teams in the 5th South Asian Karate Championship, which concluded at the Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmed Indoor Stadium in Dhaka yesterday.

Bangladesh finished with 59 medals – seven gold, 28 silver and 24 bronze – to finish ahead of Bhutan. India clinched the top position with 30 gold, 10 silver and 10 bronze medals. Sri Lanka and Nepal occupied the second and third positions respectively.

No one can buy Mbappe now: Klopp

French star Kylian Mbappe is out of Liverpool's price range, the Premier League leaders' manager and long-time admirer Jurgen Klopp says.

The 20-year-old Paris Saint Germain striker -- who was instrumental in France's lifting of the 2018 World Cup -- has been linked with Real Madrid.

This gathered momentum earlier in the week when Real's coach Zinedine Zidane remarked that Mbappe had always said it was his dream to play for the Spanish side.

Klopp, speaking ahead of Sunday's clash with second-placed Manchester City, had been keen to sign Mbappe in 2017 and met with the player and his entourage.

However, he opted to join PSG for £158 million (\$202 million).

PSG are seeking to extend his

contract and if they were reluctantly to allow him to leave are believed to want more than the record fee of £198 million they paid Barcelona for Neymar in 2017.

"Buying this calibre of player is difficult," Klopp was cited in Saturday's The Times as saying.

"I don't see any club at the moment who can buy Kylian Mbappe from PSG. "I don't see any club. That is how it is. And we are involved in these clubs who cannot do it. Easy as that.

"OK, from a sporting point of view, there are not a lot of reasons to not sign him.

"What a player he is. It is about the money of course. No chance. Absolutely, no chance. Sorry for killing that story."

Klopp, whose side have a six point lead over champions City heading into their match at Anfield, said the minimalist level of activity from him in the transfer market in the close

season was down to the money being asked for their targets.

The Champions League holders signed teenagers Harvey Elliott and Sepp van den Berg whilst bringing in goalkeeper Adrian on a free transfer.

"The players we thought about to make this team better were really expensive and we could not spend the money," said the 52-year-old German.

"That is how it is.

"To see a player better than him, or with potential to be better or play exactly the same as him is really difficult.

"That is what it was. That was the situation.

"It was not that we were not ready, but we did not want to make five or six changes. Not at all.

"This team is at a wonderful age, there is still space for improvement, completely fine."

Klopp, though, said it is easier than when he first arrived in 2015 to attract top level players to Liverpool.
