Ctg port users complain of irregularities

Users of Chattogram Port yesterday alleged that a section of port officials, employees and equipment operators were taking bribes, harassing them and wasting time.

Speaking at a public hearing at the auditorium of Chattogram Port Authority (CPA), they also complained that irregularities are committed during the delivery of goods and containers from the port, and also during loading, unloading and transfer of goods and containers inside the port.

The port users said the irregularities were reducing the efficiency of the port.

A total of 52 complaints were raised at the meeting. The complaints include delaying discharge of consignments by staffers of the One Stop Service Centre, storing import containers at yards not assigned for those, delaying transfer of containers inside the port by crane operators and damage of goods caused by equipment operators if not bribed.

The public hearing, first of its kind at the port, was jointly orgainsed by the Anti-Corruption Commission and Corruption Prevention Committee, Chattogram, with support from the Chattogram divisional and district administrations.

cooking ingredient rose further yesterday and some retailers in the capital were kilogram of the bulb.

The market price data by the state-run Trading Corporation of Bangladesh (TCB) showed that onion prices rose by Tk 10 yesterday to Tk 125-145 a kg from Tk 115-135 a kg the previous day.

This was the second consecutive day of spike in prices of onions this week, show TCB data, which recorded prices of the bulb at Tk 110-Tk 125 per kilogram on Saturday.

Prices began soaring since Monday.

Benapole Customs Burglars loot

20kg gold from vault

Burglars looted around 20kg of gold, worth Tk 8.5 crore, from the vault of Benapole Customs House sometime during the three-day holiday that ended on Sunday.

Police and customs officials believe there was insider help, as no one was seen entering the four-storey building, although it is under constant CCTV surveillance.

Samrat sued for illegal wealth

Expelled Dhaka South Jubo League president Ismail Hossain Chowdhury Samrat has invested at home and abroad over Tk 1,000 crore in plots, houses, and movie production. The Anti-Corruption Commission has found the

information in Bangladesh Bank documents and other intelligence reports. The commission has filed a case against Samrat

for amassing wealth worth about Tk 2.95 crore beyond his known sources of income.

ACC Deputy Director Jahangir Alam filed the case with its integrated district office, Dhaka-1. The case statement says Samrat amassed Tk 1.84 crore till 2018-19 fiscal

year. The commission did not find any legal source of the amount. The ACC also found that he has moveable properties worth Tk 1.11 crore.

The commission officials said Samrat invested money in the silverscreen. He maintained an account named "His Movies" with the Sonali Bank's Kakrail branch.

The anti-graft watchdog also filed a case yesterday against his close aide Enamul Haque Arman for amassing wealth worth Tk 2.05 crore beyond his known sources of income.

The FIR says Arman also invested a huge amount of money, gathered from illegal casinos, in Desh Bangla Multi-media Production.

'Rohingya criminals' shoot 2 BGB men

A patrol team of Border Guard Bangladesh came under attack in Ghumdhum border area of Bandarban's Naikhyangchhari upazila on Monday evening.

Two members of BGB -- Mritunjoy, 32, and Farid Uddin, 23, jawans of 34th BGB Battalion -- sustained bullet injuries during the attack, said Brig Gen Shazedur Rahman, commander of BGB Cox's Bazar region.

A group of Rohingya yaba traders opened fire on the patrol team around 7:30pm on Monday and injured them, he said, adding that the jawans received treatment at

Vietnam mouse deer rediscovered

A very rare species of small, deer-like animal thought to be on the verge of extinction has been spotted in the northwestern jungle of Vietnam for the first time in nearly 30 years.

Known as the Silver-backed Chevrotain or Mouse deer, a specimen was last recorded in 1990, according to a study published Monday in the journal Nature Ecology and Evolution.

The species, Tragulus versicolor, was first described in 1910 based on several animals found near Nha Trang, about 450 kilometres (280 miles) northeast of Ho Chi Minh City. With no confirmed sightings since 1990,



Top Islamic Jihad man killed in Gaza

Tension escalates as retaliatory rocket salvoes reach Tel Aviv

Israel killed a top commander from the Iranian-backed Palestinian militant group Islamic Jihad in a rare targeted strike in the Gaza Strip yesterday, drawing retaliatory rocket salvoes that reached as far as Tel Aviv.

In the most serious escalation in months, an Israeli missile attack also hit the home of an Islamic Jihad official in Damascus, Syrian state media said. The strike killed two people including one of the official's sons, the group and Syrian state media said. Israel refused to comment. As the sound of Palestinian rockets and Israeli air strikes echoed

throughout Gaza and Israeli border areas, Islamic Jihad leader Khaled Al-Batsh spoke at the midday Gaza funeral of his slain fellow militant, Baha Abu Al-Atta. "Israel executed two coordinated attacks, in Syria and in Gaza, in a

declaration of war," he said. Mourners fired guns into the air, chanting "revenge!" Both sides expected further escalation after the funeral, but the extent of it appeared to hinge on whether the much larger Islamist group Hamas

would join Islamic Jihad in the exchange of fire that sent civilians on both sides huddling for shelter and forced businesses and schools to close.
