# Train derails in Sirajganj, catches fire

Eight hurt; another train narrowly escapes accident; B'baria tragedy probe hits snag

Three days after the tragic rail accident in Brahmanbaria, a Rangpur-bound passenger train derailed in Ullapara of Sirajganj yesterday noon.

Nine compartments of Rangpur Express, including its engine and power car, derailed in the Ullapara Railway Station area around 2:00pm and a fire broke out in three of its compartments, said Rafikul Islam, stationmaster of the railway station.

At least eight people, including a locomotive driver, were injured and rushed to Ullapara Upazila Health Complex, said Monzil Haque, deputy assistant director of Sirajganj district fire brigade, who conducted a rescue operation.

"The fire might have originated from the power car," he added.

Six units of fire fighters from Sirajganj and adjoining areas took part in the rescue operation and brought the fire under control within two hours.

Locals alleged that the accident happened due to wrong signal.

"Rangpur Express is a metre-gauge train and always runs on the track number one. Today [yesterday], the train was running on track number two," said Biplob Hossain, who lives right beside the rail station.

# Deportees were illegals

Says Bangladesh ambassador to KSA about migrants being sent back

Migrant workers who were deported from Saudi Arabia in recent weeks had been staying in the Gulf country illegally, Golam Moshfi, Bangladesh ambassador to Saudi Arabia, said yesterday.

Before being sent back, each worker was interviewed by the mission's legal assistants at the deportation centre because they had issued travel permits, he said.

"We found each of them to be illegal," he told this newspaper over phone.

He blamed recruiting agencies for misguiding the workers about so-called "free visas", which did not actually exist.

The migrants, however, believed they could work anywhere with the visa.

The deportees were not found at the workplaces they were supposed to be in. For example, they had a work visa for Riyadh, but were found in Medina, he said.

Saudi authorities had

# Expel all 25 accused of Abrar murder

Buet protesters urge authorities

Agitating Buet students yesterday said they would not return to classes until the authorities met their three-point demand, including expulsion of the charge-sheeted accused in Abrar Fahad murder case.

The protesters made the announcement at a press conference in front of the Buet Shaheed Minar.

The other two demands are: punishing the students involved in previous incidents of ragging at Buet halls, and formulating specific rules prohibiting ragging and organisation-based politics.

They demanded the rules and the penalties for violations be added to the university ordinance.

"We would accept the exam schedule if the authorities meet our first two demands, and sit for

# 141 top taxpayers honoured

Transcom, Star, Prothom Alo once again on the list of awardees

Editors of The Daily Star and the Prothom Alo, along with the owning companies of the national dailies and their printer, were recognised as the top taxpayers in the journalist and media categories for the fourth straight year yesterday.

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) handed out the accolades to 141 highest taxing individuals and companies at a ceremony in the Radisson Blu Dhaka Water Garden in the capital.

The Daily Star Editor Mahfuz Anam and Prothom Alo Editor Matiuir Rahman received the awards in the journalist

category from Finance Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal.

The three companies are sister concerns of Transcom Group, one of the largest conglomerates in Bangladesh.

Latifur Rahman is the chairman and managing director of Transcraft.

Rokia Afzal Rahman, chairperson of Mediaworld Ltd, received the award for the company, while Matiuir Rahman received it on behalf of Mediastar Ltd.

# HARMFUL INGREDIENTS Ban imposed on ranitidine

The Directorate General of Drug Administration (DGDA) has permanently "postponed" the production, distribution, sale and export of heartburn drug ranitidine after detecting carcinogenic ingredients in its raw materials.

The decision came over a month after the DGDA had imposed a temporary ban on September 29 on the import of the ingredients, production and sale amid global concerns over the presence of a probable carcinogen in the products.

Later, the DGDA sent the sample of raw ingredients, widely supplied by Indian companies Saraka Laboratories Ltd and SMS Life Science, to the World Health Organization (WHO) accredited laboratories for testing.

The result showed the existence of the carcinogen -- N-nitrosodimethylamine

# Import of toxic ship MT Producer illegal: HC

The High Court yesterday declared that the permission given for importing, beaching and scrapping of radiation-contaminated vessel MT Producer was illegal.

The vessel is now at a ship-breaking yard in Chattogram. No ship can be imported and beached at the ship-breaking yards violating the conditions of environmental clearance, the HC said, adding that every domestic and international law has been violated in this case.

Delivering its verdict on a writ petition, the HC ruled that the buyers and the agencies that certify whether the ships are free from contamination and hazardous wastes must be listed and controlled strictly by the relevant laws.

Steps will have to be taken to regulate the import of ships from the countries that operate ships in violation of international laws.

The writ petitioner's lawyer Syeda Rizwana Hasan said some of such countries were Comoros, Palau, Cambodia, Tanzania, Vanuatu, St. Kitts and Nevis, Belize, Cook Islands, Sierra Leone, and Togo.

The HC ordered the Department of Environment (DoE) not to allow any import and beaching of any ship for breaking without getting complete and detailed information about their waste.

The DoE must follow the rules of domestic and international laws in this regard, the HC said.

The court asked the Health Physics and Radioactive

A Rohingya man, accused in several criminal cases, was killed in a "gunfight" with police in Teknaf's Shalbagan area early yesterday.

The dead is Mahmudul Hasan, 37, of Nayapara Rohingya camp.

Pradip Kumar Das, officer-in-charge of Teknaf police station, said they arrested Mahmudul on Wednesday noon over possessing firearms.

After interrogation, a team of police, led by Additional Superintendent

Thousands of folk music aficionados thronged Dhaka's Army Stadium yesterday, as the fifth edition of the Dhaka International Folk Festival (DIFF) 2019 was inaugurated.

The festival was opened by Bangladeshi Manipuri dancer Samina Husain Prema and her dance troupe -- Bhabna Nriya Dol -- showcasing mesmerising dance performances set to popular folk songs, including "Ami Robona Robona Ghar-e" and "Kon Gaang-e Ailo Pani". The dancers incorporated three dance styles and performed with dhol, sticks and instrumental music.

Next on stage was Chvneburebi, a Georgian folk music band known for its rich tradition of homophonic music. The band members started off with a West Georgian folk melody. These folk musicians
