

FENI RIVER WATER-SHARING AGREEMENT

Protect your own interest before serving neighbours: Prof Serajul

Speakers at a press conference yesterday urged the government to ensure fair share of trans-boundary rivers, like Teesta, from India before helping the neighbouring country by giving its own water.

Bhasani Onusari Porishod, a civic platform formed following the ideology of legendary politician Maulana Abdul Hamid Khan Bhasani, organised the press conference on the Feni agreement at Jatiya Press Club in

the capital.

Speaking at the event, Dhaka University Professor Emeritus Serajul Islam Choudhury said the government can share water with neighbours, but it has to protect its own interest first.

"Sharing has to be fair. How could we give our water [from Feni] to others when we are not getting proper share [from Teesta]?" he said.

"Water is a vital issue for us. We cannot live without it," said the eminent professor. He also suggested the government to from a national

committee for rivers, which will take care of the water-sharing issues.

The platform's Secretary General Rafiqul Islam Bablu, citing several media reports, said India is already taking 72 cusec water, much more than the agreement of 1.82 cusec, from Feni by setting up 36 pumps at different locations of the river.

"If India continues to take water in such a way -- with and without agreement -- the rivers' flow will reduce significantly in the coming

Primary and Ebtedayee exams begin from today

Primary Education Completion Examinations (PECE) and its equivalent Ebtedayee Education Completion Examination will begin across the country today with 29,03,638 students appearing.

A total of 25,53,267 general stream examinees will sit for PECE with 3,50,371 students sitting for Ebtedayee examinations this year, State Minister for Primary and Mass Education, Zahir Hossen, said on Thursday.

The examinations will be held at 7,458 centres across the country and twelve centres abroad. PECE exams will end on November 24.

On the first day, both general and madrasa students will take English examination, they will appear for Bangla on November 18, Bangladesh and Global Studies

KIDNEY DISEASES

Dialysis services at upazilas stressed

Dialysis services should be urgently extended to upazila level to serve critical kidney patients, speakers at a seminar said yesterday.

Speaking at the opening session of the four-day 15th Annual Convention and Scientific Seminar organised by Kidney Foundation Bangladesh at its conference room in Dhaka, they also stressed innovative programmes to find new alternative treatment methods for treatment of kidney diseases.

According to the foundation, some 40,000 people suffer kidney failure each year, of whom 80 percent die due to lack of regular kidney dialysis and transplant service.

Chronic kidney disease (CKD) means damage to one or both kidneys. It happens slowly over a long period of time, and results kidney failing to filter blood the way it should. It can cause wastes to build up in human body and other health problems.

Speaking on the occasion, Prof Harun Ur Rashid, president of Kidney Foundation, said, "Expansion of services for kidney disease treatment is urgent. It should be expanded to upazilas across the country. All medical colleges should be equipped with kidney transplant facilities."

"Our study reveals that 75 percent of patients who start kidney dialysis stop dialysis within six months due to unable to bear the expenses," said Prof Muhidur Rahman, secretary general of the foundation.

Speaking as chief guest, National Professor Brig (Rtd) Abdul Malik, president of National Heart Foundation, spoke of combined efforts to tackle the spectre of non-communicable diseases.

He stressed the importance of unity among progressive forces to materialise that dream.


