

Noted artiste Mir Sabbir, who has been working in television for two decades, is set to make his debut as a film director with *Raat Jaaga Phul*, a project funded by the government. Sabbir has also written the script of the film. The shooting of *Raat Jaaga Phul* will begin on December 3. It will be shot in different locations, including Borguna, Nawabganj, Pubail, and Dhaka. Sabbir will also play a central role in *Raat Jaaga Phul*.

"The story is set in both urban and rural areas. I will play the role of a young man, who has a superpower," says Sabbir, whose recently directed television show, *Chorakata*, is currently being aired on Channel i.
