A good number of farmers in Sundarganj upazila of Gaibandha are harvesting their onion a bit early this season as the prices of the cooking item is too high amid the present crisis in the markets across the

Meanwhile, farmers in Lalmonirhat cultivated onion in much less areas of land this year, following bitter experiences due to low prices in previous years.

Onion growers of char land along Teesta river basin in Sundarganj upazila are getting unexpected profit from early variety of leafy onion taken as a vegetable, reports our Gaibandha Correspondent.

As the item is selling at Tk 120 per kg in the area, many farmers have started harvesting immature plants, said locals, adding that in last year, it was sold for a meagre Tk 15 to 20 per kg. "This year I gained much profit from

onion cultivation, which I could not even imagine earlier," said Wahed Ali, a farmer of Madaripara village in Haripur union, who cultivated onion by sowing seeds on three bighas of land.

Another farmer Rafiqul Mia said he grew leafy onion on half bigha of land, and sold 45 kg of plants at Tk 120 per kg.

Leafy onion plants were sold at Tk 140 to 150 per kg only a few days ago, while imported or quality onion, used as spice, sold at Tk 240 per kg, said Shamim Mia,

According to upazila agriculture office, this season's target of onion cultivation area was 150 hectares of land, but farmers grew the item on more lands.

"Generally onion is cultivated in two ways -- sowing seeds and planting small onions. The latter yields better and can be preserved for long to be used as a spice. Lands in char areas are especially suitable for onion cultivation by sowing seeds The prices started decreasing after and its plant with leaves are taken as a started reaching the market a week upazila agriculture officer of Sundarganj.

However, onion grown from sowing seeds has very little overall impact in the market as it cannot be preserved for long, he added.

Our Lalmonirhat Correspondent reports: Onion cultivation saw a serious fall, especially in char lands of Teesta river basin areas in Lalmonirhat this year as farmers got discouraged due to low prices of the item in previous years.

NGO employee found dead

'Missing' lawyer of Lalmonirhat still traceless

Three jailed for selling salt at unusual prices

A mobile court here on Tuesday night sentenced a wholesale trader and his two managers to one year's imprisonment each for selling salt for unreasonable prices.

The convicts are salt dealer Hazi Gofran Ali, owner of Sonargaon Store, and his managers Lutfar Rahman and Yakub Ali in the town. Sonargaon Store is one of the biggest wholesale salt centres in the district.

On information, a special team, jointly led by Deputy Commissioner (DC) Abu Jafor and Superintendent of Police (SP) SM Rashidul Haque,

raided Sonargaon Store in the town and found the convicts selling salt at higher prices by creating artificial

They were selling a sack of salt containing 50 kg at Tk 800 against Tk 500 to the retailers, said the SP.

The three were arrested and later produced before the court, led by Upazila Nirbahi Officer Joyoshree Rani Roy, which pronounced the verdict, said the police official.

Nazrul Islam, a salt retailer of Barabari Haat in Lalmonirhat Sadar, alleged that he purchased one sack of slat containing 50 kg at Tk 500 from Gofran Ali on Monday but it was sold at Tk 800 on Tuesday.

"As we purchased salt at a high rate from the dealer, we sold it at higher prices in the retail market," said Nazrul.

Taking the advantage of rumours on the price hike of salt, Gofran was making bucks by creating artificial crisis, said another retailer Saheb Ali of Mahendranagar Bazar in the upazila.

DC Abu Jafor said there is no crisis of salt. There is huge stock of salt, so salt would be sold at reasonable prices.

The local administration and police are very much active to take stern action against anyone spreading rumours about salt, said Jafor.
