'1974-like situation prevailing in country'

Moudud Ahmed slams govt over price hike of essentials

UNB, Dhaka
Criticising the government for soaring prices of essentials, BNP leader Moudud Ahmed yesterday said a socioeconomic situation like that of 1974 famine is prevailing in the country. "People of Bangladesh are angry over the onion crisis. A government which is unable to ensure the supply of an essential item like onion has no moral right to be in power," he said. Speaking at a doa mahfil, Moudud

said a problem over salt was created after onion, while rice prices kept rising inflicting sufferings on people. "Scenes of '74 are still clear in my mind. A socioeconomic instability was there in the country in '74. Now, I hear the same footfall of it," he observed. BNP arranged the programme at the party's Nayapalatan central office marking its acting chairman Tarique Rahman's 55th birthday.

The BNP standing committee member urged the government to step down immediately over its failure to deliver on all fronts. Or else, he warned, people will force the government to quit and accept their justified demands. Moudud said 2019 has been a "bad year" for the nation as many unwarranted incidents are happening throughout the year since the government has lost control over the state machinery.

Traders see bleak

Md Islam, proprietor of Bikrampur Electronics, said he had been doing business there for the last 18 years and had two shops on the first floor. Both were gutted in the fire. "I have a bank loan of Tk 25 lakh. I have monthly expenses of Tk 70,000. If I can't do any business for one month, how will I pay my debt or meet expenses?" the aggrieved trader said. Habibur Rahman, a shop employee, recently invested around Tk 10 lakh to open up his store to sell mobile accessories. He said he took loan from a multipurpose cooperative society. Slowly and steadily, his business was picking up, but "the fire took

everything from me," he said. "I was not in the shop at that time," he told The Daily Star standing in front of what was left of his shop. "I could not save a single item." Meanwhile, the fire service is yet to form a probe committee in this regard. Traders alleged that none of the 17 leaders of the market committee visited the area. The local lawmaker did not come to see their loss either, alleged a trader. Mentionable, Dhaka South City Corporation ward councillor Mainul Haque Manju was the president of the market committee. He was arrested by Rab on October 31, for his alleged involvement in extorting traders at the

market. Since then, the other committee members are in hiding, traders claimed. The market, built with corrugated-iron sheets, was listed as a risky establishment and fire officials conducted a fire drill around a month ago, said DG Sajjad Hossain on Wednesday. He said they had asked the market authorities to improve safety in two months. A recent inspection report of the fire department reveals that of the 1,191 private and government-owned malls, supermarkets and kitchen markets inspected in the city and its outskirts, 523 were very risky while only 45 were found to be satisfactory.

Sitara was crossing the highway, leaving her dead on the spot. Police confirmed the incident. In Kishoreganj, two people were killed and three injured after a microbus collided with the CNG-run auto-rickshaw carrying them at Phulerghat in Pakundia upazila around 6pm on Wednesday, said police. The deceased are Md Al Amin (35) and Bigon Rabidas (27). Al Amin died on the spot, and the injured were rushed to Kishoreganj General Hospital where Bigon succumbed to his injuries, they added. On information, police recovered the bodies and sent them to the hospital's morgue for autopsy. Police seized the microbus and arrested its driver. A case was lodged. In Dinajpur, Md Abdul Mannan (55) was killed on the spot after a speeding truck hit his motorcycle at Kabirajhat in Birganj upazila around 7:30pm on Wednesday, said police. The truck driver and his helper fled the spot with the vehicle.

In his presentation, Dr Stephen R Cornor, executive director of The Worldwide Hospice Palliative Care Alliance (WHPCA), said many people who need palliative care are not getting it due to different barriers. Referring to different studies, Dr Cornor said only 14 percent patients in need of palliative care (out of around 40 million globally) have access to it, while at least 18 million die in extreme pain. "Death doesn't have to be defeated. Rather it should be given a human touch through adding soul to the dying person," Dr Bimalangshu Dey, an associate professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School, said in his presentation. "Palliative care focuses on patient, not on medicine... and family. It not only heals but also increases life span," he added. He termed 53mg permissible amount of morphine for a patient in a day in Bangladesh "social injustice", claiming it to be far too low. Prof Dr Nezamuddin Ahmad, former chairman of the department of palliative medicine at Bangandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University, spoke of the evolution of palliative care which was first adopted as a discipline at UK hospitals in 1984. In Bangladesh, there are only two palliative care units -- BSMMU and Dhaka Medical College Hospital. Speaking as special guest, health secretary Ashadul Islam said, "Health sector is one of the priorities in development programme of the government." Dr Bardan Jung Rana, WHO representative to Bangladesh stressed on skilled workforce for palliative care to tackle increased non-communicable risk diseases, where nurses are on the "frontline". Physicians from different hospitals in Dhaka also participated in a question-answer session in the event. Former finance minister AMA Muhith spoke at the event as guest of honour. Anne-Marie Barron, associate dean at school of nursing and health sciences at Massachusetts General Hospital in USA; Nusrat Feroz Aman, chief patron of Ayat Foundation; and Tahsin Aman, chairperson of the foundation, also addressed the programme.

without fitness, and hurting our children one after another," he said. "If we fail to bring discipline, our children, who are sitting in front of us, will unitedly drive us out from the road. You cannot go to the street and we will not be able to discharge our duties," he said drawing attention of the transport leaders and workers. The commissioner said, "You will not find a single family who have not lost at least one of their relative in such accidents. How long will we tolerate the chaotic situation?". "This is the last chance to bring discipline to the roads," he said, urging all to follow traffic rules. About implementation of the new Road Transport Act 2018, the commissioner said even continuous violators will be given warning once or twice and made aware of the law. Then they will be fined for traffic rule violations. The commissioner said only vehicles broken down on-street, remained unattended by drivers for a long time and plying the streets without documents would be dumped by wrecker. He also urged drivers not to drop off passengers in the middle of the roads, leaving them susceptible to accidents. At the programme, Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan said, "We don't want to obey the law. We think our honour is hurt if we obey the law. Actually, obeying law is the honourable thing to do." There are some systemic problems in implementing the law that were discussed during Wednesday night's discussion with transport leaders and workers, he said, adding that their nine-point demand will be forwarded to the road transport and bridges minister.
