Myanmar may have 'state policy' to attack Rohingyas

Fear International Criminal Court judges

Judges of the International Criminal Court (ICC) fear that Myanmar may have a "state policy" to attack the Rohingya population in Rakhine state, said ICC Prosecutor Fatou Bensouda on Friday.

"The judges accepted that there is a reasonable basis to believe that there may have been a state policy [in Myanmar] to attack the Rohingya population," she said.

The made the statement following ICC's approval to commence an investigation into crimes committed against Rohingyas.

As per the judges' observation, the prosecutor said there were many sources indicating heavy involvement of several Myanmar government forces and other state agents along with members of Myanmar armed forces

against humanity on the land. "These coercive acts could qualify as the crimes against humanity of deportation and persecution on grounds of ethnicity and/or religion against the Rohingya population," the prosecutor said.

Saying that the judges authorised the investigation with broad parameters, Bensouda termed it as a "significant development against

atrocity in Myanmar".

On November 14, the ICC judges of Pre-Trial Chamber III authorised the prosecutor office to commence an investigation into the "situation in Bangladesh/Myanmar".

Mentioning that Myanmar is not a

State Party to the ICC, but Bangladesh is, the prosecutor welcomed the chamber's conclusion that the alleged deportation of civilians across the Myanmar-Bangladesh border, which involved victims crossing that border, clearly establishes a territorial link on the basis of the "actus reus of this

Bangladesh by the victims." "The Court may exercise jurisdiction over crimes when part of the criminal conduct takes place on the territory of a State Party," she said.

"I think this tarnishes the image of Nelson Mandela. Because, Nelson Mandela had been in jail for struggling for independence of his

nation, not for corruption." About employment, Hasina said her government is now setting up 100 economic zones across the country where jobs will be created as local and foreign entrepreneurs are investing there.

The government is also providing training and knowledge to the young. She highlighted measures taken by the government for the development

of the young generation. "No one will remain unemployed in this country," the PM asserted.

Sheikh Moni and his pregnant wife Arzoo Moni were assassinated along with the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and most of his family members on August 15, 1975. Parash was only 5 at that time.

Jubo League was founded in 1972 with the objectives of alleviating poverty and establishing the rights of the youths. Moni, Bangabandhu's nephew, was tasked with uniting the country's

But Parash's case is different.

He has been given the charge at a time when the organisation is mired in controversies for various misdeeds of its top leaders. Some of the misdeeds came to light after law enforcement agencies began an anti-corruption drive in September.

At least five Jubo League leaders have been expelled from the organisation. They are now in jail for their alleged corruption and various irregularities.

During the ongoing anti-corruption allegations were raised against Jubo League leaders. The leaders included the immediate

past chairman Omar Faruk Chowdhury, a brother-in-law of Sheikh Moni. He allegedly patronised corrupt leaders and awarded them key organisational posts in exchange for money. Faruk, who was relieved of his duties

on October 20, was not even invited to the congress yesterday.

Earlier, Parash's name had been in discussion as a possible candidate for the chairman post. At the congress, the position of his seat on stage gave the councillors and the delegates a hint about his new role.
