Indian cops arrest 3 for plotting terror attack in Delhi

The 'IS-inspired' suspects held with IEDs in Assam

OUR CORRESPONDENT, Delhi

Delhi Police today said they arrested three people, who were allegedly inspired by the global terror outfit ISIS, and averted terror strikes in the national capital and at a village fair in Assam.

Improvised Explosive Devices IEDs) were recovered from the spot. Pramod Singh Kushwah, deputy commissioner of Delhi Police

(Special Cell), said in a statement that Mukadir Islam, Ranjeet Ali and Jameel Luit, all in their early twenties, were arrested after a joint operation by the Delhi Police and Assam Police.

The arrested are from Goalpara district of Assam, he said, adding that they were carrying a complete IED to detonate at the Raas Mela, a local fair in Dudhnoi Goalpara district in Assam.

The three were also planning to conduct terror strikes in heavy footfall areas of Delhi, the officer added. The arrested were classmates and

Shahab Uddin said in 2013, the number of brick kilns across the country was 4,985, but it rose to 7,900 in 2018. As many as 2,087 of the kilns are being operated around Dhaka city.

During the dry season, 58 percent of the city's total air pollution is caused by the brick kilns, according to the Department of Environment (DoE). Although previous drives against

illegal brick kilns had failed, experts believe it would be different this time around as there is an alternative to traditionally-used bricks in green bricks.

According to a 2016 Asian Development Bank (ADB) report, the country produces 22.71 billion pieces of bricks a year.

The brick kiln sector also consumes 3.5 million tonnes of coal and 1.9 million tonnes of firewood, emitting 9.8 million tonnes of greenhouse gas annually, according to a World Bank report.

Compounding the situation is the rising number of registered vehicles. Minister Shahab Uddin said the number of vehicles had increased pollution.

Bangladesh Road and Transport Authority, the number of motor of vehicles in Dhaka almost doubled in the last nine years, rising to 13,70,500 last years.

The minister said it was necessary to make a coordinated effort while conducting the development works to check air pollution.

The government has published public notice in several newspapers describing measures to control air pollution, the minister said. Solaiman Haider, director general

of the DoE, gave a presentation on the air quality situation of Dhaka city in the beginning of the meeting yesterday, saying the government had already installed 16 air quality monitoring stations in Dhaka and different other cities.

Data from those showed that 197 days of 2018 were classified as "unhealthy" in Dhaka city.

Last year, 50 days were unhealthy, 80 days very unhealthy and 67 days were extremely unhealthy.

The DoE operates three continuous air monitoring stations (CAMs) in Dhaka -- one in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar, one in Farmgate and the last in Darus Salam -- to assess air quality.

Without the "grace marks" taken into account, only four of the recruits passed both the exams and five failed both the tests, according to the case statement. The other 23 had passed the

written test but failed the MCQ test. Mosaddique's nephew got 72 and 55 in the written and MCQ tests, including the "grace marks". "He was given the grace marks so that he passed," said an ACC official.

The FIR said a 10-member committee held the viva exams between January 20 and January 22. The exam had 100 marks, which is unprecedented in recruitment for government service. The pass mark for viva is 25,

according to the Operation Manual of Biman but even that is not followed. "It is an instance of gross

irregularities and corruption," read the The candidates had to be between

18 and 30 years old and in case of children of freedom fighters up to 32 years. But the members of the selection committee raised the age limit to 40. Biman published two recruitment

The civil aviation ministry has recently revealed several incidents of corruption and irregularities in different sections of Biman, including

recruitment of pilots, ticket selling, and leasing planes. Following these, the ministry moved to overhaul Biman management and make Biman a profitable venture, Civil Aviation Ministry Secretary Mohibul Haque

told The Daily Star recently. Mosaddique was forced to resign on April 30 for his alleged involvement in irregularities in the recruitment of pilots, sources in the

ministry said. Spreading its wings in 1972, Biman has been incurring loss most

of the years due to corruption and mismanagement, aviation experts said. In the last 10 years, Biman made

profits only in three fiscal years --2014-15, 2015-16, and 2016-17.

Amid widespread allegations of anomalies, the Jatiya Sangsad committee on civil aviation in 2010 had formed a five-member parliamentary sub-committee to probe the irregularities and corruption.

Led by late lawmaker Mayeen Uddin Khan Badal, the subcommittee found corruption involving Tk 700 crore in the purchase and maintenance of aircraft and equipment of Biman in 18 years prior to 2010.

Badal in the sub-committee report said there was graft in every section of Biman.
