No syndicate in onion market

Says Tofail Ahmed after JS body meet STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Tofail Ahmed, chairman of the parliamentary standing committee on commerce, yesterday said there was no syndicate in the onion market and that the prices of the bulb could not be brought down by force. "We will have to bring down the prices of onions through

a concerted effort," the senior AL lawmaker said while briefing the reporters after a meeting of the committee at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban.

Terming businessmen the friends of the government, the senior AL lawmaker thanked different business conglomerates, including Meghna Group, City Group and S Alam Group, for supporting the government by importing onions and sell those without any profit.

The former commerce minister also said journalists can play a pivotal role in reducing the prices of onions by not publishing stories on the skyrocketed prices of the cooking ingredient.

"In many countries, media do not cover the price hike of essentials," he added.

Central bank may cap interest rates

Finance minister sets Jan 1 deadline for bringing them down to single digit

Bangladesh Bank may cap the interest rates on industrial and working capital loans on January 1 as the government moved to bring down the lending rates to single digits to give a much-needed boost to job

creation and private investment. Following an instruction from the finance ministry, the central bank yesterday formed a seven-member committee headed by SM Moniruzzaman, a deputy governor of the Bangladesh Bank, to bring down the interest rate to single digits.

committee comprised The representatives from private and stateowned banks representatives and will

submit its recommendations within a

week.

The BB committee would recommend ways to bring down the lending rates, the deposit rates and the defaulted loans.

"Following the recommendations, we will implement the decisions," Finance Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal told reporters vesterday.

Other members of the committee are Kazi Akram Uddin Ahmed, chairman of Standard Bank, Zaid Bakht, chairman of Agrani Bank, Syed Mahbubur Rahman, managing director of Mutual Trust Bank, Md Obayed Ullah Al Masud, MD of Rupali Bank, Shah A Sarwar, MD of IFIC Bank, and Mehmood Husain, MD of NRB Bank.

Relentless against child marriage

Former UNO honoured with Faraaz Hossain Courage Award

It was a rainy day in July 2018. As the evening fell, someone called Farida Yesmin, upazila nirbahi officer of Netrakona's Barhatta, over her phone and informed her that a child marriage was about to take place in Kawrashi, a remote village in the upazila near the Bangladesh-India border.

Farida immediately called the police and left for the village in the dark of the night amid rain and thunderstorms. The road was so bad that at one point, the UNO and her

team had to leave their vehicles. They walked about two kilometres to find the girl's home. "As we reached the spot, a local leader tried to stop us.

But despite all these hurdles, we were able to prevent the marriage," Farida said while recalling how she and her team stopped a staggering 59 child marriages after she joined as the Barhatta UNO on May 9, 2017.

She also provided financial help to a number of poor girls so that they could continue their studies.

Besides, Farida set up a fund and bought cycles for some

919 diagnosed with HIV this year

Health ministry survey finds

A total of 919 HIV-infected people have been detected in the country this year, the highest in the last 20 years, said a government survey.

Conducted by the National AIDS/STD Programme of the health ministry, the survey said 170 of the affected people had

already succumbed to the virus.

The findings were revealed at a seminar organised by the health ministry at the capital's Krishibid Institution auditorium
