ACC sues 16 for graft

They let through 14 crore kg of cargo without due charge; 2 held

The top authorities of Biman Bangladesh Airlines had clearly instructed its officials to realise an additional charge for handling each kilogram of incoming and outgoing cargo carried by non-scheduled freighters.

But 16 Biman officials, including its former and incumbent general managers of the cargo department, didn't realise the additional charge against 13.99 crore kg goods. The items were carried on 4,115 non-scheduled freighters in five years since

Instead of realising the additional charge, the officials in connivance with each other and through misuse of power embezzled over Tk 118 crore, according to the FIR of a

RASHIDUL HASAN and MAHBUBUR RAHMAN KHAN case, filed yesterday by the Anti-Corruption Commission against the officials.

A non-scheduled freighter flies without a prior announcement, Biman officials said.

The graft watchdog yesterday arrested two accused, Mohammad Ali Ahsan, former general manager (cargo), and Iftekhar Hossain Chowdhury, former manager (export) of the cargo department, from the city's Segunbagicha.

Arif Ullah, acting GM (cargo), and Fazlul Haq, assistant manager (commercial) of the cargo department, are the two accused still working Biman.

The other accused are former assistant managers (commercial) Shahidul Islam, Aminul Haq Bhuiyan, Lutfe Jamal, SEE PAGE 13 COL 5

She was among the women who had fought shoulder to shoulder with their male counterparts for establishing the right to speak in the mother tongue

Rowshon Ara Bachchu, who was at the forefront during the 1952 Language Movement, passed away yesterday at the age of 87.

On February 21, 1952, her group was among the first to defy the section 144 of the then Pakistan government and gather under the historic Amtala on the Dhaka University campus.

They broke the police barricade to march towards the assembly at Jagannath

Police swung into action firing teargas shells and beating up the protesters. The battle between the protesters and the police spilled out on to the streets. As they kept marching, shooting began, killing Salam, Barkat, Rafique, Jabbar, Shafiur and others.

2010s the hottest decade in history

UN warns in a report launched at COP25 summit as carbon emissions rise again

This decade is set to be the hottest in history, the United Nations said yesterday in an annual assessment outlining the ways in which climate change is outpacing humanity's ability to adapt to it.

The World Meteorological Organization said global temperatures so far this year were 1.1 degrees Celsius (two degrees Farenheit) above the pre-industrial average between 1850-1900.

That puts 2019 on course to be in the

top three warmest years ever recorded, and possibly the hottest non-El Nino year yet. Man-made emissions from burning

fossil fuels, building infrastructure, growing crops and transporting goods mean 2019 is set to break the record for atmospheric carbon concentrations, locking in further warming, the WMO said in its report launched at the climate summit in Spain.

Oceans, which absorb 90 percent of the excess heat produced by greenhouse gases, are now at their highest recorded

Setting tyres on fire in front of the mills, workers started demonstration around 6:00am. The agitating workers chanted slogans demanding full payment of arrears, implementation of wage board, regularisation of weekly wages and others.

The Buet authorities will expel students if he or she is found involved in ragging that leads to death, serious "bodily harm", any form of disability, permanent mental imbalance trauma, and disruption of academic life of any fellow student.

The university law officer will also file a case in such a situation following due procedures, says a notice issued by Bangladesh University of Engineering Technology early yesterday.

The notice added that authorities could impose fine, suspend or expel any student if his or her involvement in political activities was found.

Researchers have classified a new kind of flying dinosaur after analysing fossils collected from a limestone quarry in Lebanon. The fossils are believed to be more than 95

million years old and come from a pterosaur, the most common form of which is the pterodactyl. The newly identified pterosaur, called

Mimodactylus libanensis, is believed to have inhabited the Tethys Seaway, an enormous and shallow body of water that stood between what would become Europe, North Africa, and southeast
